## NOTICE TO MARINERS.

**DANGEROUS ROCK OFF THE MOUTH OF THE RIVER GLENELG.**

IN May last, Mr. Walsh, master of the s. steamer *Ruby*, reported, that on his passage from this port to Port Macdonnell he had discovered a rock about four feet above water.

Notice is hereby given that the Harbor Master of Portland Bay has fixed the position of this danger, by triangulation from the shore, to be in lat. 38° 6' 45" S. and long. 140° 51' E., about three miles off shore, and about twelve (12) miles to the eastward of Cape Northumberland.

Commanders of vessels and others in possession of charts of the coast between Cape Bridgewater and Cape Nelson are recommended to mark this danger on their charts as the "Ruby" rock.

## MUNICIPAL EXEMPTION, EMERALD HILL.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the buildings herein-after mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Emerald Hill: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Emerald Hill the following premises, situated and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The Temperance Hall, erected on portion of block 34, Emerald Hill.

The St. Luke's Church School-house, erected on portion of block 8, Emerald Hill.

## THE NEW GAOL AT MARYBOROUGH.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better control and disposal of Offenders*, it was amongst other things enacted, that all buildings, erections, houses, and premises thereafter to be erected, built, purchased, enlarged, or maintained at the public expense, as and for public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments within the said colony, which should from time to time be proclaimed by the Lieutenant Governor of the said colony, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, as such public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, or penal establishments, should, from and after the publication of such notice, be severally deemed and taken to be the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments respectively of the place or district where the same are or shall be situated within the said colony, and should be subject to the several provisions made for the regulation, discipline, management, and care of the public gaols, prisons, houses of correction, and penal establishments already erected in the said colony, and of the prisoners confined within the same: And whereas certain buildings and premises have been constructed and built at Maryborough, and it is expedient to proclaim the same in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and direct that the buildings and premises at Maryborough aforesaid, recently constructed and built as and for a gaol, shall, from and after the first day of August now next ensuing, be deemed and taken to be a gaol, prison, and house of correction for the purposes and within the meaning of the said Act.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative* No. 113.—JULY 26, 1861.—2.

Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively: I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation abolish the polling places already appointed for the divisions of the North-Western Province, mentioned in the first column of the schedule hereunto annexed; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby appoint that the places mentioned in the second column of the said schedule shall be the polling places for the said divisions for the purpose of taking the poll at any contested election for the said province, and that all votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits referred to in the last column of the same schedule shall be taken at any election for such province at the polling places mentioned in the said second column opposite to the names of the respective divisions, that is to say:—

## SMYTHESDALE TOWN COMMON.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim that any Crown lands in the vicinity of any town shall be a Common for the use of the inhabitants of such town, and all the inhabitants of such town and its vicinity shall, from the time of such proclamation, be entitled to depasture their cattle and horses on such Common, and such Common shall be called a "Town Common;" and it is further enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, or, in case such Town Common shall be included within or adjoin the limits of any municipal district, then for the municipal council of such district, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for determining how many horses and cattle every such inhabitant shall be entitled to depasture on any Town Common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the Crown lands comprised within the area hereinafter described shall be a TOWN COMMON within the meaning of the said Act, subject to such rules and regulations as may be prescribed, for the use of the inhabitants of the town of Smythesdale, that is to say:—

TOWN COMMON FOR SMYTHESDALE, Parish of Haddon, County of Grenville.—Extent, about 3600 acres: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 12, parish of Haddon; bounded on the north by the main road from Carn-gham to Ballarat, bearing east about two and three-quarter miles to its intersection with the west boundary of A. McLachlan's pre-emptive section; on the east by part of the west boundary of this section and the west boundary of Smythesdale Gold Field Common together bearing south about one mile seventy chains to the north boundary of the township of Smythesdale; on the south by part of the north boundary of this township and a line together bearing west about two and three-quarter miles; and on the west by a line and road together bearing north about two miles fifty chains to commencing point.

## HAMILTON TOWN COMMON ALTERED.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of February in the present year, a certain area, therein described, was proclaimed to be a Town Common for the use of the inhabitants of the town of Hamilton: And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said common, and to proclaim another area in lieu thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the said common; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim that the Crown lands hereinafter mentioned shall be and constitute a Town Common for the use of the inhabitants of the said town of Hamilton, within the intent and meaning of the said Act, and subject to such rules and regulations as may be prescribed, that is to say:—

TOWN COMMON FOR HAMILTON, County of Dundas.—Extent, about 1200 acres: Commencing at a point bearing south one chain from the south-east angle of portion 5, section 22, parish of North Hamilton; bounded on the north by a road bearing west about one hundred and thirty-two chains seventy-five links; on the west by a line bearing south about ninety chains forty links; on the south by a road bearing east about one hundred and thirty-two chains seventy-five links; and on the east by a road bearing north about ninety chains thirty-nine links to commencing point.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of February in the present year, a certain area, therein described, was proclaimed to be a Town Common for the use of the inhabitants of the town of Gisborne: And whereas it is expedient to increase the said common by adding thereto the area hereinafter described: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be an addition to the Town Common for the use of the inhabitants of the said town of Gisborne, in like manner and to all intents and purposes as if the said additional area had been included within the area described in the said Proclamation, that is to say:—

