NOTICE TO SHAREHOLDERS IN MINING COMPANIES.

BY the 90th section of the Act 21 Victoria No. 22, it is enacted that no person shall be entitled to institute proceedings in any court of mines, or in any other court, or before any warden, to recover possession of any land occupied by virtue of any Miner's Right, or damages for the occupation of or encroachment upon such land, or to obtain relief as tenant in common or coadventurer in any such land, against his tenant in common or coadventurer, unless such person shall have been the holder of a Miner's Right at the time when his title to recover such possession or obtain such relief first arose or accrued.

The holder of shares in a mining company carrying on operations on Crown lands (not under lease), who has not taken out a Miner's Right, is therefore without any means of obtaining legal redress, either as against strangers or as against his fellow shareholders.

Miner's Rights can be obtained at the several Receipt and Pay Offices in Victoria, upon payment of One pound. They remain in force for one year from the time they are issued.

It is not necessary for a person to take out more than one Miner's Right, although he may be interested in a number of mining companies.

THE BRAYBROOK ROAD DISTRICT.*

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the county of Bourke, hereinafter defined, shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at the south-east angle of portion I, section X., in the parish of Cut-paw-paw, and being bounded as follows: viz.: on the south by the south boundary of section X., in the last named parish, and the south boundary of the parish of Derrimut, bearing westerly to its south-west angle; thence on the west by a line bearing north to the south boundary of portion B of section 5 of the parish of Kororoit; and thence by the south and east boundaries of the last named section to the centre of the Kororoit Creek; thence on the north by the centre line of the Kororoit Creek, bearing easterly to a point due west of the north side line of section VI., in the parish of Maribyrnong; thence further on the north by the north boundaries of sections VI., VII., XI. and X., bearing easterly to the western boundary of section XXII., in the parish of Cut-paw-paw; thence north by the west boundary of the last named section to the centre of the Saltwater River; thence south-easterly by the centre line of the Saltwater River to a point due west of the north side line of section IX., in the parish of Dousta Galla; thence by the north boundaries of sections IX. and VIII., in the last named parish, easterly to the north-east angle of the last named section; and thence south along the east boundary line of the said section to the centre of the Saltwater River; thence along the centre of the Saltwater River to a point due west of the north boundary line of section XXXVII., in the last named parish; thence easterly and south-easterly along the north and north-east boundaries of section XXXVII. to XVII. inclusive of the last named parish to the west boundary of the Hotham municipality; thence further south and continuous with the west boundaries of the Hotham municipality and the Melbourne corporation to the River Yarra Yarra; thence by the north bank of the River Yarra Yarra to the east boundary of the Footscray municipality; and thence by the east, north, and west boundaries of the Footscray municipality home to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Braybrook Road District."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-eighth day of May, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

PUBLIC ROAD BETWEEN BEECHWORTH AND
BUCKLAND.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS it is expedient that a common and public highway should be created between the township of Beechworth and the Buckland Camp, on the Buckland River, in the direction hereinafter described: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and order that the road hereinafter described shall at all times hereafter be a common and public highway or road for all the liege subjects of Her Majesty, to go, return, pass and repass, on foot and on horseback, and with horses, carts and carriages, every year, at all times of the year, at their free will and pleasure, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point bearing north 38 degrees east seventy-five links from the east angle of allotment 1, block 12, township of Beechworth, being the centre of a road one chain wide now to be proclaimed; thence south 50 degrees 45 minutes east twenty chains twenty-five links to the centre of a road one chain fifty links now to be proclaimed; thence following the centre south 35 degrees 4 minutes west twenty-four chains thirty-four links; thence south 16 degrees 32 minutes east forty-three chains twenty-five links; thence south 30 degrees 12 minutes east forty-four chains seven links; thence south 16 degrees 3 minutes west eleven chains fifty-one links; thence south 12 degrees 57 minutes east twenty-nine chains six links, crossing the Two-mile Creek; thence south 36 degrees 42 minutes east nineteen chains seven links; thence south 1 degree 15 minutes east thirty-five chains fifty links; THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by two hundred and ninety-two householders, residents in and around the township of Hawthorn, in the county of Bourke, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

WILLIAM NICHOLSON.

The petitioners state that they are householders within the meaning of the *Municipal Act*, resident in and around the township of Hawthorn, and within the undermentioned district, the area whereof is less than nine square miles, and wherein no point is distant six miles from any other point, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the east bank of the Yarra Yarra River, being the centre of the road forming the northern boundary of portion 28, parish of Boroondara; bounded on the north by the centre of the said road bearing east, the south side of the said road forming the northern boundaries of portions 28, 29, 35, and 69, until it intersects the western boundary of portion 70; thence again on the north by a prolongation of the centre line of the before-mentioned road passing through portion 70, bearing east fifty-six chains twenty links to the eastern boundary of portion 70; thence again on the north by a line bearing east fifty links to the centre of a road one chain wide (the west side of the said road forming the eastern boundaries of portions 70, 93, 94, 97, 98, 101, 102, 104 B, 105 B, 106 B, and 108); thence following the centre of the said road south until it intersects the north bank of the Kooyong Koot or Gardiner's Creek; thence by the said north bank of the Kooyong Koot or Gardiner's Creek to its confluence with the Yarra Yarra River, and by the north and east banks of the Yarra Yarra River to the commencing point, all in the county of Bourke.

