LIGHTS AND FOG SIGNALS TO BE CARRIED BY STEAM AND SAILING VESSELS.

THE special attention of owners and masters of vessels is called to the regulations respecting the lights to be carried by sailing and steam vessels, the non-observance of which has recently led to collisions.

As it is intended strictly to enforce these regulations (copy of which is annexed), masters of vessels are hereby cautioned that any neglect thereof renders them liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Copies of the regulations may be seen and can be obtained at any custom house or harbor office in Victoria.

LIGHTS AND FOG SIGNALS TO BE CARRIED BY STEAM AND SAILING VESSELS.

His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to approve of the accompanying regulations relative to the lights and fog signals to be carried by steam and sailing vessels to prevent collisions, in accordance with the provisions of the 29th section of the Act 16 Victoria No. 25, in lieu of those published at page No. 1944 of the *Government Gazette* of the 7th August, 1855.

REGULATIONS AS TO LIGHTS AND FOG SIGNALS TO BE CARRIED BY STEAM AND SAILING VESSELS.

The Victoria Steam Navigation Board, by virtue of the power and authority vested in them by the 29th section of 16th Victoria No. 25, and with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, have determined that from and after the 1st day of January, 1859, the following regulations shall be strictly observed on board all steam and sailing vessels coming within the provisions of the said Act.

STEAM VESSELS.

All steam vessels when under steam shall, between sunset and sunrise, exhibit the following lights:—

1. A bright white light at the foremast head.
A green light on the starboard side.
A red light on the port side.

2. The mast-head light shall be so constructed as to be visible on a dark night with a clear atmosphere at a distance of at least 5 miles, and shall show a uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 20 points of the compass, and it shall be so fixed as to throw the light 10 points on each side of the ship from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on either side.

3. The green light on the starboard side and the red light on the port side shall be so constructed as to be visible on a dark night with a clear atmosphere at a distance of at least 2 miles, and a uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass, and they shall be so fixed as to throw the light from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on the starboard and the port sides respectively.

4. The side lights are to be fitted with inboard screens, projecting at least 3 feet forward from the light, so as to prevent the lights from being seen across the bow.

5. Steam vessels under sail only are not to carry their mast-head light.

6. Steam vessels plying on the River Yarra Yarra above the Falls shall exhibit—

When under steam

{ A bright white light at foremast head and not less than 12 feet from the deck, to be visible on a clear dark night at a distance of at least 2 miles, and
A red light hung outside the stem under the bowsprit.

When at anchor—A common bright white light.

FOR SIGNALS.

All steam vessels, whether propelled by paddles or screw, when their steam is up and when under weigh, shall in all cases of fog use as a fog signal a steam whistle placed before the funnel at not less than 8 feet from the deck, which shall be sounded once at least every five minutes, but when steam is not up they shall use a fog horn or bell as ordered for sailing ships.

SAILING VESSELS.

1. All sea-going sailing vessels, when under weigh or being towed, shall, between sunset and sunrise, exhibit a green light on the starboard side and a red light on the port side of the vessel, and such lights shall be so constructed as to be visible on a dark night with a clear atmosphere at a distance of at least 2 miles, and shall show a uniform and unbroken light over an arc of the horizon of 10 points of the compass from right ahead to 2 points abaft the beam on the starboard and on the port sides respectively.

2. The colored lights shall be fixed whenever it is practicable so to exhibit them, and shall be fitted with inboard screens, projecting at least 3 feet forward from the light, so as to prevent the lights being seen across the bow.

3. When the colored light cannot be fixed (as in the case of small vessels in bad weather), they shall be kept on deck between sunset and sunrise, and on their proper sides of the vessel, ready for instant exhibition, and shall be exhibited in such a manner as can be best seen on the approach of, or to, any other vessel or vessels in sufficient time to avoid collision, and so that the green light shall not be seen on the port side, nor the red light on the starboard side.

FOG SIGNALS.

All sea-going sailing vessels, when under weigh, shall, in all cases of fog, use when on the starboard tack a fog horn, and when on the port tack shall ring a bell. These signals shall be sounded at least every five minutes.

VESSELS AT ANCHOR.

All vessels when at anchor in roadsteads or fairways shall, between sunset and sunrise, exhibit where it can best be seen, but at a height not exceeding 20 feet above the hull, a white light in a globular lantern of 8 inches in diameter, and so constructed as to show a clear, uniform, unbroken light all round the horizon at a distance of at least 1 mile.

The regulations framed by the board on this subject, and dated 30th day of July, 1855, are hereby revoked, as from and after the 31st day of December, 1858.

DISTRICTS BROUGHT UNDER THE GUNPOWDER ACT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to regulate the importation, carriage, and custody of Gunpowder*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim any town, township, or municipal district, not being a sea-port town, as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person shall bring more than One hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and shall not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it shall be forfeited: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned to be districts within the meaning and intent and for the purpose mentioned in the above recited clause of the said Act, that is to say:—

The Municipal District of Ararat.
The Municipal District of Avoca.
The Municipal District of Ballaarat.
The Municipal District of Ballaarat East.
The Municipal District of Beechworth.
The Municipal District of Castlemaine.
The Municipal District of Dunolly.
The Municipal District of Sandhurst.