THE ADDITION TO THE TOWN COMMON FOR GISBORNE.—The Police Paddock at Gisborne, County of Bourke, Parish of Gisborne, extent about 200 acres: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 9 of block 3, township of Gisborne; bounded on the south by a road bearing east about sixty-one chains; on the east by a line bearing north about forty-five chains; on the north by the western branch of the Saltwater River bearing westerly to a point bearing north fourteen chains from the south-east angle of allotment 9 aforesaid; and on the west by a line and allotment 9 together bearing south about fourteen chains to commencing point; exclusive of allotment 1A.

GOLD FIELDS COMMON AT SANDY CREEK, YACKANDANDAH DISTRICT.—Extent, about 1600 acres, exclusive of area used for mining: Commencing at a point about one chain south from T. Nevin's residence; thence southerly, along both banks of Sandy Creek at a distance of twenty chains for five miles up the same.

AT BORAM-BORAM, YALINDA, &c., County of Villiers.—Extent, about 4986 acres: Being portions 7, 8, 9, and 10 of section C; sections E and F; portions 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9 of section G; portions 7, 8, and 9 of section H; and section I; all of the parish of Lullithgow.—(G.L.D.2230.)

# PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

## MALMSBURY.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and ninety-three householders resident at and near Malmsbury, in the counties of Dalhousie and Talbot, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that their locality is situated on the Main Mount Alexander road, and is fast rising in importance, being the centre of a large and increasing agricultural population.

That within the township boundary there are many large and substantial buildings, including stores, hotels, and steam flour-mills, breweries, and a large malting establishment all now in full operation, and moreover that some of the finest blue-stone quarries have been opened and are being extensively worked.

That roads, bridges, drains, and streets are required to facilitate the large and increasing local traffic, but no provision exists for these works.

They urge upon His Excellency the expediency of forming their locality into a municipal district, as tending greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government, and suggest the following boundaries for such district, viz.:—"Commencing at a point in the south boundary line of the township of Malmsbury where the said south boundary line of the said township of Malmsbury is cut by the River Coliban; thence in a line bearing west about eighty-five chains to the south-west corner or angle of the said township of Malmsbury; thence in a line at right angles to the last line, bearing north up the western boundary of the said township about one mile to the north-west corner or angle of the said township; thence in a line at right angles to the last line, bearing east about three miles and three-quarters to the north-east corner or angle of lot 23, parish of Edgcombe; thence in a line at right angles to the last line bearing south, following a Government road one chain wide, about three-quarters of a mile to where the said Government road cuts the River Campaspe; thence following the centre of the said River Campaspe about three miles to the junction of the Boggy Creek; thence in a line bearing south-west about a quarter of a mile, running along the south-west boundary of lot 177, parish of Lauriston, to where the said line cuts the eastern boundary fence of the Melbourne, Mount Alexander, and Murray River railway; thence following the said eastern boundary fence of the said Melbourne, Mount Alexander, and Murray River railway, bearing north-westerly about three miles till the said western boundary line of the said Melbourne, Mount Alexander, and Murray River railway cuts the southern boundary line of allotment 290, parish of Lauriston; thence in a line bearing west about half a mile to the centre of the River Coliban; thence following the centre of the said River Coliban about a quarter of a mile home to the starting point."

The petitioners state that the town of St. Arnaud is situated in the centre of the large mining division of the same name, and has been surveyed and sold in part about three years; that it contains a settled mining and trading population, that large sums are being invested in permanent buildings owing to the stability and progress of its mining companies, and that its population is steadily increasing.

RETIREMENT BY ROTATION AND ELECTION.

At the end of this half-year, being the close of the fourth municipal year, the chairman, G. Clendinning, Esq., Councillors C. Dyte and S. J. Bradshaw, retired by rotation. The two first-named gentlemen were nominated for re-election, the latter withdrew. The election resulted in the re-election of Councillor C. Dyte, and the election of F. Young and J. Fussell, Esqrs., in the places of Councillors G. Clendinning and S. J. Bradshaw.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT—GRANTED.

The proclamation of a portion of the municipality as the township of Ballarat East.

The proclamation of thirty-seven additional streets within the municipality.

The reservation and proclamation of a piece of land for a cemetery, near the southern boundary of the municipality.

The reservation and proclamation of that piece of land lying between Block T, Main street, and the sludge channel, for a market and other purposes.

That the survey of the streets, rights-of-way, and reserves of the municipality may be proceeded with and completed.

For a carriage-crossing over the railway at Queen street, and a crossing for foot passengers between that and Victoria bridge.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT UNDER CONSIDERATION.

