EXPORTATION OF ARMS AND GUNPOWDER, AND OTHER WARLIKE STORES, RESTRICTED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Customs*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the following goods may, by Proclamation or Order of the Governor in Council, be prohibited either to be exported or carried coastwise, that is to say, Arms, Ammunition, and Gunpowder, Military and Naval Stores, and any articles which the Governor shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military or naval stores; and if any goods so prohibited shall be exported from the colony or carried coastwise, or be waterborne to be so exported or carried, they shall be forfeited: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the seventeenth day of April in the present year, the exportation of Arms, Gunpowder, Ammunition, and other warlike stores, was restricted for the reasons and in manner therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter the terms of such Proclamation: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby prohibit the exportation from any port or place in Victoria aforesaid of Arms, Ammunition, Gunpowder, Military and Naval Stores, or any articles which may be converted to a military or naval purpose, except in manner and subject to the conditions hereinafter mentioned or referred to, that is to say:—From and after the date hereof, Arms, Ammunition, Gunpowder, or other warlike stores, shall and may be exported only under license, in writing, first obtained for that purpose under the hand of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs for the time being, and only at the place, in the manner, and subject to the conditions (if any) specified in such license: Provided always that nothing in this Proclamation shall be construed to apply to the exportation of supplies for the use of Her Majesty's land and sea forces.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventeenth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

NOTICE.

EXPORTATION OF ARMS, GUNPOWDER, ETC.

WITH reference to the Proclamation of this date restricting the Exportation of Arms, Gunpowder, and other Warlike Stores, the following regulation is made for the guidance of consignors shipping the said articles to New South Wales, South Australia, or Tasmania, viz:—

In order to prevent the restriction imposed by the said Proclamation interfering unnecessarily with intercolonial trade, exceptions will be made in favor of consignees resident in New South Wales, South Australia, and Tasmania, upon production by consignors in Victoria of a certificate of the approval by the Government of either of the abovenamed colonies of the person or persons named in such certificate.

AMHERST, BECKWORTH, CRAGIE, ETC.
