SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF WAHGUNYAH.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander
of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General
and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-
Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the
reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled,
*An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places
in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many
of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of
towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V.,
VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, should extend to
and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the
Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the *Government
Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respec-
tively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant
Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and
alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all
the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being num-
bered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation through-
out Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing
thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria,
with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare

that the township of Wahgunyah, situate on the Murray River,
at its junction with Sunday Creek, the limits whereof are here-
inafter defined, shall come under the operation of the sections
of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX.,
and X.

And I do hereby define the limits of the said township of
Wahgunyah in manner following, viz.:—Commencing at the
south-west angle of allotment 5, section 5, parish of Carlyle;
bounded on the east by allotments 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 of section 5,
and allotments 2 and 1 of section 4, parish of Carlyle, bearing
north eighty chains twenty links, more or less; thence on the
north by the south side of a road bearing west sixty-nine chains,
more or less, to the Murray River; thence by that river westerly
to its junction with Sunday Creek; and by the last-named
creek southerly to a point bearing due west of the commencing
point; thence by the north side of a road two chains wide,
bearing east seventy-nine chains, more or less, to the point of
commencement.

Melbourne, this twenty-third day of July, in the year
of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-
one, and in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's
reign.

I, William McCrea, being the medical officer in attendance on the execution of Henry Cooley, at the Gaol of Melbourne, do hereby certify and declare that I have this day witnessed the execution of the said Henry Cooley, at the said gaol; and I further certify and declare that the said Henry Cooley was, in pursuance of the sentence of the Supreme Court at Melbourne, hanged by the neck until his body was dead.

Given under my hand this eleventh day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, at the Gaol of Melbourne.

We do hereby testify and declare that we have this day been present when the extreme penalty of the law was carried into execution on the body of Henry Cooley, convicted at the Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court, held at Melbourne, on the twentieth day of May last, and sentenced to death, and that the said Henry Cooley was, in pursuance of the said sentence, hanged by the neck until his body was dead.

NOTE.—The figures in this and the succeeding Tables are given subject to revision, but it is not anticipated that any serious errors in the part of the collector will be found to have escaped detection. The great difference between the number of persons in ships, &c., in this and the preceding Census, it is to be recollected that a transfer has been made from the floating to the land population by the removal to Pentridge of the inmates of the penal hulks, numbering 616 in 1857.

Cause.—The Chinese are now so much more interpersed than formerly with the other inhabitants of the country, that their numbers are not readily abstracted; and it has not, therefore, been deemed advisable, on their account, to delay the publication of the present returns.

Area.—It will be observed that the area of the colony, as shown in this table, differs from the generally received computation which is given in the two preceding summaries. It is therefore necessary to remark that the calculation which has been specially made in this department for this return very nearly corresponds with Mr. Surveyor Skene's computation. It may likewise be noticed that there is also a small discrepancy between the addition of all the acres and all the square miles, resulting from fractional differences.

* The Rolls of Electors in the Castlemaine, Sandhurst, Wimmera, and Belfast Districts, have not been completed up to the period of compiling this return, there being in each case one of the electoral divisions not furnished. With regard to Belfast, the cause of incompleteness is that the Electoral District now comprises a portion of the municipality which was previously included within the Electoral District of Villiers and Heytesbury; an adjustment will therefore cause a decrease in the latter corresponding with the addition to the former.

MALMSBURY.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and ninety-three householders resident at and near Malsbury, in the counties of Dalhousie and Talbot, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that their locality is situated on the Main Mount Alexander road, and is fast rising in importance, being the centre of a large and increasing agricultural population.

That within the township boundary there are many large and substantial buildings, including stores, hotels, and steam flour-mills, breweries, and a large malting establishment all now in full operation, and moreover that some of the finest blue-stone quarries have been opened and are being extensively worked.

That roads, bridges, drains, and streets are required to facilitate the large and increasing local traffic, but no provision exists for these works.

