THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SANDEIDGE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, notwithstanding any Act, law, or statute to the contrary, to declare as a municipal district as therein-before mentioned, or to include within the limits and boundaries of any municipal district to be declared as therein mentioned, any locality now included within the corporate limits, of the corporation of the city of Melbourne, and upon the publication of any Proclamation defining the limits of any such municipal district, the locality included within such limits should cease to be a portion of or to be or be deemed to be within the corporate limits of the said corporation, or to be in any manner subject thereto, and should belong solely to the municipal district described in such Proclamation, provided that no liability existing at the time of any such Proclamation for any rate, or the means of enforcing the same, should be affected by the said Act or such Proclamation: And whereas the ratepayers and householders of Macarthur ward, situate within the corporate limits of the said city of Melbourne, have petitioned the Governor, praying for the separation of the said ward from the city, and the erection thereof into a distinct municipal district, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published in accordance with the said Act: And whereas the council of the said city and the petitioners for such municipal district have by mutual agreement adjusted the proportion of the entire liability to be borne by the municipal district hereby erected in respect of any loan contracted by the corporation of the said city: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, with the advice of the Executive Council, declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SANDEIDGE:—Commencing at a marked post on the sea coast of Hobson's Bay on the western side of Dundas street, Emerald Hill; thence by the western side of that street north-easterly fifteen chains forty-five links; thence by a line bearing north twelve degrees east fifty-three chains forty-three links to a marked post on the south side of the Sandridge road; thence by a straight line bearing north-westerly to a post on the south-eastern boundary of the land occupied by the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway Company; thence by a straight line north-westerly until it intersects the western boundary of Macarthur ward at a point on the south bank of the Yarra Yarra river; thence by the said western boundary of Macarthur ward, bearing southerly to a point on the coast of Hobson's Bay, being high-water mark; thence by the high-water line of Hobson's Bay, bearing easterly to the commencing point; save and except all piers, jetties, and wharves now existing or at any time to be hereafter made, such piers, jetties, and wharves being hereby specially excluded from the area of the said municipal district.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Sandridge."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Grant-in-aid.—Owing to the unduly disproportionate appropriation of the last year's grant to Melbourne and in suburban municipalities, this council brought the subject under the notice of the legislature, and invited and obtained the co-operation of all the inland municipalities, in a representation of this injustice; in consequence of which an extension of time was granted for the collection of rates, and it is hoped that the claims of those municipalities will receive more equitable consideration from the Government in future.

Mining under streets and private property.—The District Mining Surveyor having registered claims, including reserves and occupied land, and it being apprehended that such course would lead to loss of public property and litigation in so thickly populated a district, the council brought the matter under the notice of the Chief Secretary, who instructed the surveyor to register only the waste lands of the Crown.

Floods.—The council having ascertained that the damage occasioned to property by floods on the Main street and elsewhere was the result of the imperfect construction of mining dams, which, in yielding to the force of the current, increased its impetuosity, and carried with it large quantities of sludge, determined on strictly enforcing the conditions of bye-law No. 11, which, if observed, would afford security to both miner and householder.

Water supply.—This council, in conjunction with the Western council, carried out certain measures for increasing the water in Yuille's Swamp, for improving its filtration, and for its protection from animal impurities; and this council has received reliable professional confirmation of its belief in the practicability of vastly increasing the quantity of water in the swamp, and of its capacity for its retention at a comparatively small expenditure.

Railway.—Notwithstanding that this council had been informed by a former Government that in the event of the terminus of the line being fixed beyond this municipality, a passenger and goods station would be provided in Ballarat East, it unexpectedly learned that no provision was being made for such accommodation, and a deputation from this council waited upon the Government to urge the claims of the municipality in that respect, the result of which it is hoped will be satisfactory, the passenger station having been already acceded to.
