THE BELFAST ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Officer then administering the Government, and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of August, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, the boundaries of "The Belfast Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable to alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth, the said Belfast Road District shall be and comprise so much of the counties of Villiers and Normanby as is included within the area hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the sea coast forty chains east of the mouth of the Fitz Roy river; thence northwards by the western boundary of Peyton and Mowbray's run to the run occupied by T. A. Brown; thence by part of the southern and by the western boundaries of the said run to the run occupied by R. and W. Jamieson; thence by the south-western and by the western boundaries of the runs occupied by R. and W. Jamieson, Samuel McGregor, John McKellar, and James Whyte's run, respectively, to the northern boundary of the said James Whyte's run; thence by the said northern boundary and by the northern boundary of John Mooney's run to Modin Napier; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the Mount Rouse road district to the western boundary of the township of Caramut; thence south and east by the western and southern boundaries of the township of Caramut to the centre of the Ararat and south-western sea-board road; thence south by the centre of the abovementioned road to the town reserve of Woolsthorpe; thence by the eastern boundary line of the said reserve and a line south to the northern boundary of portion 2, parish of Yarrturk; thence by the northern and eastern boundary of portion 2 and the eastern and southern boundary of portion 4 of the said parish to the north-west angle of portion 6 A of the said parish; thence by a line bearing south to portion 20 in the said parish; thence by part of the northern and western boundaries of the said portion to the Yangery Creek; thence by the Yangery Creek southwards to a bridge on the Woodford road; thence by that road westerly seventy-five chains twenty-five links, more or less; thence by a road due south to Rutledge's special survey, and by the boundary between the farms occupied by Pickering and Sloane and a line south to the sea coast; thence westerly by the sea coast to the commencing point—excepting the municipality of Belfast.

THE WARRNAMBOOL ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-fifth day of April, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, the boundaries of "The Warrnambool

Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable again to alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the description of the boundaries specified in the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the boundaries of the said Warrnambool Road District shall comprise so much of the counties of Villiers, Heytesbury, and Hampden as is contained within the area the boundaries whereof are hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the sea-coast due south of the boundary line between the farms occupied by Pickering and Sloane respectively, in the parish of Yangery, in the county of Villiers; thence by the coast line south-easterly to Curdie's Inlet, county of Heytesbury; thence northerly by Curdie's Creek to a point due south of the angle formed by Mount Emu Creek, where it changes from a southerly to a westerly direction; thence north to that angle; thence by Mount Emu Creek northerly to a point in the centre of the creek due east of the south-east angle of the parish of Glenormiston; thence west along the south boundaries of the parishes of Glenormiston, Kolora, and South Connemara, in the county of Hampden, to the centre of the Hopkins River; thence northerly by the centre line of the Hopkins River to a point where the centre of the Ararat and south-western sea-board road is cut by the county boundary of Hampden, in the township of Chatsworth; thence southwards by the centre of the abovementioned road to the northern boundary of the township of Caramut; thence by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the said township to the centre of the Ararat and south-western sea-board road; thence south by the centre of the said road to the town reserve of Woolsthorpe; thence by the eastern boundary line of the said reserve and a line south to the northern boundary of portion 2, parish of Yarrturk; thence by the northern and eastern boundary of portion 2 and the eastern and southern boundary of portion 4 of the said parish to the north-west angle of portion 6 A of the said parish; thence by a line bearing south to portion 20 in the said parish; thence by part of the northern and western boundaries of the said portion to the Yangery Creek; thence by the Yangery Creek southwards to a bridge on the Woodford road; thence by that road westerly seventy-five chains twenty-five links, more or less; thence by a road due south to Rutledge's special survey, and by the boundary between the farms occupied by Pickering and Sloane, and a line south, to the commencing point; excepting the municipality of Warrnambool.

HEATHCOTE GOLD FIELDS COMMON ENLARGED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted; that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, in the present year, a certain area, therein described under the designation of Heathcote, was proclaimed to be a gold fields common: And whereas it is expedient to increase the said common by adding thereto the area hereinafter described: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be an addition to the gold fields common described in the said Proclamation under the designation of Heathcote, for the use of all holders of miners' rights, business licenses, carriers' licenses, and other residents on the gold field situate at and near Heathcote aforesaid, in like manner and to all intents and purposes as if the said additional area had been included within the area described in the said Proclamation, that is to say:—

