## NOTICE TO WHOLESALE DEALERS IN WINE, SPIRITS, OR FERMENTED MALT LIQUORS, AND BREWERS.

**N**OTICE is hereby given that all persons dealing as above, in quantities of not less than two gallons, upon which the duty has been paid, unless registered in accordance with the Acts 13 Victoria No. 26, and 20 Victoria No. 4, are liable to a fine of £30.

Certificates of Registration will be granted by the clerk of the bench at the place nearest to the residence of such dealer at which a Court of Petty Sessions is established, within a district duly proclaimed under the Act, or at the office of the Chief Inspector of Distilleries, at the Immigration Office, King street; and any person who shall not have duly paid the legal fees of registration into the Treasury, or to a receiver of revenue, will be deemed or taken to be a person not registered within the meaning of the Act.

## MUNICIPALITY OF SANDHURST.

**BYE-LAW No. 27.—FOR THE BETTER PREVENTION AND EXTINGUISHING OF FIRES, THE REGULATION OF AWNINGS OVER FOOTPATHS, AND FENCING OF WASTE LANDS ABUTTING ON STREETS.**

**W**HEREAS by an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act to make bye-laws for the prevention and extinguishing of fires, the suppression of nuisances, the preservation of public decency and public health, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Sandhurst—

1. That no person shall light or have any fire burning within or upon any yard or premises, whether enclosed or not, for any purpose whatsoever, without first having obtained license or permission from the said council, or their duly authorized officer, except such fire be made in a properly constructed fire-place.

2. That no person shall be allowed to set fire to any stubble, scrub, furze, or other inflammable material, until notice, in writing, be given to parties owning or occupying property adjacent to the place where such fire shall be made, twenty-four hours previous to such fire being made; and that no fire shall be made and continued excepting between the hours of Eight a.m. and Eight p.m.

3. That no person shall be permitted to keep any heaps or stacks of hay, corn, or straw on their premises, unless the same be under cover of a shed or building, of which no exterior part or covering shall be of canvas or calico, or other textile fabric, or at a distance of fifty feet from any adjoining building, or twenty feet from any adjoining property, not belonging to or in

the occupation of the owner of such heap or stack of hay, corn or straw.

4. That no person shall erect any tent, store, or dwelling, or other building, of calico, canvas, or other textile fabric, or renew with the like material any roof or any other exterior part of any tent, store, or building now existing in any of the proclaimed streets of the municipality of Sandhurst, except the same be situated at a distance of thirty clear feet from any other building.

5. That it shall be lawful for this council to create a municipal fire brigade, to be paid at such rates and subject to such regulations as the council may from time to time appoint; and the council may at any time, at their pleasure, discharge any officer or men of the said brigade and appoint others in their stead; and any person or persons obstructing the members of the municipal fire brigade in the execution of their duty shall, upon conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to erect or cause to be erected any shade or awning over or across any public footpath within the municipality aforesaid without having first obtained in writing the consent of the municipal council aforesaid to such erection. And every such shade or awning, when such consent to the erection of the same shall have been obtained, shall be erected with the outside of the posts or pillars thereof in a line with the outside of the curb or other boundary of the footpath in front of any shop, dwelling-house, or other premises to which such shade or awning shall be attached. And no plate, rafter, or tie of any such shade or awning, shall be of a less height above the surface of such path than eight feet in the clear to the underside of such plate, rafter, or tie. And it shall be competent for the municipal council aforesaid to direct and require the removal of any such shade or awning erected across or over any public footpath of the said municipality, except the same be in strict accordance with the foregoing directions, whether such shade or awning shall have been erected prior to the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor or subsequent thereto; and it shall be further lawful for the said council to give notice to remove any such shade or awning by means of the inspector or other officer of such council, to any owner or occupier by whom or for whom such shade or awning shall have been erected, and any such owner or occupier who shall refuse or neglect to remove any such shade or awning, or portion thereof, within forty-eight hours from the time of such notice of removal being given, shall for every such offence, refusal, or neglect, be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided for a breach of this bye-law.

7. Every person or persons being the owner, occupier, or trustee, owners, occupiers, or trustees, of any land abutting upon any proclaimed street within the said municipal district, whether the said street be formed or not, shall, on receiving a notice to that effect from the council, or their inspector, fence in, or cause to be fenced in, with a good and substantial fence, the frontage of such land abutting upon such path, so as to prevent horses, cattle, carts, drays, waggons, or other animals or vehicles from crossing the same; and in case such owner, occupier, or trustee, owners, occupiers, or trustees, shall not, within twenty-one days after the receipt of such notice, fence in, or cause to be fenced in, the frontage of such land as aforesaid, such owner, occupier, or trustee, owners, occupiers, or trustees, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided for a breach of this bye-law.

