MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORISED ON A PORTION OF THE POLICE RESERVE AT AMHERST.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted, that nothing thereinbefore contained shall authorize the holders of miners' rights to occupy for mining purposes any Crown land which shall have been exempted by the Governor in Council from the operations of mining, or which shall have been applied to any public use or purpose, or be lawfully and *bona fide* used as a yard, garden, or orchard, or for any race or dam, or for any house, outhouse, shed, or other building, or to cut or remove from any such Crown land any trees growing thereon, or to cut or construct any race or dam through or upon any such Crown land; but nevertheless it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to authorize the holders of miners' rights to occupy under such miners' rights, and also to cut and construct races and dams for the purposes aforesaid, through or upon any Crown lands which may have been so exempted or applied as aforesaid, subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Governor in Council shall impose: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order authorise the holders of miners' rights to occupy for mining purposes so much of the ground known as "The Police Reserve," situate in the municipal district of Amherst, as is not enclosed within a fence, and also so much of the said ground as is comprised between the fence bounding the western side of the fenced portion thereof abutting on Camp street, Am-

herst, and a line distant eighteen feet eastward of and parallel to such fence, subject to the following conditions and restrictions, that is to say—

That the person or persons entitled or claiming to dig or mine upon or under the ground included within the fence before mentioned shall at his or their expense, previously to digging or mining thereon or thereunder, take down the fence bounding the western side of such reserve as aforesaid, and set up the same to the satisfaction of the warden at a distance of eighteen feet eastward of and parallel to its present position.

And further, that the permission hereby accorded shall not be construed to authorise the occupation of either of the two pieces or portions of ground hereinbefore mentioned for the purpose of residence, nor the construction of any building or other erection on such ground, nor to authorise the making of any excavation or drive under or any interference with the ground beyond the limits of the ground hereby authorised to be dug or mined, or the doing of any act, matter, or thing which shall endanger the safety or stability of any building or other erection beyond such limits.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted that nothing thereinbefore contained shall

authorize the holders of miners' rights to occupy for mining purposes any Crown land which shall have been exempted by the Governor in Council from the operations of mining, or which shall have been applied to any public use or purpose, or be lawfully and *bonâ fide* used as a yard, garden, or orchard, or for any race or dam, or for any house, outhouse, shed, or other building, or to cut or remove from any such Crown land any trees growing thereon, or to cut, or construct any race or dam through or upon any such Crown land; but nevertheless it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to authorize the holders of miners' rights to occupy under such miners' rights, and also to cut and construct races and dams for the purposes aforesaid, through or upon any Crown lands which may have been so exempted or applied as aforesaid, subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Governor in Council shall impose: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order authorize the holders of miners' rights to occupy for mining purposes so much of the ground known as "The Camp Reserve," situate in the municipal district of Heathcote, as is hereinafter described, subject to the following conditions and restrictions, that is to say:—

The warden in charge at Heathcote shall have power to distribute the ground aforesaid by allotment among the holders of miners' rights, and the permission to occupy such ground hereby accorded shall not be construed to authorise the occupation thereof for the purpose of residence, nor the construction of any building or other erection thereon, nor to authorise the making of any excavation or drive under or any interference with any ground beyond the limits of the ground hereby allowed to be dug or mined, or the doing of any act, matter, or thing which shall endanger the safety or stability of any building or other erection beyond such limits.

Description of the boundaries of the land above referred to:—Commencing at the south-west corner post of the reserve, a line bearing north 31 degrees 35 minutes west thirteen chains; thence a line bearing north 58 degrees 25 minutes east nine chains six links; thence a line bearing south 31 degrees 35 minutes east four chains nine links; thence a line bearing south 58 degrees 25 minutes west four chains fifty-three links; thence a line bearing south 31 degrees 35 minutes east six chains eighty-three links; thence a line bearing north 58 degrees 25 minutes east four chains eighty-five links; thence a line bearing south 31 degrees 35 minutes east two chains seventy-four links; thence a line bearing south 58 degrees 25 minutes west nine chains thirty-nine links to the point of commencement. These lines enclose an area of nine acres and thirteen perches. The abovementioned bearings are magnetic.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF DUNOLLY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign (Number 13), intitled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Dunolly.

