## ORDER OF PRECEDENCE OF PRELATES OF THE ROMAN CATHOLIC CHURCH.

CIRCULAR.

Downing street, 3rd May, 1860.

Sir,

I am led to understand that questions have arisen, or are likely to arise, respecting the precedence due in Her Majesty's colonies to prelates of the Roman Catholic Church.

That precedence rests on a Circular Despatch of Earl Grey, bearing date the 20th of November, 1847, which, on a literal construction, would appear to indicate that Roman Catholic archbishops should rank immediately after Anglican archbishops, and Roman Catholic bishops after Anglican bishops. If, however, this were Lord Grey's intention, it was to a certain extent modified by a later decision conveyed in a despatch to the Governor of New South Wales, dated the 9th of January, 1849, in which he expresses his opinion that the Anglican bishop of Sydney exercising the functions of a metropolitan over the other Anglican bishops of Australia, should retain precedence over the Roman Catholic archbishop, exercising (I presume) similar functions over bishops of his communion.

This decision, however, is far from settling all the questions which may arise upon the creation of any new Roman Catholic archbishopric, or by the grant of metropolitan powers to Roman Catholic prelates. As therefore I feel no doubt with respect to the rule which ought to be observed, I think it best to give you at once such instructions as may preclude any controversy in the colony under your government.

I have no wish or intention to depart from the spirit of Lord Grey's despatch, nor to withdraw the recognition of the Roman Catholic episcopate which it conveyed. But I think it most undesirable, and I doubt whether my predecessor himself could have intended, that Her Majesty's Government should occupy itself in discussing the comparative rank due within that and other episcopates to archbishops and to bishops, or to bishops exercising, and to those not exercising, metropolitan jurisdiction. And I think it wholly objectionable that the precedence of prelates of the National Church should be made dependent on the internal constitution of the Roman Catholic hierarchy, and so consequently on the act of a foreign authority.

I am clearly of opinion, therefore, that neglecting all subordinate distinctions, the episcopate which derives its rank from the Queen's letters patent, should take precedence of any other episcopate not deriving its rank from any such letters patent, and that the dignities of metropolitan, archbishop, or (it may be) patriarch, should only be recognized by Her Majesty's officers when admitted by bishops of each communion as regulating their precedence *inter se*. If not so admitted, you will not take notice of them, but will consider all Roman Catholic prelates as taking rank within the colony of Victoria according to the date of their consecration to the rank of bishop.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, by any Orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which circuit courts should be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he should, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the seventh day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, certain times were appointed for the holding of the several circuit courts of Victoria in every year as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed expedient to postpone the times fixed as aforesaid for holding the next circuit courts at Geelong and Castlemaine: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive

Council, doth by this present Order alter the times for holding the next circuit courts at Geelong and Castlemaine, and doth hereby direct and appoint that the said courts shall be holden during the present year at the respective times hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

At Geelong, on Tuesday the ninth day of October, 1860 (in lieu of 8th October, 1860).

At Castlemaine, on Monday the twenty-ninth day of October, 1860 (in lieu of 26th October, 1860).

And the Honorable John Dennistoun Wood, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**REGISTRAR GENERAL'S REPORT OF THE VITAL STATISTICS OF MELBOURNE AND SUBURBS DURING THE MONTH OF JUNE, AND FOR THE QUARTER ENDING 30TH JUNE, 1860.**

ACTUAL Daily Mortality of persons of both sexes under and over five years of age in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, embracing a radius of ten miles, and including the Statistical Sub-districts of Melbourne Proper, East Melbourne, North Melbourne and Carlton, Fitz Roy Municipality, East Collingwood, Richmond, Jika-jika parish (exclusive of North Melbourne, Collingwood and Richmond), South Yarra and Prahran, Emerald Hill and Sandridge, St. Kilda and Brighton, Doutta Galla and Keilor, Borondara and Heidelberg, Cut-paw-paw parish, and the shipping in Hobson's Bay; also, the Temperature in the shade in Melbourne, deduced from the mean of twenty-four hourly observations taken at the Flagstaff Observatory on each day during the month of June, 1860:—

NOTE.—The totals for April and May are in excess of those already given in the published reports for those months by a few deaths, principally inquest cases, which had not been registered up to the time of the Deputy Registrars forwarding to this office their monthly returns from which those reports were compiled.

