**REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE GRANT IN AID  
OF PUBLIC WORSHIP.**

*Under 18 & 19 Vict., cap. 55, clause 53.*

**T**HE following Amended Regulations for the distribution of the grant in aid of public worship, having received the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, are now published for general information.

**REGULATIONS.**

His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to direct that the following regulations, for the distribution of the grant (under the Constitution Act) in aid of public worship, shall be substituted in lieu of those of the 19th February, 1857, and shall take effect from this date:—

1. The Act directs that the grant (£50,000) shall be apportioned to each denomination according to the relative proportions of the numbers of such denomination at the last census. In so apportioning the grant, no account will be taken of persons set down in the census returns under indefinite heads, and as belonging, therefore, to no particular denomination.

When in the interval between one census and another a denomination becomes divided into two or more sections, the proportion of the grant (payable to that denomination) to which each section is entitled must be mutually arranged by the several sections and notified to the Treasurer by the recognised heads of such sections, until which notification no payment of any portion of the grant payable to the original denomination will be made.

The ministers of the several congregations receiving aid at the time of the division will be considered the proper persons to make the requisite arrangements as above for the appropriation of the grant.

2. A schedule, showing the distribution among the several denominations, may be inspected at the Treasury.

3. The head or recognised organ of communication with the Government of every Christian denomination intending to claim aid under these regulations is requested to send a notice to the Treasurer in the accompanying form (A.).

4. Should any denomination omit to claim the amount apportioned to it on or before the 31st December of the year in which such apportionment shall be made, the amount apportioned to such denomination shall immediately after such date revert to the consolidated revenue.

## STIPENDS.

5. A sum not exceeding one-half of the amount apportioned to each denomination will be applicable to the payment of stipends.

6. At any time after the apportionment referred to in the 1st section, the head of any denomination may apply to the Treasurer for such stipends as may be required for ministers of that denomination.

The application must be made on form (B.), which provides for an undertaking by the head of the denomination that additional stipends to an amount not less than half those paid out of the grant will be paid out of other sources.

7. No stipend exceeding £500 will be granted, except to the head of a denomination.

8. Payments of stipends, when sanctioned by His Excellency, will be made monthly at the Treasury upon the usual form of voucher.

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9. In each year, before any payment on account of the grant for the year can be made to a denomination, the head of that denomination, or its recognised organ of communication with the Government, must send to the Treasurer a statement in the form marked (C.), showing the several amounts received by each minister from the public grant and from other sources respectively. Should the amount of these contributions received by any denomination fall short of the sum received from the grant, a corresponding reduction will be made in the sum allotted to that denomination for the ensuing year.

The statement must be certified to by the head or recognised organ of the denomination, as shown on the form (C.).

## BUILDINGS.

10. The whole of the amount apportioned to each denomination will be applicable towards the erection of churches, chapels, and ministers' dwellings.

11. Applications for aid in this respect must be made in form (D.) by the head of the denomination to the Treasurer, and must be accompanied by satisfactory proof that the land upon which the buildings are to be erected has been duly conveyed to a trustee or trustees approved by the Governor in Council.

In support of each application a list of the private subscriptions received in aid of the buildings for which a grant is sought must be forwarded, such list to show the names of the several contributors, and to bear a certificate by the trustees, form (E.), that the sums mentioned in it have been actually received by them.

12. No application for aid towards the erection of a church or chapel can be entertained until £200 at least shall have been raised by contributions, and actually paid over to the trustees; and in like manner £50 at least must have been raised and paid over in the case of an application being made to erect a minister's dwelling.

13. Upon the above regulations being complied with, grants will be sanctioned by the Governor out of the sums apportioned to each denomination, equal to twice the amount paid to the trustees. But the total amount of the grants to any church or chapel will not exceed £3000, or to any minister's dwelling £600.

14. Accounts for the payment of grants in aid of buildings must be prepared on the form marked (F.); the statement of particulars on such accounts must be signed in the place indicated by the head, or by some duly authorised minister of the denomination, and the certificate of an officer of the Public Works Department (or where no such officer resides within a reasonable distance, of a police magistrate) must be inscribed on it that he has examined the building, that the materials are good and sufficient, and that to the best of his judgment and belief a sum not less than the aggregate of the grants specified in the account, and the requisite amount of private contributions to justify them, has been expended on its erection.

WHEREAS His Excellency did pass in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor in Council to split any mining district as thereinbefore mentioned into any number of divisions, and to define the limits and boundaries thereof respectively, and also to determine the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division, and from time to time to alter the limits and boundaries of such districts and boundaries thereof, and to vary the number of members which shall be elected within and for every such division, but so that the total number of members elected for such district shall in no case exceed or be less than ten: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council, made on the fourth day of January, 1858, the mining district of Beechworth was split into the divisions therein mentioned: And whereas by divers Orders of the Governor in Council, made from time to time, the mining district have from time to time been altered: And whereas His Excellency did intend to consolidate the Spring Creek and the Three-mile Creek divisions into a single division, and to assign four members to the Indigo division: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor,

by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that the said mining district of Beechworth shall comprise the seven divisions named in the first column of the schedule hereunto annexed, and doth define the limits and boundaries of each such division to be those set opposite thereto respectively in the last column of the same schedule, and doth determine that the number of members of the mining board of such district which shall be elected within and for every such division shall be that set immediately under the name of each such division, that is to say:—

pair, the council, anxious to remove the liability at the bank, have confined the operations for the past half-year to those works which were indispensably necessary.
