### NOTICE TO SHAREHOLDERS IN MINING COMPANIES.

**B**y the 90th section of the Act 21 Victoria No. 22, it is enacted that no person shall be entitled to institute proceedings in any court of mines, or in any other court, or before any warden, to recover possession of any land occupied by virtue of any Miner's Right, or damages for the occupation of or encroachment upon such land, or to obtain relief as tenant in common or coadventurer in any such land, against his tenant in common or coadventurer, unless such person shall have been the holder of a Miner's Right at the time when his title to recover such possession or obtain such relief first arose or accrued.

The holder of shares in a mining company carrying on operations on Crown lands (not under lease), who has not taken out a Miner's Right, is therefore without any means of obtaining legal redress, either as against strangers or as against his fellow shareholders.

Miner's Rights can be obtained at the several Receipt and Pay Offices in Victoria, upon payment of One pound. They remain in force for one year from the time they are issued.

It is not necessary for a person to take out more than one Miner's Right, although he may be interested in a number of mining companies.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.  
HAWTHORN.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by two hundred and ninety-two householders, resident in and around the township of Hawthorn, in the county of Bourke, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.  
O.5234. WILLIAM NICHOLSON.

The petitioners state that they are householders within the meaning of the *Municipal Act*, resident in and around the township of Hawthorn, and within the undermentioned district, the area whereof is less than nine square miles, and wherein no point is distant six miles from any other point, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the east bank of the Yarra Yarra River, being the centre of the road forming the northern boundary of portion 28, parish of Boroondara; bounded on the north by the centre of the said road bearing east, the south side of the said road forming the northern boundaries of portions 28, 29, 35, and 69, until it intersects the western boundary of portion 70; thence again on the north by a prolongation of the centre line of the before-mentioned road passing through portion 70, bearing east fifty-six chains twenty links to the eastern boundary of portion 70; thence again on the north by a line bearing east fifty links to the centre of a road one chain wide (the west side of the said road forming the eastern boundaries of portions 70, 93, 91, 97, 98, 101, 102, 104 B, 105 B, 106 B, and 108); thence following the centre of the said road south until it intersects the north bank of the Kooyong Koot or Gardiner's Creek; thence by the said north bank of the Kooyong Koot or Gardiner's Creek to its confluence with the Yarra Yarra River, and by the north and east banks of the Yarra Yarra River to the commencing point, all in the county of Bourke.

They further state that they feel deeply interested in the progress and improvement of the said district, and are of opinion that erecting it into a municipality will prove of undoubted advantage and benefit to the inhabitants, who have at four public meetings unanimously approved of the application now made.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"May it therefore please your Excellency, with the advice of the Executive Council, to cause to be published in the manner required by law the substance and prayer of this petition, and in due time to proclaim the aforesaid district to be 'The Municipal District of Hawthorn,' constituted and empowered under the provisions of the *Municipal Act*, 18 Victoria No. 15."

The council meetings are now held in the Mechanics' Institute, and the hour of meeting during the winter months has been changed from six to seven o'clock.

The valuation for the current year amounts to £27,164, but the appeals against the same have not yet been heard.

The council have consented to the Public Health Act being extended to Kyneton.

1333 acres of land near Kyneton have been set apart for a town herd, and a herdsman will shortly be appointed.

The new ratepayers' roll contains 475 names.

The council, in conjunction with Maryborough and other municipalities, have been in communication with the Government with a view to the application of a portion of the gold fields grant in testing the artesian wells principle as a means of supplying water. They have also urged the establishment of local insolvent courts, and an increase of the grant to municipalities for 1860.

GOVERNMENT WORKS IN PROGRESS.

- Pitching Main road water channel, and maintaining road.
- Clearing out, cutting, and forming the Yarroewe channel and tributary drains.

MISCELLANEOUS.

**Grant-in-aid.**—Owing to the unduly disproportionate appropriation of the last year's grant to Melbourne and in suburban municipalities, this council brought the subject under the notice of the legislature, and invited and obtained the co-operation of all the inland municipalities, in a representation of this injustice, in consequence of which an extension of time was granted for the collection of rates, and it is hoped that the claims of those municipalities will receive more equitable consideration from the Government in future.

**Mining under streets and private property.**—The District Mining Surveyor having registered claims, including reserves and occupied land, and it being apprehended that such course would lead to loss of public property and litigation in so thickly populated a district, the council brought the matter under the notice of the Chief Secretary, who instructed the surveyor to register only the waste lands of the Crown.

**Floods.**—The council having ascertained that the damage occasioned to property by floods on the Main street and elsewhere was the result of the imperfect construction of mining dams, which, in yielding to the force of the current, increased its impetuosity, and carried with it large quantities of sludge, determined on strictly enforcing the conditions of bye-law No. 11, which, if observed, would afford security to both miner and householder.

**Water supply.**—This council, in conjunction with the Western council, carried out certain measures for increasing the water in Yuille's Swamp, for improving its filtration, and for its protection from animal impurities; and this council has received reliable professional confirmation of its belief in the practicability of vastly increasing the quantity of water in the swamp, and of its capacity for its retention at a comparatively small expenditure.

**Railway.**—Notwithstanding that this council had been informed by a former Government that in the event of the terminus of the line being fixed beyond this municipality, a passenger and goods station would be provided in Ballarat East, it unexpectedly learned that no provision was being made for such accommodation, and a deputation from this council waited upon the Government to urge the claims of the municipality in that respect, the result of which it is hoped will be satisfactory, the passenger station having been already acceded to.
