THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HAWTHORN.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign (Number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Hawthorn.

of the graves, and construction of coffins to be admitted into vaults, and the covering of vaults so as to prevent the escape of any noxious exhalation or evaporation in the said cemetery, and for protecting the buildings, monuments, shrubberies, plantations, and enclosures therein and thereof from destruction or damage, and shall have power to prosecute all persons who shall or may at any time do or cause to be done any damage to any such buildings, monuments, tombstones, shrubberies, plantations, or enclosures; provided that the said trustees shall not, by any rule or regulation, or any act, matter or thing, at any time interfere, directly or indirectly, with the performance of any religious ceremony in the burial of the dead, according to the usage of the communion to which the deceased may have belonged, or with the original distribution of the said lands or hereditaments made or intended to be made by the said deed of grant or other conveyance, to and amongst separate and distinct religious denominations and communions; provided further that no rite or ceremony shall be performed in any portion of such cemetery set apart for any particular denomination, except according to the usage of such denomination, and by a duly recognised minister of the same; and also of the 10th section of 14 Victoria No. 19, and the 11th section of 17 Victoria No. 12, whereby "The trustees of the said cemetery may allow the members of any religious denomination, at their own expense, to erect and build within such part of the said cemetery as shall be specially set apart for that denomination, a suitable mortuary church or chapel, for the performance of the rites and ceremonies in the burial of the dead according to the usages of such denomination; provided that the plans, specifications, elevations, and models thereof, with lodges and other buildings and conveniences thereto, shall be first submitted for the approval of the said trustees, and shall be approved by them:" with the concurrence and approval of the Government, make and promulgate the following rules and regulations:—

1. Before any interment shall take place in the said cemetery, application for permission shall be made at the office of the trustees, a reasonable time previously, when an order in the form or to the effect set out in the schedule hereto annexed, marked B, will be given to the applicant, on payment of the charges hereto annexed, marked A.
2. All such charges must be paid when the order for interment is given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
3. The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery, on a certificate of a minister of religion, or other sufficient evidence to the satisfaction of the trustees, that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
4. If an interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent, in writing, of the proprietor must be left with the orders.
5. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the orders.
6. No grave is to be less than six feet deep. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required it must be constructed under the direction of the trustees, or whom they may appoint.
7. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Six p.m. from the 1st September to the 30th April, and from Ten a.m. to Four p.m. in the other months.
8. The funeral must take place punctually at the appointed hour.
9. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in and cemented or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
10. A plan of every monument must be submitted to the trustees for approval.
11. All vaults, graves, monuments, and fences, must be kept in proper repair and condition at the expense of the owners, who must, within three days, remove the refuse of all materials used in their construction and repair.
12. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined on payment of the charges in schedule A.
13. All persons destroying the fences, or in any manner injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.
14. No servant employed by the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity from others.
15. The ground will be open to the public from sunrise to sunset.
16. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor.
