BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

BYE-LAWS.—[17th July, 1860.]

AT a meeting of the Board of Agriculture, holden in the room of the Royal Society of Victoria, Victoria street, in the city of Melbourne, on the 17th day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, it is ordained as follows, that is to say:—

22. All societies entitled to the grant in aid of agricultural societies for the year 1860, shall receive such in proportion to their respective amounts of revenue, until this revenue amounts to the sum of £500 in each case; such societies, however, as possess a revenue exceeding this sum, namely, £500, shall receive for the surplus half the rate of grant proportionate to the revenue, or, in other words, each pound of revenue above £500, in each case, shall rate as ten shillings.

23. No agricultural society shall receive any portion of the money grant at the disposal of the board unless such society shall have furnished to the secretary, thirty days prior to the holding of the annual general meeting, the returns of revenue, prizes offered and awarded, &c., and the name of the representative or representatives of the society at the board, as directed by the council.

24. That the word "July" in bye-law 13 be omitted, and the word "August" inserted in lieu thereof.

25. That the word "council" after the words "addressed to the" in bye-law 14 be omitted, and the word "secretary" inserted in lieu thereof.

LAND RESERVED AT GISBORNE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf, has, by an order made on the 25th day of July, 1860, set apart the piece or portion of land hereinafter described, situate at Gisborne, as a reserve for public purposes.

DESCRIPTION OF THE LAND SET APART.—One acre and twenty-eight perches, county of Bourke, parish of Gisborne, allotments 3, 4, 5, 6, and 9 of section 23, township of Gisborne:—Commencing at the south-east angle of the Mechanics' Institute reserve, bounded on the south by Hamilton street east, bearing east three chains; on the east by a line bearing north three chains ninety links; on the north by a line bearing north seventy-six degrees thirty minutes west two chains fifty links; on part of the west by a line bearing south two chains; again on the north by a line bearing west to the north-east angle of allotment 2, section 23; and on the remainder of the west by the east boundary of allotment 2, bearing south two chains fifty links to the point of commencement.
