MINING OPERATIONS AUTHORISED UNDER THE QUARRY RESERVE, BALLAARAT WEST.

At the Government House, Melbourne, the twelfth day of August, 1861.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for amending the Laws relative to the Gold Fields*, it is amongst other things enacted, that nothing thereinbefore contained shall authorise the holders of miners' rights to occupy for mining purposes any Crown land which shall have been exempted by the Governor in Council from the operations of mining, or which shall have been applied to any public use or purpose, or be lawfully and *bona fide* used as a yard, garden, or orchard, or for any race or dam, or for any house, outhouse, shed, or other building, or to cut or remove from any such Crown land any trees growing thereon, or to cut or construct any race or dam through or upon any such Crown land; but nevertheless it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to authorise the holders of miners' rights to occupy under such miners' rights, and also to cut and construct races and dams for the purposes aforesaid, through or upon any Crown lands which may have been so exempted or applied as aforesaid, subject to such conditions and restrictions as the Governor in Council shall impose: And whereas certain persons associated together for the purpose of mining, and holding miners' rights, called and known by the name of the Western Quartz Mining Company, have applied for permission to prosecute mining operations for the purpose of following a certain lead within the area reserved for quarrying purposes near the Wendouree Swamp at Ballarat West: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order authorise the said associated miners, being holders of miners' rights, to prosecute mining operations for the purpose of following a certain lead within the area reserved for quarrying purposes near Wendouree Swamp, situate at Ballarat West, subject to the conditions and restrictions hereinafter prescribed, that is to say:—

1. The surface shall not be broken.
2. The drives shall be at a depth of not less than 330 feet.
3. All the operations of the company shall be open to the inspection of the warden, mining surveyor, or other authorised officer of the Government when deemed necessary by the Commissioner of Mines.
4. The permission hereby accorded shall be without prejudice to the existing rights (if any) of other persons.
5. All the drives and workings shall be supported by stone or timber in an effectual manner, and such other precautions shall be taken for preserving the surface of the ground as may be ordered by any authorised officer of the Government.

And the Honorable John Basson Humffray, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Mines for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

SPECIAL LICENSING DISTRICT.—LAND OCCUPIED FOR GOVERNMENT RAILWAYS, ETC.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the sale of fermented and spirituous liquors and of refreshments in certain districts*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, from time to time to proclaim any part or portion of the said colony to be a district subject to the provisions of the said Act, to be called a Special Licensing District, and to define the boundaries of such district: And whereas by two several Proclamations under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date respectively the fourth day of September, 1857, and the eighteenth day of June, 1860, the land occupied by the Geelong and Melbourne Railway Company, and the land occupied for the purposes of the Melbourne and River Murray Railway and the branch thereof terminating at Williamstown, together with the area constituting the municipal district of Williamstown, were proclaimed to be Special Licensing Districts: And whereas the Geelong and Melbourne Railway has been transferred to the Government: And whereas it is expedient to consolidate the said districts into a single district, and to include therein the land occupied for the purposes of the Geelong and Ballarat Railway: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the two several Proclamations hereinbefore mentioned; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare and proclaim that the parts or portions of Victoria hereinafter mentioned shall be and constitute a single Special Licensing District, subject to the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

The land occupied for the purposes of the Melbourne and River Murray Railway and the branch thereof terminating at Williamstown, together with the area constituting the municipal

pal district of Williamstown; and also the land occupied for the purposes of the Geelong and Melbourne Railway and the Geelong and Ballarat Railway.

THE STRATHFIELDSAYE ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the said colony hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say—

Commencing at the north-east corner of the Sandhurst municipality; thence east four hundred and ninety chains to the west boundary of the parish of Axedale; thence north one hundred and six chains to the north-west angle of allotment 10, section XI. of the said parish; thence east by the north boundary of the said parish to the north-east angle of the said parish; thence south by the eastern boundaries of the parishes of Axedale, Eppalock, and Lyell, to the Myrtle Creek; thence westerly by the Myrtle Creek to the south-west angle of the parish of Lyell; thence north to the south-east angle of the parish of Sedgwick; thence west by the southern boundary of the said parish to the south-east angle of the parish of Mandurang; thence by the southern and western boundary of the said parish and a line north-west to the south-east angle of the municipality of Sandhurst; thence by the east boundary of the said municipality to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Strathfieldsaye Road District."

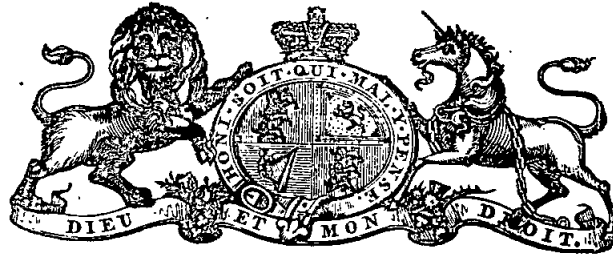

FIRST SESSION OF THE THIRD PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria, and (subject to the limitation in the said Act contained) such times for holding the first and every other session of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria, and to vary and alter the same respectively as he might think fit: And whereas it is expedient to fix the time for holding the next Session of the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly now called "The Parliament of Victoria:" Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do hereby, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested as aforesaid, appoint and proclaim that the First Session of the Third Parliament of Victoria shall commence and be holden for the despatch of business on Friday, the thirtieth day of August instant, at Twelve of the clock at noon, in the Parliament Houses, situate in Parliament Place, Spring Street, in the City of Melbourne: And the Members of the said Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly respectively are hereby required to give their attendance at the said time and place accordingly.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's Reign.
