GREETING—

Lord, James Lorimer, Philip Leigh, Thomas James Nankivell, and Theodotus John Sumner, to be the Commission for the purpose aforesaid. For the better effecting the purpose of this Commission, I do give and grant you power and authority to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Commission, and to enquire of and concerning the premises by all of her lawful means and ways whatsoever; and this Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and you, the said Commissioners may, from time to time, and at any place or places, proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing thereof contained, although the enquiry be not regularly continued from time to time by adjournment; and lastly, that you do report, as occasion may require, for the information of the Governor of the said colony, under your hands and seals, all matters and things elicited by you during the enquiry under this commission.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*, it was amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within the said colony, which should from time to time be proclaimed by the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, should, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments respectively of the place or district where the same are or shall be situated within the said colony, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected in the said colony, and of the prisoners confined within the same: And whereas certain buildings and premises have been constructed and built at Beechworth, and it is expedient to proclaim the same in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the buildings and premises situate to the north of and close to the old stockade gaol at Beechworth aforesaid, recently constructed and built as and for a gaol, to be a gaol, prison, and house of correction for the district of Beechworth, for the purposes and within the meaning of the said Act.

The mortality of Melbourne and suburbs, which, during the months of February, March and April, maintained the uniform rate of about 10.5 daily, declined during May to a daily average of 9.2.

The mean temperature of the month of May (54.7°) was 4.1° less than that of April. The highest point reached by the thermometer during May (66.5°) was at 3h. p.m. on the 8th, and the lowest (41.7°) was at midnight on the 29th; the greatest daily range (23.5°) was on the 8th from a maximum of 66.5° to a minimum of 43.0°, and the least (5.9°) was on the 30th from 56.0° to 50.1°, the mean daily range of temperature for the entire month being 12.6°. The mercury in the barometer attained its highest and lowest points (30.356 in.) and (29.497 in.) on the 7th and 22nd respectively, the mean atmospheric pressure for the month being 29.99 in., and the range .859 in.

For the first seven days of the month the mean temperature was 54.1°, or within half a degree of the monthly mean, the deaths for the same period being at the rate of 9 a day, or within a fraction of the average. During the next week the mean temperature rose to 56.1°, or 1.4° over the mean of the month, the deaths declining with the increased mildness of the weather to a daily rate of only 7.1, which was 2 a day less than the monthly average. For the next seven days the temperature rose to a mean of 57.1°, or 2.4° above the monthly mean, the deaths at the same time increasing to 8.6 a day, but still 6 below the average. During the fourth week the mean temperature was 53.0°, being colder than any previous week in 1860, the deaths increasing to 13 a day, or nearly 4 above the average.

The days of greatest mortality were the 23rd, 24th and 25th, on which respectively 14, 16, and 20 deaths occurred. The entire number dying throughout the month was 285, of whom 161, or 56.5 per cent., were males, and 124, or 43.5 per cent., females.

The following table shows the number of persons of all ages at the time of last census, the daily average of deaths during the months of April and May, 1860, and the increase or decrease of the rate of mortality in May, in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and in each of the sub-districts of which it is composed:—

Of the total number of deaths occurring during the month, 161 or 56.5 per cent. were of children under five years of age, of whom 134 were under three years of age, and of whom 83 had not completed their first year. Of the entire number dying under five years, 93 or 57.8 per cent. were males, and 68 or 42.2 per cent. were females.

Of the 124 deaths which occurred to persons over five years of age, 75 or 60·5 per cent. were of males, and 49 or 39·5 per cent. of females; 18 were between the ages of five and fifteen years; 32 between fifteen and thirty; 37 between thirty and forty-five; 23 between forty-five and sixty; and 14 over sixty years of age: of the latter 2 males had reached the age of seventy-five, and a female that of eighty-two. Five male and 3 female lunatics died in the Yarra Bend Asylum.

It is thus seen that deaths from zymotic diseases decreased from 121 or 38·6 per cent. in April to 92 or 32·3 per cent. of the total. Upon referring to the notes it is found that this decrease is chiefly in the deaths from diarrhoea and dysentery, which exhibit a diminution from 80 fatal cases to 22. The only disease of this class which shows a marked increase is scarlatina, 22 deaths having occurred from it in May against 5 in April.

NOTICE TO SHAREHOLDERS IN MINING COMPANIES.

BY the 90th section of the Act 21 Victoria No. 22, it is enacted that no person shall be entitled to institute proceedings in any court of mines, or in any other court, or before any warden, to recover possession of any land occupied by virtue of any Miner's Right, or damages for the occupation of or encroachment upon such land, or to obtain relief as tenant in common or co-adventurer in any such land, against his tenant in common or co-adventurer, unless such person shall have been the holder of a Miner's Right at the time when his title to recover such possession or obtain such relief first arose or accrued.

The holder of shares in a mining company carrying on operations on Crown lands (not under lease), who has not taken out a Miner's Right, is therefore without any means of obtaining legal redress, either as against strangers or as against his fellow shareholders.

Miner's Rights can be obtained at the several Receipt and Pay Offices in Victoria, upon payment of One pound. They remain in force for one year from the time they are issued.

It is not necessary for a person to take out more than one Miner's Right, although he may be interested in a number of mining companies.

MEETINGS.

DURING the half-year the council have held twenty-five ordinary and four special meetings, and two meetings lapsed for want of a quorum. The chairman (councillor Kenworthy) attended twenty-five; councillors Kelly, seventeen; Bland, twenty-eight; Healy, ten; Fitzgerald, twenty; Menzies, twenty-nine; and Dickinson, twenty-three meetings.

PUBLIC WORKS.

To proceed at once with Mollison street bridge, and subsequently for bridge at Edden street, in connection with the railway station, in lieu thereof, in conformity with memorial from ratepayers.—In abeyance.

To lay out road from foot-bridge to Simpson street.—In abeyance.

For site for general slaughter yards.—In abeyance.

For grant towards improvement of botanical gardens.—Under consideration.

For increase of proposed new police quarters at Kyneton.—In abeyance.

For removal of culvert under Mount Alexander road, in Piper street, to the junction of that street with Edden street.—Under consideration.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Councillor Kenworthy was elected chairman of the council for the current year.

The council have again under consideration the lighting of the town with gas or kerosene oil. Meanwhile the lamps are being lighted with candles.

The council meetings are now held in the Mechanics' Institute, and the hour of meeting during the winter months has been changed from Six to Seven o'clock.

The valuation for the current year amounts to £27,164, but the appeals against the same have not yet been heard.

The council have consented to the Public Health Act being extended to Kyneton.

1333 acres of land near Kyneton have been set apart for a town herd, and a herdsman will shortly be appointed.

The new ratepayers' roll contains 475 names.

The council, in conjunction with Maryborough and other municipalities, have been in communication with the Government with a view to the application of a portion of the gold fields grant in testing the artesian wells principle as a means of supplying water. They have also urged the establishment of local insolvent courts, and an increase of the grant to municipalities for 1860.

Underneath is the audited half-yearly statement of receipts and expenditure.