8. Any person or persons committing, or causing to be committed, a breach of any of the clauses of this bye-law, shall, on conviction thereof before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

## THE GENERAL SESSIONS DURING THE YEAR 1861.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain  
Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of the Courts of General Sessions in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that Courts of General Sessions should be established and holden in certain places therein named, and such other places and districts within the colony as the Lieutenant Governor thereof should appoint; and that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor of the colony from time to time to define and appoint by Proclamation the limits and boundaries of such places or districts within all such courts should have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts should be holden, and whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the ninth day of March, year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the then existing Courts of General Sessions were appointed to be holden at certain times therein mentioned in every year: And whereas by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-seventh day of August, in the present year, the date for holding the first Court of General Sessions for the district of Beechworth in the year 1861 was altered: And whereas it is deemed expedient to alter and arrange the times for holding all the Courts of General Sessions during the ensuing year: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamations, and, with the advice aforesaid, I do by this my Proclamation appoint that the times at which the several Courts of General Sessions of the peace throughout Victoria shall be holden during the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, shall be the times specified under the respective names of the several places hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

**THE BRIGHTON COMPANY OF THE VICTORIA

THE following Rules and Regulations, agreed to by the members of the Brighton Company of the Victoria Volunteer Rifle Corps, having been approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council, are now published for general information.

**RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BRIGHTON COMPANY OF  
VOLUNTEER RIFLES.**

Adopted at a general meeting, held at the Prince Albert Hotel, on Monday, the 1st day of October, 1860.

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Rule No. 1. The company shall be open to all respectable persons, subject to the approval of the officer commanding; each candidate for admission to be proposed and seconded by members of the company, in writing, stating name, place of abode, and occupation. The name of every candidate for enrolment shall be posted up in the orderly room, and read at at least one parade, so that an opportunity may be given to any member to object to any candidate's admission into the company.

Rule No. 2. An annual subscription of Five (5) shillings shall be paid to the commanding officer by each member, on or before the first day of July in each year.

Rule No. 3. All members changing their permanent address must, within thirty (30) days, give notice of the same in writing to the commanding officer, under a penalty of Five (5) shillings.

Rule No. 4. Any member of the company intending to be absent from his usual address for a period of more than thirty (30) days must give notice of such intention, in writing, to the commanding officer, and deposit his arms and accoutrements in the orderly room, under a penalty of Ten (10) shillings.

Rule No. 5. A member being absent from his district of enrolment more than three (3) months at any one time, unless good and sufficient cause for the same shall be shown, shall be considered to have retired from the company.

Rule No. 6. Each member on joining shall attend instruction drill at least twice a week, and shall not be supplied with uniform until he shall have attended at least sixteen (16) drills, or until he shall have been dismissed from drill, whichever may first happen.

Rule No. 7. Any member will be liable to a fine not exceeding Five (5) shillings for inattention, talking, or other unsteadiness at any parade or drill.

Rule No. 8. Every member will be liable to be sent to instruction drill by the commanding officer for want of knowledge occasioned by absence or any other cause.

Rule No. 9. There shall be four (4) parades of the company in each month, one (1) of which shall be the commanding officer's. The undermentioned fine shall be inflicted upon any member absenting himself from the commanding officer's parade, viz.:-

... fines shall be inflicted on any member neglecting one (1) of the other parades during the month, unless some reason be given to the commanding officer, on or before the last day of the month. Attendance at any parade of the company at Princes' Bridge will be as equivalent to a company parade other than the commanding officer's.

10. At every parade, on the roll being called, any member answering to his name shall be deemed absent, unless some reason has been previously forwarded to the commanding officer. Any member coming late, and assigning a reason which is deemed sufficient by the commanding officer, shall be considered as having been present at that parade.

11. Any member who, after having been supplied with uniform, shall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the regulations, or whose arms, accoutrements, or equipment shall be dirty, or in any way unserviceable from neglect, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence for each offence.

12. On all occasions of promotion to the rank of sergeant or officer, three (3) candidates shall be chosen at some general meeting of the company; each member present shall name three (3), or his vote to be null and void.