NOTE.—Bowel complaints very prevalent at Boroondara, but no mortality recorded. Brunswick is healthy. Of the twenty-one deaths at Collingwood, sixteen were of children under twelve months. At Flemington, diphtheria, diarrhoea, and dysentery prevail. Of the thirty-five deaths in Melbourne, twenty-three were of children under three years of age. At Richmond, the whole of the four cases of death were of children. At Sandridge and Emerald Hill, eleven out of thirteen fatal cases were of children; and diarrhoea is reported as on the increase. That disease is always very prevalent at Williamstown.

PETITION FOR ENLARGEMENT.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-two householders resident in the municipal district of Heathcote, including the chairman and councillors thereof.

WILLIAM NICHOLSON.

The petitioners state they are all householders resident in the municipal district of Heathcote.

They refer to the creation of the municipality on the 19th of August, 1859, and draw attention to the power conferred in the Municipal Act 18 Vict. No. 15 to alter or vary the boundaries of a proclaimed district.

They further state that they find it will be for the benefit of the municipality that its boundaries should be altered, and the following boundaries (which are within the limits prescribed by the Act) substituted, viz.:-

Commencing at a point on the north-west boundary of country allotment number forty-eight, in the parish of Heathcote, sold to Henry Welch; thence true north thirty-two degrees east along the said boundary of country allotment number forty-five, and crossing the McIvor Creek, to a point on the north-east side of the main road; thence by a line parallel to and distant twenty-five chains from the north-eastern side of main road through Heathcote, from Sandhurst to Kilmore, to a point on the town boundary of Heathcote; thence along said town boundary north-easterly to a point twenty-five chains from the north-east side of the said road; thence again by a line parallel to and distant twenty-five chains from the north-east side of the said main road to a point bearing true north thirty-four degrees east from the eastern angle of Heathcote suburban allotment number eighteen A; thence by a line true south thirty-four degrees west to a point twenty-five chains from the said main road; thence north-easterly by a line parallel to and distant twenty-five chains from the south-west side of the said main road to a point on the town boundary; thence by the town boundary south-easterly and north-westerly to a point twenty-five chains from the said main road; and thence finally by a line parallel to and distant twenty-five chains from the said main road to the point of commencement.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—
“Your petitioners therefore pray that the boundaries of the municipal district of Heathcote as originally proclaimed may be altered, and that the above boundaries may be proclaimed in their stead.”

MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

BYE-LAW No. 24.—A BYE-LAW TO AMEND BYE-LAW No. 3, BEING A BYE-LAW TO ESTABLISH A TOLL WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF EMERALD HILL.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act to make bye-laws for the establishment of tolls, rates, and other dues, upon any road, market, wharf, or jetty, within the jurisdiction of and under the control of such council, and to erect toll-gates, toll-bars, and other works necessary for the proper collection and management of such tolls, rates, and dues, as to such municipal council shall seem fit: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, dated the 26th day of May, 1855, the district of Emerald Hill was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas by a bye-law passed by the municipal council of said district, and assented to by His Excellency the Governor on the 29th day of November, 1855, it was directed that a toll should be established at that point on the Sandridge road formerly occupied by the Central Road Board for the collection of tolls: And whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law to give powers to the council of said district to remove the toll-gate from the point aforesaid to another point on said road within said district, and to establish check-bars or side-bars in connection with said toll-gate at such point: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Emerald Hill, that, from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act, it shall be lawful for the said council to remove the toll-gate from the point aforesaid to a point upon the said Sandridge

road formed by the intersection of Moray street with said road within said district, and to establish check-bars or side-bars in connection with said toll-gate, and to levy tolls at said gate, check or side-bars in accordance with the schedule as heretofore annexed to said bye-law of 29th of December, 1855: Provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to authorise the municipal council aforesaid to levy a greater or additional sum for one passage through said toll-bar, and any check or side-bar that may be established in connection therewith, than the sums specified in schedule to the bye-law aforesaid, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor: Provided also that nothing herein contained shall authorise the said municipal council to establish or take tolls at any other point upon the said road than at the intersection of Moray street aforesaid with said road.

RICHMOND MUNICIPALITY.

HALF-YEARLY STATEMENT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF RICHMOND, ENDING 2ND NOVEMBER, 1859.

THE Seventh Half-yearly Report, or Statement, of the proceedings of the municipal council of Richmond, for six months, from the 2nd day of May to the 2nd day of November, 1859.