THE ADDITION TO THE GOLD FIELDS COMMON AT HEATHCOTE.—An area of about 9200 acres, county of Dalhousie, commencing at the south angle of Heathcote Gold Field Common, proclaimed on the 6th February, 1861: Bounded on the west and south by Wild Duck Creek bearing easterly, the Farmers' Common for Tooborac Major's line, and the north boundaries of allotments 52 and 51, parish of Tooborac, to McIvor Creek; on the north-east by this creek bearing north-westerly, and part of the Town Common for Heathcote, to east angle of Heathcote Gold Field Common aforesaid; and on the north-west by this common bearing south-westerly about 310 chains to commencing point, exclusive of all appropriated Crown lands within the beforementioned boundaries. Also,

commencing at a point on Mount Ida Creek, being the north-east angle of the addition to Heathcote Town Common, proclaimed on the 10th May, 1861: Bounded on the south-west by the north-east boundary of the addition aforesaid, bearing S. 24° 5' E. to the Dividing Range; thence by the Dividing Range including the sources of Mount Ida Creek to Mount Ida, and by a line bearing southerly to Mount Ida Creek in direction of the north angle of Heathcote township; thence by Mount Ida Creek bearing easterly about 1 mile to commencing point, as shown by plan deposited in the Office of the Department of Lands and Survey.

JONES'S CREEK GOLD FIELDS COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim that any Crown lands in the vicinity of any gold field shall be a common for the use of all holders of miners' rights, business licenses, and carriers' licenses, and other residents on such gold field, and every such holder or other resident shall, from the time of such proclamation, be entitled to depasture his horses and cattle on such common, subject to rules and regulations hereafter to be made, and such common shall be called a "Gold Fields Common," and it is also enacted, that it shall be lawful for the mining board of the mining district within which such Gold Fields Common shall be included, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for determining how many horses and cattle every holder of a miner's right, business license, or carrier's license, or other resident on a gold field, shall be entitled to depasture on any Gold Fields Common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the Crown lands in the vicinity of the gold field hereinafter mentioned, comprised within the area the description whereof is subjoined to the name of such gold field, shall (save and except the lands hereinafter declared to be a gold field) be a GOLD FIELDS COMMON within the meaning of the said Act, for the use of all holders of miners' rights, business licenses, carriers' licenses, and other residents on such gold field: And I do further proclaim, with the advice aforesaid, that the portions of Crown lands within such area; upon which mining or digging for gold is or shall be actually carried on now or at any time hereafter, shall be Gold Fields within the meaning of the said Act, and in the vicinity of which Gold Fields Commons may be proclaimed:—

JONES'S CREEK GOLD FIELD COMMON, Dunolly District. —Extent; about 480 acres: Commencing at a point bearing east 4° 45' south about sixty-seven chains from the south angle of allotment 2 of section 3 of the village allotments at Jones's Creek; thence south forty-eight chains through Allen's store; thence east one hundred chains, north forty-eight chains, and west one hundred chains, to the commencing point.

Indented Heads Road District, 21st June, 1861.—Be it ordered, that the new roads and the several alterations to existing roads, described and referred to in the *Government Gazette* of the 30th day of April, 1861, be opened to the public under the provisions of the 16th Victoria No. 40, § 33, and that the several amounts set down in the said *Gazette* as necessary expenses to be paid for opening and improving the said roads be accordingly paid if required.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT.

St. ARNAUD.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-eight householders and landowners resident at and near St. Arnaud, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that the town of St. Arnaud is situate in the centre of the large mining division of the same name, and has been surveyed and sold in part about three years; that it contains a settled mining and trading population, that large sums are being invested in permanent buildings owing to the stability and progress of its mining companies, and that its population is steadily increasing.

They further state that four sales of land have taken place at St. Arnaud, whereat town lands realized £300 per acre, and suburban lands (most of which are under cultivation) from 50s. to £5 10s. per acre, and that notwithstanding the large sums paid to Government for lands, no provision has been made for roads, bridges, or approaches to the town, or within a distance of forty miles thereof, and that the heavy traffic through the town frequently renders the thoroughfares impassable.

The petitioners accordingly are of opinion that the erection of their locality into a municipality will greatly advance its interests and prosperity, and conduce to its permanent improvement and good government; and they suggest the following boundaries, viz. —

Commencing at a point forty chains south of the south-east angle of the St. Arnaud town boundary; thence west one hundred and sixty chains; thence north forty chains; thence east forty chains; thence north two hundred chains; thence east two hundred chains; thence south one hundred and twenty chains; thence east eighty chains; thence south twenty chains; thence by a line bearing north 71° 15' east one hundred and twenty chains; thence south sixty chains; thence south 71° 15' west two hundred and eight chains to the point of commencement.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"We, the undersigned householders and landowners resident within the area [above] set forth most respectfully pray your Excellency will cause the said area to be proclaimed a Municipal District in accordance with the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, under the style and title of 'The Municipality of Saint Arnaud.'"

BET-BET DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

(Passed by the Board 2nd July, 1861.)

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

THE board meetings may at all times be attended by the ratepayers and inhabitants of the district, but no individual except the members will be allowed to take any part whatever in the business. Any person interrupting the proceedings shall be requested by the chairman to retire.