13. No member shall be qualified for promotion to the rank of sergeant or officer, who has been dismissed from instruction drill.

Rule No. 14. Members on promotion as commissioned or non-commissioned officers shall drill twice a week at least until they are capable of giving instruction to recruits.

Rule No. 15. Every member will be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him.

Rule No. 16. Any member who may desire to leave his arms and accoutrements in charge of the drill sergeant may do so on payment of One (1) shilling per month to defray the expense of keeping them clean and in good order.

Rule No. 17. Any member permitted to resign within twelve (12) months of receipt of new uniform must pay for the same according to the following scale, viz.:-

Retiring under 7 months, full price.
At the end of 7 months, five-sixths ditto.
At the end of 8 months, two-thirds ditto.
At the end of 9 months, one-half ditto.
At the end of 10 months, one-third ditto.
At the end of 11 months, one-sixth ditto.

Rule No. 18. Any member expelled the company within twelve (12) months of the receipt of new uniform will be required to defray the full contract price of the same.

Rule No. 19. Members of the company are liable to be placed in arrest under the following circumstances:-

1. By order of the officer commanding, pending the investigation of any charge.
2. By the senior officer present for any misconduct in uniform, in which case the person so placed in arrest must, without any remark or altercation, proceed immediately and change his dress.

No person placed under arrest may wear his uniform until released. Non-compliance with any part of this rule will entail a penalty not exceeding Five (5) pounds.

Rule No. 20. The commanding officer may at any time order a court-martial.

Rule No. 21. Any member feeling himself aggrieved by the decision of the commanding officer may demand a court-martial.

Rule No. 22. All courts-martial shall consist of seven (7) members of the age of twenty-one (21) years and upwards (including the president), of whom one shall be a commissioned or non-commissioned officer; the president to be appointed by the commanding officer, and the other members to be taken in rotation from a roster.

Rule No. 23. A list of the members of the court shall be given to the member accused, who may object to any of them (excepting the president), such objections to be limited to ten (10) in number.

Rule No. 24. A court-martial shall have the power to censure, fine to the extent of Five (5) pounds, or expel.

Rule No. 25. The decision of a court-martial, subject to the confirmation of His Excellency the Governor, shall be final.

Rule No. 26. The forms to be observed on court-martial shall be as nearly as possible in accordance with those observed in Her Majesty's Army.

Rule No. 27. A general meeting of the company shall be held in the first week of January and July respectively, of which one (1) week's notice is to be given by circular.

Rule No. 28. At every half-yearly meeting a select committee consisting of nine (9) members, of whom five (5) shall form a quorum, shall be chosen by ballot, to audit and settle the accounts of the company, and generally to take into consideration any matters connected with the company that may be referred to them by the commanding officer.

Rule No. 29. The officer commanding the company may at any time convene a special general meeting.

Rule No. 30. On a requisition signed by not less than ten (10) members, the commanding officer must call a special general meeting.

Rule No. 31. Not less than seven days' notice shall be given of every special general meeting stating the business to be transacted, and no business shall be transacted unless one-third of the company are present.

Rule No. 32. At every general meeting the senior officer present shall be chairman. No person shall be permitted to speak to any question more than once (unless in explanation), except the mover of a resolution, who shall be entitled to a reply. All motions shall be delivered to the chairman, in writing, and shall be decided by the holding up of hands, unless a division be demanded by two (2) or more members. No protest shall be received, and no meeting shall be adjourned or dissolved without a motion for that purpose.

Rule No. 33. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to the non-commissioned officer, or others duly appointed by the commanding officer to receive the same, within fourteen (14) days of its notification to him, and in default of such payment will be proceeded against according to law.

Rule No. 34. All moneys arising from fines and other sources will be collected by the non-commissioned officers, and paid over to the officer commanding, who will keep a public account, and submit the same for inspection half-yearly, or whenever deemed advisable by one-third of the company.

Rule No. 35. A book shall be kept called the "Fine Book," in which all fines shall be entered and signed by the commanding officer; a separate entry is also to be made when such fine is collected, with the signature of the receiving officer. This book shall be kept in the orderly-room and be accessible to every member whenever required.

Rule No. 36. All moneys arising from fines and other sources shall be paid into the general fund of the company.