The council have maintained a correspondence, and various deputations have waited on the different departments of the Government, on important public questions affecting the interests of the municipality, with the following results:—

Application to have the breadth of the Punt road increased to 99 feet, in unison with Hoddle street.—Declined.

Application to have ex-constable Cleary reinstated.—Refused.

Application to have the posts, and rails raised in Church street south granted to the council.—Granted.

Application for a site for Public Baths and Washhouses.—Promised.

Application for payment for corrugated iron fence on the north-western portion of the Bridge road, as compensation for land required for maintaining the proper breadth and alignment of that street.—Promised.

Application to His Excellency to grant a board of enquiry on the case of ex-constable Cleary.—Refused.

Application that proper offices and residence for sergeant of police be erected.—House built but not inhabited.

Application for site for Fairstead and Public Market in Church street north.—Promised.

Application for grant from Crown of land on which council chamber and watchhouse are erected.—Granted, on condition that all buildings erected thereon are maintained in proper repair.

Application that a sum be placed on the estimates for laying out and improving the Survey Paddock.—Promised.

Application for dead timber lying in Survey Paddock.—Declined.

Application for funds derivable from quarries, for maintenance of roads leading to same.—Refused.

Application for a payment of £134 9s. 6d. expended by the council on the approaches to the Police Court, and repair of ceiling of same, the said ceiling being in a ruinous and dangerous condition.—Refused.

Application that Swan-street be continued through the Police Paddock.—Continuation proclaimed 19th August, 1859.

Application to retake possession of the Punt.—Granted.

Application that Toll-gate on Bridge road be removed to better adapted situation.—Refused.

Application that money be granted for kerbing and channelling west side of Punt road.—Promised to be placed on Estimates.

Application that money be granted as compensation for land required for proper alignment of Victoria street east.—Promised to be placed on the Estimates.

Application for a sum of money for general drainage.—Promised.

Application for a sum of money for purchase of land necessary for site of street, connecting Church-street south with the Punt road.—Road considered necessary, and request made that plan and valuation be furnished.

Application to Sewerage and Water Commissioners not to enforce compulsory clauses of their Act in the municipality.—Refused.

Application to carry out the arrangement for extension of western boundary, so as to include Hoddle-street.—Under consideration.

Application to have a receiving box for letters placed at the junction of Church-street and the Bridge road.—Refused.

Application that Crown land abutting on Bridge road be not sold, until the question of endowment of municipalities by Parliament be disposed of.—Refused.

Application for a set of standard weights and measures.—Refused.

Application that water and gas be laid on to the police court and watchhouse.—Refused.

Application that police court reserve be fenced in.—Granted.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The council have voted a sum of £250 for the erection of a mechanics' institute, and £250 to purchase books for a free public library, provided an equal sum be collected by private contribution.

Bye-law No. 13, providing for the regulation of public vehicles within the district of Richmond, gazetted on the 3rd of May. Two hundred copies of this bye-law, with the names of places appointed as stands for public carriages, were printed and published for the information and guidance of the ratepayers. The south-eastern portion of Balmain street has since been proclaimed and appointed a stand for carriages.

Bye-law No. 14, imposing a rate of One shilling in the pound for the current municipal year, was gazetted on the 4th of October ultimo.

The council granted the sum of £50 towards defraying the working expenses of the Richmond Volunteer Fire Brigade.

An arbitration was held in re Mahoney v. the Municipal Council of Richmond, the plaintiff claiming compensation for land used and damage done to growing crops by cutting main drain from separation street to Church street north. Awarded £45, less £9 9s., moiety of arbitrators' fees.

Councillor Taylor appointed delegate from the council relative to the extension of the Brighton Railway to Cape Patterson Coal Fields.

Twelve footbridges have been laid where considered most necessary.

Gas mains have been laid by the Melbourne Gas Company through most of the principal thoroughfares.

The Melbourne and Suburban Railway Company have agreed to pay a moiety of the expense of lowering Swan street, from Cubitt to Wellington streets. The works of this railway through, under, and over various streets, are rapidly approaching to completion, and negotiations are nearly concluded for the extension of Balmain street, much to the advantage of the municipality.

The council have caused to be laid, where most requisite, 4501 yards square of paving, and 1391 yards lineal of kerbing.

The council, consisting of the Hon. George Coppin (chairman), councillors Campbell, Burnley, Johnson, Egan, Taylor, and Hardy, have held twenty-five meetings.
