THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HAWTHORN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to the Governor by the householders and landholders at Hawthorn, in the county of Bourke, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HAWTHORN.—Commencing at a point on the east bank of the Yarra Yarra River, being the centre of the road forming the northern boundary of portion 28, parish of Boroondara; bounded on the north by the centre of said road bearing east, south side of said road forming the northern boundaries of portions 23, 29, 35, and 69, until it intersects the west boundary of portion 70; thence again on the north by a prolongation of the centre line of the before-mentioned road passing through portion 70, bearing east fifty-six chains twenty links to the eastern boundary of portion 70; thence again on the north by a line bearing east fifty links to the centre of a road (west side of said road forming the eastern

boundaries of portions 70, 93, 94, 97, 98, 101, 102, 104B, 105B, 106B, and 108); thence following the centre of said road south until it intersects the north bank of the Kooyong Koot or Gardiner's Creek; thence by the said north bank of the Kooyong Koot or Gardiner's Creek north-westerly to its confluence with the Yarra Yarra River; thence by the north and east banks of the Yarra Yarra River to the commencing point.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Hawthorn."

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign.

THE MINING DISTRICT OF BEECHWORTH ALTERED.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of July, 1860.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor

Mr. Nicholson Mr. Service

 Mr. McCulloch Mr. Bailey

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to erect any portion of the colony into a mining district, and to give to such district some distinguishing name, and to define the limits and boundaries thereof, and also again to abolish any such district, and from time to time to alter and vary such limits and boundaries: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, bearing date the fourth day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the several districts therein mentioned were erected into mining districts: And whereas it is expedient to enlarge the mining district of Beechworth: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order alter the said mining district of Beechworth, and doth define the limits and boundaries thereof to be as follow, that is to say:—

THE MINING DISTRICT OF BEECHWORTH.—Commencing at the junction of the Ovens River with the Murray River, bounded on the north and east by the Murray River, bearing easterly and southerly to its source in the main range at Forest Hill; thence on the north-east by a straight line drawn from Forest Hill to Cape Howe, being the boundary line between the colonies of New South Wales and Victoria; thence on the south by the sea-coast to Cape Patterson; thence on the west by part of the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington to the Gipps Land road; thence by that road to the source of the River La Trobe; thence by the Great Dividing Range and a spur running north-westerly to the source of the River Whorouly; thence north-east to Fuller's Range; and thence by that range and a line east to the commencing point.

And the Honorable William Nicholson, Her Majesty's Chief Secretary for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council to split any mining district as thereinbefore mentioned into any number of divisions and to define the limits and boundaries thereof respectively, and also to determine the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division, and from time to time to alter any such division and the limits and boundaries thereof, and to vary the number of members which shall be elected within and for every such division, but so that the total number of members elected for such district shall in no case exceed or be less than ten: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the fourth day of January, 1858, the mining district of Beechworth was split into the divisions therein mentioned: And whereas by divers Orders of the Governor in Council the divisions of the said mining district have from time to time been altered: And whereas it is expedient to enlarge the Omeo division: Now therefore His Excel-

lency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the said mining district of Beechworth shall comprise the eight divisions named in the first column of the schedule hereunto annexed, and doth define the limits and boundaries of each such division to be those set opposite thereto respectively in the last column of the same schedule, and doth determine that the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division shall be that set immediately under the name of each such division, that is to say:—

Influenza still prevails in most of the districts, and fatal cases of scarlatina are reported in Melbourne, Prabran, and South Yarra; and of diphtheria in Melbourne and Prabran.

BYE-LAW No. 17.—A BYE-LAW TO ESTABLISH A TOLL-BAR OR GATE ACROSS WOOD STREET AT ITS JUNCTION WITH THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE MORELAND ROAD, AND WHICH SAID STREET IS DISTANT SEVEN CHAINS EIGHTY-SIX LINKS WEST FROM THE JUNCTION OF THE SYDNEY AND MORELAND ROADS.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act, whenever it shall appear necessary, to establish tolls, rates and dues upon any road, market, wharf or jetty within the jurisdiction and under the control of such council, and to erect toll-gates, toll-bars, and other works necessary for the collection of such tolls, rates or dues, and to make such bye-laws for the proper collection and management of such tolls, rates or dues as to such council shall seem fit: And whereas by a Proclamation of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, bearing date the 26th of October, 1857, the district of Brunswick was duly established a municipal district under the provisions and within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas it appears necessary to the council of the said municipal district of Brunswick, in order to enforce the collection of the tolls chargeable at the Brunswick gate, and to prevent evasion thereof, to establish a toll-bar or gate across Wood street at its junction with the south side of the Moreland road, and other works necessary for the collection of such tolls, rates or dues: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Brunswick, with the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief of the colony of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act:—

1. That on and after the 1st day of August, 1860, a toll-bar or gate shall be established at the entrance of Wood street at its junction with the south side of the Moreland road, for the collection of tolls; and also that toll-gates, toll-bars, and all necessary works for the collection of tolls, shall be maintained or erected and maintained by the said council upon such road, being within the jurisdiction and under the control of the said council.