Rule No. 37. Bye-laws, not inconsistent with these regulations, nor with the provisions of the Acts of the Legislative Council 18 Victoria No. 7, and 19 Victoria No. 8, may be made by the select committee, and if approved by the commanding officer, shall be by him submitted for confirmation or rejection at the next general meeting of the company; and every such bye-law, if confirmed at such general meeting, shall be thenceforth

binding on all members of the company; and non-compliance with any such bye-law will render the offender to be liable to a penalty not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

Rule No. 38. Any member desirous of altering or rescinding any rule or regulation of the company, or of adding any new rule, must give fourteen (14) days' notice of the same, in writing, to the commanding officer, who shall cause a copy of such proposed alteration, rescision, or addition, to be hung up in the orderly room.

Rule No. 39. It shall not be competent to recommend to His Excellency the Governor any alteration, rescision, or addition to the existing rules of the company, unless such shall have been agreed to at a general meeting by an absolute majority of the company.

Rule No. 40. Every member joining the company shall be supplied with a copy of these rules and regulations.

**MUNICIPALITY OF HAWTHORN.**

**BYE-LAW No. 4.—A BYE-LAW TO PREVENT NUISANCES ARISING FROM SUFFERING CATTLE TO BE AT LARGE ON THE ROADS AND UNENCLOSED PLACES WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF HAWTHORN.**

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, the preservation of the public health, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: And whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law for the more certain prevention of the nuisances occasioned from cattle being allowed to be at large on the roads and unenclosed places within the municipal district:

Be it therefore enacted, that from and after this bye-law coming into operation, it shall not be lawful for any person to suffer any kind of swine, or any horse, mule, ass, sheep, goat or other cattle belonging to him or her, or under his or her charge, to be at large in any street or public place, or in any unenclosed place within the said municipal district, unless the same shall be his or her freehold property, or in his or her occupation. Any person who shall so offend shall, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds.

**MISCELLANEOUS.**

A trial of kerosene oil lamps for lighting the streets has been made, but not finally adopted. The great expense of gas has hitherto precluded the use thereof in the lighting of the town.

The council appointed councillor Menzies to attend the municipal conference in Melbourne, the result of whose deliberations has been made public.

The Government, after repeated applications, granted nine and a quarter acres of suburban section No. 9 as sites for town hall and general and cattle markets, and the council contemplate immediate action in the establishment of such markets.

Efforts have been made to extend Piper street from Mollison street to the Eastern Boundary road, but it is feared the cost of lands necessary to be purchased for the purpose will prevent its being carried out.

Applications have been made to the various insurance offices to contribute towards the expense of establishing a fire brigade, but no further steps have been taken in the matter, in consequence of the little pecuniary aid promised.

The council have under consideration the removal of all slaughter-houses from the municipality to the site appointed for the purpy. They also contemplate borrowing a sum of £3000 to carry out various important public works.

The annual election to fill the vacancies occasioned by the retirement by rotation of councillors Kelly, Healy, and Bland, took place on the 10th December, when councillors Wilson, Scott, and Hargreave, were elected.

The half-yearly statement of receipts and expenditure, duly audited, appears at foot.

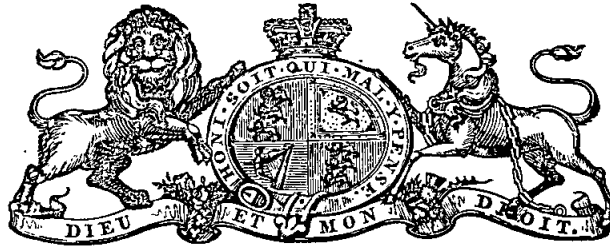

DEFINING WATER FRONTAGES.

P R O C L A M A T I O N .

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-fourth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, by Proclamation, to define what shall be considered Water Frontages within the meaning of the said Act, and to rescind such Proclamation and to issue other Proclamations in lieu thereof: And whereas a Proclamation defining Water Frontages, and bearing date the first day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, was published in the *Government Gazette* of the same date: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby rescind the said Proclamation, and do direct and define that the following shall be considered Water Frontages under the provisions of the said Act, to wit:—

One hundred feet in width of land on both banks of such rivers as are either at present navigable or admit of being rendered so, and also one hundred feet in width of land measured from high water mark along the sea coast, and also one hundred feet in width of land around the margin of all permanent fresh water lakes, and also detached portions of land at an average distance of one mile asunder, measured in a straight line on both banks of all secondary rivers, streams, creeks, and water-courses, within the colony of Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this second day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.