They urge upon His Excellency the expediency of forming their locality into a municipal district, as tending greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government, and suggest the following boundaries for such district, viz.:- Commencing at a point in the south boundary line of the township of Malsbury where the said south boundary line of the said township of Malsbury is cut by the River Coliban; thence in a line bearing west about eighty-five chains to the south-west corner or angle of the said township of Malsbury; thence in a line at right angles to the last line, bearing north up the western boundary of the said township about one mile to the north-west corner or angle of the said township; thence in a line at right angles to the last line, bearing east about three miles and three-quarters to the north-east corner or angle of lot 23, parish of Edgcombe; thence in a line at right angles to the last line, bearing south, following a Government road one chain wide, about three-quarters of a mile to where the said Government road cuts the River Campaspe; thence following the centre of the said River Campaspe about three miles to the junction of the Boggy Creek; thence in a line bearing south-west about a quarter of a mile, running along the south-west boundary of lot 177, parish of Lauriston; to where the said line cuts the eastern boundary fence of the Melbourne, Mount Alexander, and Murray River railway; thence following the said eastern boundary fence of the said Melbourne, Mount Alexander, and Murray River railway, bearing north-westerly about three miles till the said western boundary line of the said Melbourne, Mount Alexander, and Murray River railway cuts the southern boundary line of allotment 290, parish of Lauriston; thence in a line bearing west about half a mile to the centre of the River Coliban; thence following the centre of the said River Coliban about a quarter of a mile home to the starting point."

And the petitioners pray as follows:-

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray your Excellency, that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality, under the name of 'The Municipal District of Malsbury,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

The petitioners state that the town of St. Arnaud is situate in the centre of the large mining division of the same name, and has been surveyed and sold in part about three years; that it contains a settled mining and trading population, that large sums are being invested in permanent buildings owing to the stability and progress of its mining companies, and that its population is steadily increasing.

They further state that four sales of land have taken place at St. Arnaud, whereto town lands realized £900 per acre, and suburban lands (most of which are under cultivation) from 50s. to £5 10s. per acre, and that notwithstanding the large sums paid to Government for lands, no provision has been made for roads, bridges, or approaches to the town, or within a distance of forty miles thereof, and that the heavy traffic through the town frequently renders the thoroughfares impassable.

The petitioners accordingly are of opinion that the erection of their locality into a municipality will greatly advance its interests and prosperity, and conduce to its permanent improvement and good government; and they suggest the following boundaries, viz.:-

Commencing at a point forty chains south of the south-east angle of the St. Arnaud town boundary; thence west one hundred and sixty chains; thence north forty chains; thence west forty chains; thence north two hundred chains; thence east

two hundred chains; thence south one hundred and twenty chains; thence east eighty chains; thence south twenty chains; thence by a line bearing north 71° 15' east one hundred and twenty chains; thence south sixty chains; thence south 71° 15' west two hundred and eight chains to the point of commencement.

And the petitioners pray as follows:-

"We, the undersigned householders and landowners resident within the area [above] set forth most respectfully pray your Excellency will cause the said area to be proclaimed a Municipal District in accordance with the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, under the style and title of 'The Municipality of Saint Arnaud.'"

MUNICIPALITY OF ST. KILDA.

BYE-LAW No. 32.—A BYE-LAW TO REPEAL BYE-LAW No. 7, AND TO MAKE OTHER REGULATIONS FOR BATHING ON THE SEA-COAST WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF ST. KILDA.

WHEREAS it has been deemed expedient by the municipal council of St. Kilda, in exercise and execution of the powers to them given by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, to repeal Bye-law No. 7, and to make other regulations for bathing on the sea-coast within the municipal district of St. Kilda: Be it therefore ordered and directed, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief, Bye-law No. 7 shall be and the same is hereby repealed, and that the following be substituted:—No person shall be allowed to use the beach of St. Kilda for the purpose of bathing (except within one or other of the bathing establishments now erected or hereafter to be erected) between two points, the one being three hundred yards north-west of the south-west corner of Fitz Roy street, and the other one hundred yards south-east of the bathing establishment known as the "Pavilion" or the Royal Pavilion, and which two points are defined by posts and boards erected by order of the council; and no person except children under ten years of age shall be allowed to use any other part of the beach within the said municipal district, for the purpose of bathing, between the hours of Eight o'clock in the morning and Seven o'clock in the evening of every day except Sunday, nor on Sunday after Nine o'clock in the morning; and any person or persons so offending shall on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

LEXTON PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE LEXTON GENERAL CEMETERY.

ALL charges must be paid to the treasurer when orders for interment are given, or when a grave or vault is to be opened.

2. Orders for interment must be given to the person in charge of the cemetery, between the hours of Ten a.m. and Five p.m.

3. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

4. The procession to arrive punctually at the cemetery.

5. The usual hours of interment will be from Ten a.m. to Four p.m.

6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced before two of the trustees that the relatives or friends of such person are unable to pay the costs and charges.

7. Applications for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery to be made to the trustees. A certificate of permission will be given to the persons applying on payment of the charges set forth in the schedule.