2. That the tolls specified in the schedule hereto annexed shall be the tolls payable to the said council in respect of any animal or vehicle passing through the said toll-gates or bars, until such times as said council, with such assent as aforesaid, shall see fit to alter the same.

3. That any person who may fraudulently or forcibly pass or claim or attempt to pass said toll-gates or bars, or who may refuse payment, or evade or attempt to evade, or aid, assist, or abet any person in evading or attempting to evade payment of the tolls payable in respect of any animal or vehicle legally chargeable therewith, shall, on conviction thereof before two or more of Her Majesty's justices of the peace, forfeit or pay for every such offence a penalty of sum not exceeding five pounds.

THIS municipality was proclaimed on the 1st day of November, 1859.

The public meeting of the ratepayers for electing members was held on the 27th December following, Frederick Hale Puckle, Esq., in the chair, Messrs. Nicholas John Uren and Frederick Friend, assessors, at which meeting the following gentlemen were elected councillors, viz.:—

The first meeting of the council was held on the 29th December, when Mr. Henry Cox was elected chairman.

The business of the council was continued for some time without any paid officer.

The first step was made by taking the levels of the entire township.

At a meeting held on the 12th March, 1860, Mr. J. S. Jenkins was appointed town surveyor, and Mr. Nicholas John Uren town clerk and collector.

PUBLIC WORKS—COMPLETED.

1. The town being very badly supplied with water, the council, after some trouble, purchased a site, sunk a tank, and erected two pumps.
2. Eradication of the thistles within the municipal district.
3. Forming and metalling 8 chains 75 links, being approaches to a ford over the Grange Creek.
4. Draining and cutting water-tables, 20 chains in Kennedy street and Lonsdale street.

IN PROGRESS.

5. Forming, pitching, and metalling 19 chains of Gray street, and constructing two culverts.
6. Forming, pitching, and metalling 12 chains 50 links of Thompson street, and constructing one culvert.
7. Forming and cutting drains and making culverts on the main road near Mr. Bergin's farm.
8. Draining and cutting water-tables in Lonsdale street and Hamilton place, 20 chains.

9. Draining and cutting water-tables in Clarke, Kennedy, and Gray streets, 20 chains.

10. Draining and cutting water-tables in Scoresby, Brown, and other streets, 20 chains.

BYE-LAWS.

Bye-law No. 1.—To regulate by means of standing orders the proceedings of the municipal council of Hamilton.

Bye-law No. 2.—To regulate the conducting the election of members of the municipal council of Hamilton, approved by the law officers of the Crown, but not yet gazetted.

Bye-law No. 3.—For imposing a rate of One shilling in the pound on the rateable property in the municipal district of Hamilton.

Sections V. to X. of the town and country police act extended to the municipality on the 6th March, 1860.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

For the Legislative Grant of £1000 in aid to new municipalities—Granted.

VALUATION.

The valuation of rateable property within the municipal district after deducting the reductions made by the court of appeal is £11,138 10s., yielding a revenue at one shilling in the pound of £556 18s. 6d.

MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 30TH JUNE, 1860.

PUBLIC WORKS.

DURING the last half-year a number of necessary and important works have been executed, which are particularised in the schedule* appended to the report. Several urgent works, such as kerbing, channelling, &c., are in contemplation, and will be proceeded with immediately.

SANDRIDGE ROAD.

A pile-cased embankment has been constructed along the side of the River Yarra from Prince's bridge to the railway works, at a cost of upwards of £1000. This important work will have the effect of protecting the north-eastern portion of the district from the inundations caused by the overflow of the Yarra after heavy rains. A large quantity of metal has been spread on the carriage-way of the Sandridge road, and other improvements have been effected on it during the half-year. The Government having expressed their readiness to undertake the future maintenance of the road on the council passing a bye-law repealing the bye-laws authorising the collection of the toll, a bye-law having this object in view was framed, but the Executive objected to pass it, as it contained a clause rendering the Government responsible for any obligation which might fall on the council by reason of the passing of the bye-law. The council are at the present time in communication with the Government on the subject.

MISCELLANEOUS.

Plans, &c., for a road from this district through the South Park have been prepared, and are under the consideration of the Government.

Application has been made for a site for a cemetery in the South Park, but no definite reply has yet been received.

The council are still engaged in endeavoring to compel the Melbourne and Hobson's Bay Railway Company to fulfil their obligations by erecting bridges over the line where necessary, to connect lands severed by the railway works, and have sought the assistance and co-operation of the city council in the matter.

The Yan Yean water supply is now extended to nearly every street in the township, and a scheme is under consideration for the prevention and extinguishing of fires, which the supply of water will materially assist in carrying out.

The balance of the loan of £2000 contracted by the council, has been paid off during the last half-year.

The Falls bridge is rapidly approaching completion, and will be shortly open for traffic.

MUNICIPAL ELECTION.

The annual election took place on the 22nd and 23rd of June, to supply the vacancies caused by the retirement by rotation of Messrs. R. Palk, C. Chessell, and W. J. McCutcheon, and resulted in the re-election of Dr. Palk, and the return of Messrs. H. S. Gardner and L. S. Christie, the other two retiring councillors not having offered themselves for re-election. On the new council assembling, councillor R. S. Anderson, M.L.A., was elected chairman for the ensuing municipal year.