BEGULATIONS RELATING TO GRAZIER'S LICENSES FOR GOLD FIELDS COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for such persons as shall be authorised in that behalf by the Board of Land and Works, to issue documents to be called "Grazier's Licenses," upon payment of such sum as shall be determined by any rules and regulations to be made by the Governor in Council, and every such document shall entitle the person to whom the same shall be granted to depasture upon the gold fields common therein mentioned, the number of cattle or horses therein mentioned, subject to such conditions as may from time to time be imposed by any rules or regulations to be made by the Governor in Council, and every such license shall be in force for a period not exceeding one year from the time when the same shall be issued; and it is further enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for the more fully carrying out the objects and purposes of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, make the rules and regulations hereinafter set forth relating to applications for and the issue of Grazier's Depasturing Licenses for Gold Fields Commons, that is to say:—

1. *Applications for grazier's depasturing licenses*.—Persons residing within five (5) miles of a proclaimed gold fields common shall, on depositing with the commissioner of Crown lands whose office shall be nearest to such common an application in the form of the first schedule herewith, be entitled to obtain a grazier's depasturing license in the form of the second schedule herewith to depasture on the gold fields common therein named any number of stock not exceeding fifty (50), on payment as hereinafter provided of Two shillings (2s.) for every head of cattle, and Four shillings (4s.) for every horse; and every such license shall be in force for a period not exceeding one (1) year from the date when the same shall be issued.

2. *Issue of grazier's depasturing licenses*.—Grazier's depasturing licenses, in the form prescribed in the second schedule herewith, shall be issued by commissioners of Crown lands on deposit by the persons entitled to obtain the same of applications made in the form of the first schedule herewith, and payment of the fees before mentioned; and every such license shall entitle the person to whom it is issued to depasture on the gold fields common therein named for a period not exceeding one year the number of cattle and horses therein specified.

3. Forms of application for grazier's depasturing licenses may be obtained at the offices of commissioners of Crown lands and district surveyors.

4. Persons holding grazier's depasturing licenses shall not be entitled to any compensation or return of license fees on account of diminution, alteration, or abolition by the Governor in Council of any gold fields common during the currency of such licenses.

CAMPASPE ROAD DISTRICT.

RULES TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

1. The business of the board shall be conducted with open doors.

2. The regular meetings of the board shall be held at the office of the board, on the first Wednesday of every month, at two o'clock in the afternoon. The business to commence as soon as the quorum of three is present; but should a quorum of three not be present at the expiration of half an hour after the time appointed for meeting, the same shall be entered, with a note of the members present, in the minute book, and the meeting shall lapse.

3. Special meetings may be summoned at any time by the secretary, upon his receiving a written requisition signed by two members, stating the matter to be brought forward at such meeting; provided he shall give to each member notice thereof by post seven clear days before such meeting.

4. At every regular meeting of the board the first business thereof shall be the reading of the minutes of any preceding meeting and the putting for confirmation thereof; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of proceedings. The minutes when confirmed shall be signed by the chairman for the time being.

5. After the confirmation of the minutes, the order of business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable:—

1. Reading copies of letters sent.
2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
3. Reception and reading of petitions.
4. Reading and ordering on reports of permanent committees.
5. Reading and ordering on reports of special committees.
6. Orders of the day.
7. Motions of which previous notice shall have been given.

6. All petitions or memorials addressed to the board must be presented by one of its members, who will be responsible for its being in proper form and respectfully worded.

7. On a petition or memorial being presented to the board, no debate on the subject matter therein contained shall take place thereon until it shall have lain on the table for one week, and until a notice of motion be given by the member who presented it that it be considered at the next meeting of the board; and the only question that shall be entertained shall be, that the petition or memorial be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

8. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of a notice of motion. No such motion, however, shall be decided on at any meeting of the board unless notice thereof shall have been given to the secretary, in writing, by the member bringing it forward, at the meeting previous to that in which the same shall be taken into consideration.

9. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called on. Notices not proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

10. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the board regularly convened; and every such bye-law shall, in the interim, remain open for inspection of any of the ratepayers, in the office of the board, free of charge.

11. It shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole board, to rescind any motion which has already passed the board during the same official year, and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each member of the board by post of the day for which such call is made.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

12. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand up while addressing the board.

13. The presiding chairman's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

14. Every motion or amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded.

15. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

16. All questions before the board shall be decided by open voting.

17. No discussion will be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment is carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

18. No motion, the effect of which if carried would be to rescind any motion that has already passed the board, shall be entertained during the same year, unless a call of the whole board shall have been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board that shall have been negatived by the board shall be again entertained during the same year.

19. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the board, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the board.

20. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member, immediately on the same being used.

21. Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution of the board; notice of intention to protest must, however, be given in every case on the adoption of the resolution to be protested against, and the protest signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reasons for protesting, must be entered before the next regular meeting of the board, by the protesting member or members in a book to be kept for that purpose in the secretary's office.

22. Notices of motion may be dispensed with in cases of emergency, provided not more than one member be absent at such board meeting.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS.

23. No election to any office at the disposal of the board shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in the local newspapers, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

CONTRACTS.

24. All contracts shall be made by tender, and advertised not less than twice in the local newspapers, unless the board shall otherwise direct. Tenders shall be addressed to the chairman, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the board; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered in every case on the minutes of the board. When tenders shall have been accepted for an amount exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds sterling, a contract bond shall be entered into, signed by the contractor and two sureties, and by two members of the board, one of whom shall be the chairman of the board, or in his absence the chairman of the meeting at which such tender shall have been accepted, and the expense (if any) of preparing such bond shall in all cases be borne by the person or persons giving the same.

25. No officer or member of the board shall have any pecuniary interest, either directly or indirectly, in any contract under the board.

PAYMENT OF MONEYS.

26. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the chairman and one other member of the board, and countersigned by the secretary, and no such cheques shall be given unless at a regular meeting of the board.

LOCAL ASSESSMENT.

27. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due on the assessment roll; and in the event of any such amount not being paid to him, a notice shall be left stating that unless the amount be paid before the expiration of one month from the date thereof, legal proceedings will be taken for its recovery.

28. The collector shall, once a week at least, pay into such bank as the board shall direct, to the credit of such board, all moneys received by him from time to time, and at the same time furnish the secretary with an account of such moneys.

29. The collector and treasurer shall present their accounts at each regular meeting of the board.

At a meeting of the Campaspe District Road Board, held at Huntly, within the said district, on the fifteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the foregoing bye-law was adopted, and ordered to be forwarded to His Excellency the Governor for his approval, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of Council 16 Victoria No. 40, sec. 4.

The petitioners state that their locality is situated on the Main Mount Alexander road, and is fast rising in importance, being the centre of a large and increasing agricultural population.

That within the township boundary there are many large and substantial buildings, including stores, hotels, and steam flour-mills, breweries, and a large malting establishment all now in full operation, and moreover that some of the finest blue-stone quarries have been opened and are being extensively worked.

That roads, bridges, drains, and streets are required to facilitate the large and increasing local traffic, but no provision exists for these works.

They urge upon His Excellency the expediency of forming their locality into a municipal district, as tending greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government, and suggest the following boundaries for such

The petitioners state that the town of St. Arnaud is situate in the centre of the large mining division of the same name, and has been surveyed and sold in part about three years; that it contains a settled mining and trading population, that large sums are being invested in permanent buildings owing to the stability and progress of its mining companies, and that its population is steadily increasing.

They further state that four sales of land have taken place at St. Arnaud, whereat town lands realized £800 per acre, and suburban lands (most of which are under cultivation) from 50s. to £5 10s. per acre, and that notwithstanding the large sums paid to Government for lands, no provision has been made for roads, bridges, or approaches to the town, or within a distance of forty miles thereof, and that the heavy traffic through the town frequently renders the thoroughfares impassable.

MUNICIPALITY OF HAMILTON.

THIRD HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE COUNCIL, ENDING 25TH JUNE, 1861.

At the annual election, Messrs. Laidlaw, McKellar, and McDougall were elected in the room of Councillors Allan, Bloomfield, and Heath. Councillor Learmonth was elected chairman for the current year.

On the 6th March Mr. D. M. Cameron was elected in the room of Councillor McKellar, disqualified by non-attendance.

On the 2nd May the seats of Councillors Stevenson and Cameron were declared vacant by non-attendance. These vacancies have not yet been filled.

During the half-year the chairman attended 20 ordinary and 1 special meetings; Councillor Cox, 16; Councillor Stevenson, 6 and 1 special; Councillor Malcolm, 13; Councillor Laidlaw, 25 and 1 special; Councillor McDougall, 18 and 1 special; Councillor McKellar, none; and Councillor Cameron, 4.

Bye-laws have received His Excellency's assent for imposing a rate of One shilling in the pound on all rateable property, and for the suppression of the goat and pig nuisances.

On the 14th March the offices of town clerk, surveyor, and collector were amalgamated, and Mr. John S. Jenkins, and former surveyor, appointed at a salary of £225 per annum.

During the half-year ten chains of streets have been formed and metalled, fifty-six chains of road cleared, and upwards of one mile of side drains have been cut throughout the town.

On the 2nd May permission was granted to Messrs. J. H. Clough and Co. to erect and maintain for six years a weigh-bridge on Gray street, opposite their stores, under regulations by which the use of the same shall be secured to the public.

On application of the council, the Dog Act was extended to Hamilton.

The council have protested against the smallness of the town commonage proclaimed. The Government, however, have, as yet, set apart no additional area.

Application has been made, with every prospect of success, to reserve the Government paddock as a botanical garden. A statement of the receipts and expenditure of the council for the half-year is appended.