8. If required, the trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but when a brick grave or vault is required, it must be constructed under the directions of the trustees, or some person duly appointed by them; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault belonging to another person, the consent in writing of such person must be left with the order.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owner.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, granite, slate, or iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and a plan of every monument, must be submitted to the trustees for their approval. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

12. Wooden fences allowed, but if not kept in proper repair may be removed by order of the trustees without to the owner.

13. A plan of the cemetery and a registry will be kept, and may be inspected at the charge set forth in the schedule.

14. No person or servant employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

15. Any person wantonly or wilfully destroying, or doing or causing to be done any damage to, any monument, vault, tomb-

stone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, in the cemetery, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and, being convicted thereof, is liable to be punished as prescribed in the 14th section of the Act 17 Victoria No. 12.

16. No dogs will be allowed to enter the cemetery.
17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.
18. Three of the trustees to form a quorum.
19. No grave to be of less depth than six feet.

LEXTON DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

(Passed by the Board 3rd of June, A.D. 1861.)

1. *Business conducted with open doors.*—The business of the board shall be conducted with open doors.
2. *Quorum.*—The board shall commence business so soon after the time notified as there is a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum; but if at the expiry of half an hour from the time specified there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the board at the meeting.
3. Four members shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of the board, and if, at any day named for a meeting, such number shall not be present at the hour at which the business ought to be commenced, such fact, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute book by the secretary.
4. *Minutes of former meetings.*—The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.
5. *Correspondence, &c., to have precedence.*—At all meetings of the board (except otherwise provided by law), the readings of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions by members of the board, and bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of the regular business.
6. *Order of the day.*—The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the secretary previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration; and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they were given.
7. *Motions not to be proceeded with unless mover present.*—No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called on. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.
8. *Bye-laws.*—No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the board regularly convened; and every such bye-law shall, in the interim, remain open for the inspection of any of the ratepayers, in the office of the board, free of charge.
9. *Motions to be written and signed.*—Before any motion is put from the chair, in case the mover is not prepared with his motion in writing, the secretary shall take down the same in writing, and obtain signatures of the mover and the seconder.
10. *Call of board.*—It shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole board, for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting; and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each member of the board, by post, of the day for which the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration.
11. *Reports, how to be written.*—All reports sent in to the board by any member or members thereof, or by any officer of the board, shall be written on sheets of large foolscap paper, on one side only, a broad margin, being left, so that they can be properly bound together.

12. *Motion or amendment.*—Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

13. *Chairman to decide who speaks first.*—If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

14. *No member to speak twice.*—No member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed; and the chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the board, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment. After the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

15. *The chairman to decide point of order.*—The chairman, when called upon, to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule of precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment; and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final *pro hac vice* in each case.

16. *Chairman addressing board.*—The chairman shall stand up when addressing the board in discussion of any question.

17. *Particular words to be taken down.*—Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

18. *Production of documents.*—Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the board relating to the question or matter in discussion.

19. *Discussion of amendments.*—One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but not more.

20. *Adoption of amendments.*—Upon the adoption of any amendment by the board, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and for all purposes of subsequent discussion, the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

21. *Duty of chairman in voting.*—The chairman shall, on taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative; and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion, from the show of hands, as to which party has the majority.

22. *Voting.*—The board shall vote in all cases by a show of hands.

23. *Discussion on motion for adjournment.*—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board; but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

24. *Rescinding motion.*—Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, provided such protest is not inconsistent with the truth or disrespectful to the board; notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest, signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reason for protesting, must be entered before the next regular meeting of the board, by the protesting member in a book to be kept for that purpose in the secretary's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of the board; the same to be considered also a part of such minutes.

25. *Member may protest.*—No motion, the effect of which if carried would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the board, shall be entertained during the same year, unless a call of the whole board has been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board which shall have been negatived by the board shall again be entertained after the expiration of six months.

26. *Election of officers.*—A notice of motion may be dispensed with in cases of emergency where the board considers it necessary to do so, there being not more than one member absent during such board meeting.

27. *Cases of emergency.*—No election to any office at the disposal of the board shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

At a meeting of the Lexton District Road Board, held at the Board Room, Lexton, within the said district, on the third day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the foregoing bye-law was adopted, and was ordered to be forwarded to His Excellency the Governor for his approval, in accordance with the provisions Act of Council 16 Victoria No. 40, sec. 4.