1. The regular meetings of the board shall be held at the office of the board, on the third Tuesday in each month, at Two o'clock p.m. The business to commence as soon as the quorum of three is present, but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of half an hour after the said time appointed for the meeting, the same shall be entered, with a note of the members present, in the minute book, and the meeting shall lapse.

2. Special meetings shall be summoned at any time by the secretary, upon receiving a written requisition signed by two members, stating the matter to be discussed at such meeting.

3. No special meeting shall be held unless the secretary shall have given to each member notice thereof by post, or otherwise, four clear days before such meeting.

4. The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board, in order to their confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

5. At all meetings of the board the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions by members of the board, and bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of the regular business.

6. Every petition or memorial addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and be presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

7. On the presentation of a petition or the bringing up of a report, no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given as hereinafter provided; and the only question that shall be entertained shall be, that the petition or report be received, and if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

8. If, in the report of a committee, there are distinct recommendations contained, such report shall not be adopted until the sense of the board has been taken separately on each.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion; such notice to be given, in writing, to the secretary at least ten clear days before the meeting of the board at which the same is to be taken into consideration; and the secretary shall give four clear days' notice thereof to members of the

board previous to the meeting; and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they were given.

10. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called on. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

11. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the board regularly convened; and every such bye-law shall, in the interim, remain open for the inspection of any of the ratepayers, at the office of the board, free of charge.

12. No motion in which it is proposed to take action on any petition, or in which it is proposed to adopt any address, bye-law, or standing order, shall be entertained unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such petition, bye-law, or standing order, and the mover of every such proposition shall be *pro hac vice* a member of such committee.

13. Before any motion is put from the chair, in case the mover is not prepared with his motion in writing, the secretary shall take down the same in writing, and obtain the signatures of the mover and seconder.

14. It shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole board, for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting; and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each member of the board, by post or otherwise, of the day for which the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

15. The presiding chairman's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

16. Every motion or amendment shall be entered in the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon, the votes shall be recorded; but no motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded. Any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the board by simply noticing that such is disobeyed.

17. Any member may, of right, require the production of any of the documents of the board relating to the question or matter in discussion.

18. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote; and upon any amendment being adopted by the board, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

19. All questions before the board shall be decided by open voting, unless the board resolve otherwise on any given subject.

20. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

21. The chairman shall, on taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative; and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to declare, from the show of hands, which party has the majority.

22. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the chairman, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the board.

23. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the board, shall be entertained during the same year, unless a call of the whole board has been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board which shall have been negatived by the board, shall be again entertained during the next six months.

24. No discussion will be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

25. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand up while addressing the board.

26. No member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed; and the chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the board, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment. After the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

27. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

ELECTIONS.

28. No election to any office at the disposal of the board shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement, in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

29. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the board shall be fixed in all cases before proceeding to the election.

30. The security that shall be accepted for any officer of the board shall be such as will be satisfactory to the board.

CONTRACTS.

31. All contracts shall be made by tender, advertised not less than twice in the two nearest local papers; each tender to be deposited in the tender box, addressed to the chairman, and such

tender or tenders only be opened at the time of their consideration by the board, when the contractor may also be present; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered in the minutes of the board; and when tenders are accepted, a contract bond shall be entered into and signed by the contractor and the chairman of the board, or in his absence by the then presiding chairman.

33. No member of the board shall be allowed to contract, directly or indirectly, or be received as security for any officer or contractor, nor shall any auditor or other officer become surety for any other employe of the member, or for any work to be done for the board; and if any member shall contract indirectly, satisfactory proof of the same being made to the board, the contract or contracts so made shall, on the motion of any member, be rescinded, and of no effect. In all cases where security shall be required, the expense of preparing the same shall be borne by the party giving the same.

34. The security in all cases of contracts shall be Twenty-five pounds per cent. upon the amount of the contract, paid over by the contractor to the chairman of the board, which amount shall be lodged in the bank with the other moneys of the board, and only repaid to the contractor when he attains his final certificate that the works under such contract are satisfactorily completed.

PAYMENT OF MONEYS.

35. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the chairman and one other member of the board, and countersigned by the secretary; and no such cheques shall be given unless they be passed at a regular meeting of the board.

LOCAL ASSESSMENT.

36. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due on the assessment roll; and in the event of any such amount not being paid to him, a notice shall be left stating that, unless the amount be paid to the collector before the expiration of seven days from the date of the notice, legal proceedings will be taken for its recovery.

37. The board may meet on such day as may be appointed after the completion of each annual assessment, to hear appeals against the same, after notice being given of the day for hearing such appeals.

38. The collector shall pay in all moneys collected by him to the credit of the board, in such bank as the board may direct.

39. The collector shall present his accounts at each meeting of the board.

40. Any one or more of the foregoing rules may be suspended *pro tem.*, in case of emergency, with the consent of the majority of the board.
