PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sie Heney Barrly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHERBAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act to amend the laws relative to the vending of fermented and spirituous liquors, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, a city, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act annexed: And whereas it is deemed expedient to declare the town hereinafter defined to be a town for the purpose and within the meaning of the above recited Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the town hereinafter named and defined shall be a town wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors in quantities not less than two gallons may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the above recited Act, that is to say:

Yea Township Reserve:—Commencing at a small box-tree heing the trigonometrical station on Constitution Hill and

to the above recited Act, that is to say:—
YEA TOWNSHIP RESERVE:—Commencing at a small boxtree, being the trigonometrical station on Constitution Hill, and bounded on the south-east by a line bearing north 60 degrees east fifty-nine chains ninety links; on the east by a line bearing north nine chains to a point on the south bank of the Muddy Croek; on the north by the southern bank of the Muddy Croek to the confluence of the Boundary Creek; on the west by the Boundary Creek to a point on that creek bearing due west from the trigonometrical station on Constitution Hill; and thence by a line bearing east fifty chains to the point of commencement.
