A COUNTY COURT CREATED AT YACKANDANDAH.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of July, 1860.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the more easy Recovery of certain Debts and Demands*, it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to direct that county courts shall be holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act, and from time to time, with the advice aforesaid, to direct in what towns and places a county court shall be holden, and that the judge of each court holden under the said Act shall attend and hold such court at the place where the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall have directed that such court shall be holden, at such times as such judge shall appoint for that purpose, so that a court shall be holden in such place once at least in such interval as the Governor, with the advice aforesaid, shall in each case direct: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a county court shall be

holden for the recovery of debts and demands under the said Act at the place and within the interval following, that is to say:—

At Yackandandah, once at least in every two calendar months. And the Honorable John Dennistoun Wood, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

JURY LIST TO BE PREPARED FOR THE JURY DISTRICT OF YACKANDANDAH.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of July, 1860.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating Juries*, it is enacted, that in case any assizes, or any county court or court of general sessions of the peace, shall hereafter be lawfully directed or appointed to be holden at any town other than those at which the same are now holden, the clerk of petty sessions at such court town, and the clerk of petty sessions at every other town or place within the jury district of such court town, and all justices, constables, officers of police, and sheriffs, shall, within such time as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall order for that occasion only, do and perform all such acts, matters and things in and towards preparing, correcting, allowing, sending and delivering the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as aforesaid, and making out the jury books for every such jury district, as are thereinbefore required to be ordinarily done at a different time or period; and all such last-mentioned jury books shall be brought into use, and the persons whose names shall be therein set down shall be liable to serve immediately after the same shall have been made out by the sheriff; and the said last-mentioned books shall be used until new books shall have been prepared under the provisions thereinbefore contained: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing even date herewith, it is ordered that a county court shall be holden at Yackandandah, the same being a place at which a county court has not previously been holden: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a jury list shall be prepared for the jury district of Yackandandah, in the manner and within the intervals hereinafter stated, that is to say:—

The clerk of petty sessions at Yackandandah shall issue his warrant to prepare and make out the jury list for the jury district of Yackandandah, on or before Wednesday, the twenty-fifth day of July instant; such list shall be prepared forthwith, and the notice prescribed by the eighth section of the said Act shall be fixed, as provided by the Act, on Sunday, the fifth, and Sunday, the twelfth day of August now next ensuing; the court of petty sessions at Yackandandah shall revise such list on Monday, the twenty-seventh day of August aforesaid; such list shall be sent to the sheriff on or before Friday, the thirty-first day of August aforesaid; and the jury book shall be prepared and brought into use on or before Tuesday, the eleventh day of September then next following.

And the Honorable John Dennistoun Wood, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF FOOTSCRAY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the municipal district of Footscray shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX. and X.

THE MORTLAKE ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the county of Hampden, hereinafter defined, shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say, situate in the parish of Hampden, and bounded as follows: Commencing at a point in the centre of the Emu Creek, due east of the south-east angle of parish of Glenormiston; and thence on the east by the centre line of the said Emu Creek to the north boundary line of the county of Hampden; thence on the north by the northern boundary of the said county westwards to a point in the centre of the River Hopkins; thence southwards by the centre line of the said river to a point due west of the south-west angle of the parish of South Connewarren; and thence along the south boundaries of the parishes of South Connewarren, Kolora, and Glenormiston, home to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Mortlake Road District."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

BYE-LAW No. 29.—A BYE-LAW FOR THE PREVENTION OF ACCIDENTS FROM BUILDINGS IN A RUINOUS, INSECURE, OR DANGEROUS CONDITION WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ST. KILDA.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of every municipality established pursuant to this Act is empowered to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, the preservation of the public health, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of St. Kilda, from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, that any building in so ruinous, insecure, or dangerous a condition as that passengers are endangered thereby, shall be deemed to be a public nuisance.

1. That the owner, occupier, or agent of any building in a ruinous, insecure, or dangerous condition as aforesaid shall, on receiving notice to that effect from the council through the surveyor or other officer appointed for that purpose, cause, with all convenient speed, any such ruinous, insecure, or dangerous building to be securely shored up, repaired, or pulled down. And the owner, occupier, or agent of any such building refusing or neglecting to properly shore up, repair, or pull down so much of the building or premises as the case may require for the protection of passengers, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, pay a sum or penalty not exceeding £50.

2. It shall be lawful for the municipal council to cause notices in writing to be given to the owner, occupier, or agent of such building; and in case the owner, occupier, or agent cannot be found, or his or their residences not known, to post such notices on the premises, to shore up, repair, or pull down the same, or any part thereof, as the case may require, within fourteen days then next ensuing; and if within the said fourteen days the repair, shoring up, or demolition thereof be not begun, and be not completed as soon as the nature of the case will admit, then the municipal council may order with all convenient speed such building or part thereof as may be necessary for the safety and security of the public to be shored up, repaired, or pulled down or secured in such manner as may from time to time be requisite; and any such owner, occupier, or agent refusing or neglecting to pay on demand the cost of such shoring up, repairing, or pulling down, shall be liable on default thereof and conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace to pay a sum or penalty for every such neglect, refusal, or offence, not exceeding £50.