The daily average of mortality in Melbourne and suburbs for the month of June was 9.33, against 9.94 for the month of May, and 10.97 for April.

The mean temperature for June was 49.7°, or 5° lower than that for the previous month. The thermometer reached its highest point (63.1°) at noon on the 21st, and its lowest (33.9°) at 7h. a.m. on the 15th. The greatest range of temperature on any one day (22.2°) was experienced on the 16th, from a maximum of 57.2° to a minimum of 35.0°, the range between the maximum and minimum of the month was 29.2°; and the mean daily range 13.3°. The mean atmospheric pressure for the month was 29.893 in.; the highest point reached by the barometer (30.293 in.) was at midnight on the 1st, and the lowest 29.458 in., at 1h. p.m. on the 25th; the range of pressure for the month thus being .835 in.

The mean temperature and daily average of mortality for the first four weeks in June were as follow:—

Of the 280 deaths of both sexes which occurred during the month, 169 or 60.3 per cent. were of males, 111 or 39.7 per cent. of females. The days of greatest mortality were the 15th, 16th, and 21st, on each of which 15 deaths occurred. During May, the greatest number of deaths occurring in any one day was 21, and during April it was 19.

\* The population of Melbourne and suburbs, as shown by the census of 1857, is given as a guide to the probable relative proportions rather than to the actual numbers of the present inhabitants of the several sub-districts.

Of the total number of deaths of all ages, 137 or 48.9 per cent. were of children under five years of age, of these 76 or 55.5 per cent. were of males, and 61 or 44.5 per cent. of females; 79 were less than a year old, 39 between one year and three, and 19 between three years and five. With the single exception of last September, when the deaths of children under five were but 44 per cent. of the total, this is the only month during the past year that the deaths of children under five have not exceeded in number those of persons above that age.

The deaths of persons over five years of age numbered 143, or 51.1 per cent. of the total; 93 or 65 per cent. were of males, 50 or 35 per cent. of females. Of the entire number of both sexes, 23 were between the ages of five and fifteen years, 40 between fifteen and thirty, 40 between thirty and forty-five, 26 between forty-five and sixty, and 14 over sixty years of age. Of the latter, a female had reached the age of seventy-six years, two males that of seventy-five, one that of eighty-four, and another that of eighty-five years. Seven lunatics, all males, died in the Yarra Bend Asylum.

Upon comparing the above table with the one for the previous month, it is found that deaths from zymotic diseases again declined in June, the numbers for that month being 72 or 25.7 per cent., against 92 or 32.3 per cent. in May. The diseases of this class which exhibited the greatest decrease were diarrhoea and dysentery, there having been only 10 deaths from those causes, against 22 in May. Deaths from typhus also decreased slightly, whilst those from scarlatina and diphtheria remained about the same. Five deaths from influenza occurred in June, no fatal case from that complaint being recorded in May.

Deaths from diseases of the nervous and respiratory systems showed a considerable augmentation in June as compared with the previous month. The diminished temperature also appears to have affected old people, 7 deaths having occurred from old age against 2 in May. Deaths from diseases of the digestive organs decreased in June from 36 or 12.7 per cent. to 17 or 6.1 per cent. of the total. The remaining classes do not exhibit any very marked change.

QUARTER ENDING 30TH JUNE, 1860.

The number of deaths occurring in Melbourne and suburbs during the quarter ending 30th June, 1860, was 917, against 1070 during the quarter ending 31st March; the decrease during the quarter ending June thus being 153 or nearly 17 per cent.

The proportion to the total of deaths from zymotic diseases during the past quarter, as compared with the previous one, exhibits a decrease of from 35.5 to 32 per cent; that of deaths from diseases of uncertain seat remains the same within a fraction. The proportion from diseases of the nervous system has decreased from 15.8 to 14.4 per cent, but that from diseases of the respiratory organs has increased from 12.9 to 19.2 per cent. The remaining classes do not vary much in their proportions to the total, over the whole of the two quarters.