THE CRANBOURNE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

REGULATIONS made by the trustees of the Public Cemetery established at Cranbourne.

- All fees and charges must be paid to the treasurer before the ground or vault is opened.
- Applications for permission to make a vault, or erect a monument, in the cemetery, to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be granted to persons applying, on payment of charges set forth in the schedule-marked A.
- The procession will be expected to arrive at the cemetery punctually at the hour appointed for the funeral.
- The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or by some person appointed by them.
- All vaults, graves, monuments, gravestones and fences to be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owners.
- Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate or iron.
- A plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for their approval.
- In the erection of tablets, copper cramps must be used.
- Wooden fencing allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees.
- A plan of the grounds, and a register, will be kept, which may be examined on payment of the charges according to schedule A.
- Orders for interment to be given to the sexton or other person appointed by the trustees, such notice to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and sunset of the previous day.
- The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other months of the year, with the exception of Sundays, when the hours will be from Eight a.m. to Ten a.m., and from Three p.m. to Five p.m.
- In case an interment is to be made in any private vault or grave, the consent in writing of the proprietor must be left with the order.
- The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alterations from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to His Excellency the Governor's approval.
- All persons destroying the fences, or in any otherwise injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.
- The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person, on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relatives or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.

ELECTION OF COUNCILLORS.

THE nominations of candidates to fill the vacancies caused by the retirement by rotation of councillors W. B. Lees, James Brown, and A. E. R. McLeod, and the resignation of councillor John T. Lennon, took place at the council chambers on the 14th December, the chairman of the council presiding.

The nomination of candidates for the vacancies caused by the retiring members was first proceeded with, when Messrs. W. B. Lees, M. McCormick, James Brown, and A. E. R. McLeod, were duly proposed; there being no poll demanded, a show of hands was taken for each candidate, and resulted in Messrs. Lees, Brown, and McLeod, being re-elected.

The nomination of candidates for the vacancy occasioned by councillor Lennon's resignation was then proceeded with, when Messrs. Christian Lange, M. McCulloch, F. N. Martin, and John Rosekilly, were duly proposed. A poll having been demanded was proceeded with on the following day, and resulted as follows:—Mr. Christian Lange, 46 votes; Mr. Francis Nicholas Martin, 26; Mr. McCulloch, 11; and Mr. John Rosekilly, 48. Mr. Rosekilly was therefore declared elected.

CHAIRMAN OF THE COUNCIL.

At the first meeting of the council after the election, councillor Samuel Lewers, J.P., was unanimously re-elected chairman of the council for the current municipal year.

ASSESSMENT.

According to the assessment made by the assessors, 580 house and land holders were duly assessed, the annual value of which property amounted to £14,084 10s., which was reduced on appeal to £14,074 10s.

REPORT of the proceedings of the Ararat Municipal Council, for the half-year ending 23rd April, 1860.

On the 11th January Councillors Davison and Kerr resigned their seats as councillors, and on the 8th February Messrs. Barnett Simmons and Thomas Beveridge were elected to the vacant seats.

The council have held twenty-four general and four special meetings, at which the attendance has been as follows:—

Councillor Beveridge was absent from one meeting on deputation to Melbourne.

Bye-law No. 16, regulating the keeping of swine within certain parts of the municipality, has received the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

The following public works have been completed during the past six months:—

- Formation of Vincent street to its permanent level.
- Formation of 18 chains 80 links of road in continuation of View Point street to the Pleasant Creek road.
- Formation of 25 chains of High street to its permanent level.
- Formation of Reservoir, west of Vincent street, capable of containing two million gallons after allowing for evaporation.
- Formation of culvert at the intersection of View Point continuation and Pleasant Creek road.
- Laying down pitched crossings in High street.

Anxious that the town should have the benefits of an abundant supply of water as near as possible, the council have purchased the dam on the south of Barkly street, and they hope that by next summer they will be in a position to have it cleared of sludge, and an embankment formed that will throw the water as far back as Taylor street.

On the occasion of the visit of the inspector general of roads and bridges to Ararat in August, 1859, the council earnestly urged on him the desirability of having the main line of road through the township changed to Barkly street from High street where it was originally intended to make it, and that Barkly street should be constructed as a main Government road to unite the municipal works with the Ballarat road beyond the pumps. In both these matters they are glad to be able to say they succeeded, thus bringing the traffic through the principal portion of the town instead of at the back of it, and effecting a saving of over £400 to the ratepayers.

In consequence of the energetic course of action adopted by this council from the beginning, the most important public works are in such an advanced state that they considered themselves justified in reducing their expenditure as low as possible; they have therefore dispensed with the services of a permanent surveyor, they have also discharged the weekly laborer, and have accepted a tender for the cleansing and keeping in repair of all the streets and roads within the municipal boundary.

As early as the 23rd August, 1859, this council made application to have an amount placed on the Estimates for 1860 towards the erection of a suitable post office on Ararat, to which they received the following reply from the Postmaster General, "That he had already recommended provision being made on the Estimates 1860 for the erection of a suitable post office building in your township," but notwithstanding the distinctness of this pledge, no amount for that purpose appeared on the Estimates when laid before the House, and the promise given by the late Honorable Postmaster General was repudiated by his successor.