That the sludge channel, the inlet and outlet drains of the Main road, and the cutting of the Yarrowee Creek and tributary drains may be completed without more delay, and that a sufficient sum be placed on the estimates for that object.

That two crossings for drays, &c., be constructed over the railway line between the Victoria Bridge and Warneep Station.

That the police court may be completed, fitted up and fenced in, or that a certain sum may be appropriated to assist the municipal council to do so.

WORKS EXECUTED DURING THE HALF-YEAR.

Extending the water supply along Main street, from Esmond street to the Caledonian Bridge.

Fixing eight drinking fountains in Bridge and Main streets.

Making 11 chains 21 links of Creek street, Mount Pleasant.

Making 3 chains 63 links of Yarrowee street, Mount Pleasant.

Making one wooden culvert in Yarrowee street, Mount Pleasant.

Making 40 chains 75 links of Barkly street west.

Making four wooden culverts in Barkly street west.

Building a timber bridge, of 58 feet span, across the Yarrowee Creek at Mount Pleasant.

Constructing one pipe culvert in Grant street.

Making and fixing two lamp-posts in Eureka street, and repairing eight others in Main, Humffray, and Victoria streets.

Supplying and furnishing 2220 cubic yards of quartz and 915 cubic yards of tailings for maintenance of streets.

Maintaining and repairing 300 chains of roads and streets within the municipality.

Maintaining and repairing 177 chains of kerbed and planked footpaths.

Maintaining and repairing 1852 yards of water mains, branch-pipes, fire-cocks, &c.

Cutting catchwater drains, in conjunction with the Western Municipal Council, to increase the water in the Swamp.

WORKS IN PROGRESS OF EXECUTION.

Spreading 2220 cubic yards of quartz and 915 cubic yards tailings on the various streets of the municipality.

Filling, levelling, and gravelling the Peel street market.

Fixing weighbridge and toll-house in Peel street market.

MISCELLANEOUS SUBJECTS.

**Fire.**—The fire which in January last originated at the Montezuma Hotel, Main street, and destroyed upwards of sixty buildings, and damaged forty others, causing a loss of property estimated at £50,000, extending from the John O'Groat to the Union States Hotel, was the most disastrous that ever occurred in the district, notwithstanding every possible effort was made by the two fire brigades, assisted by the police, to extinguish it. The praise and thanks of the community are due to these bodies for their efficient services on that occasion, as the buildings on the opposite side of the street were certainly saved by their exertions, and the further extension of the fire prevented. It may be well to remark here, that it is the opinion of the council that the fire would not have extended southward from where it first broke out, had Eureka street been a chain wide, instead of thirty-three feet only; and to prevent such an evil in future, the site of the late Shakespere Hotel has been purchased by the council for the purpose of widening the street.

**Grant-in-aid.**—The sum placed on the estimates and voted by the Legislative Assembly for the current year, is considerably less than that of former years. The importance of this subject caused a conference of municipal delegates to be held in Melbourne, in February last, at which it was determined to urge upon the Government the necessity of permanently endowing municipalities, by means of grants of land to gradually supersede the present uncertain and objectionable mode, viz. by votes of money out of the general revenue. To effect this object, and likewise to cause other improvements in the laws by which municipalities are governed, measures were taken to prepare a bill to be brought before parliament without delay.

**Prison van.**—This council, in conjunction with the western council, have contracted for the supply of a van, which in a short time will be completed, when the practice of walking prisoners through the streets will be discontinued.

**Water supply.**—It having been determined by the two councils that each should pay towards the cost of all works in connexion with the Swamp, and the provision and management of supply in proportion to the revenue derived from each, under a uniform scale of charges, it was deemed advisable to lease the works of each for one year, from the 1st of January last, which was accordingly done.

**Peel street railway bridge.**—The council deems it necessary to inform the ratepayers in reference to this subject, that from the first a bridge was promised to be built over Peel street, and it learned with surprise that it was about to be erected some considerable distance of the line of that street to the eastward. A deputation was sent to the Government to represent the objections to such plan, and succeeded in having the intended site of the bridge altered to the line of the street. Some time after this, when the building of the bridge commenced, the council was again surprised and sorry to find that the span would only be 26 feet, as up to this time it was under the belief that it was intended to span the whole width of the street, not suspecting for one moment that it would have been thought advisable by the Government so to contract the width of the traffic way. The council, however, can only regret that the efforts made to cause the span of the bridge to be increased were unsuccessful.

**Watering the Main road.**—In consequence of the great traffic in this thoroughfare, and the dust which in the summer season is caused thereby, to the injury of property and inconvenience of the public, the council deemed it requisite to have it constantly watered in dry weather, intending to pay the cost of so doing by imposing a special rate on the property fronting the street, but find, on submitting a bye-law framed for this purpose for His Excellency's assent, that such is beyond the power of this council.
