REGULATION RESPECTING THE SELECTION OF ALLOTMENTS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time by proclamation to make any rules and regulations for the more fully carrying out the objects and purposes of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, make the regulation following, that is to say:—

If two or more persons apply simultaneously under the thirtieth section of the Act 21 Victoria No. 117, to select allotments not taken up on the previous day, it shall be determined by lot who shall select the land.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twelfth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

BOARD OF AGRICULTURE.

BYE-LAW.—[16th August, 1861.]

At a Meeting of the Board of Agriculture, holden at the offices of the Board, 131, Lonsdale street west, in the city of Melbourne, on the 16th day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, it is ordained as follows, that is to say:—

27. All societies entitled to the grant in aid of agricultural societies for the year 1861, shall receive such in proportion to their respective amounts of revenue until this revenue amounts to the sum of £500 in each case; such societies, however, as possess a revenue exceeding this sum, namely, £500, shall receive for the surplus half the rate of grant proportionate to the revenue, or, in other words, each Pound of revenue above £500 in each case shall rate as Ten shillings.

MUNICIPALITY OF MARYBOROUGH.

BYE-LAW No. 17.—FOR THE APPROPRIATION OF THE SECOND MOIETY OF THE GRANT-IN-AID FOR THE YEAR 1860.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is authorised to make bye-laws for the execution of any works by funds raised by aid from Government or otherwise: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Maryborough, that the sum of Two hundred and twenty-one pounds six shillings and five pence (£221 6s. 5d.), the amount of second instalment of grant-in-aid for the year 1860 received by the above council, be appropriated, more or less, as follows, viz.—1st, To the deepening and enlarging of the municipal dam; 2nd, The metalling of a portion of Nolan street and forming dish drain in same street.

MUNICIPALITY OF RICHMOND.

BYE-LAW No. 16.—A BYE-LAW FOR IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE CURRENT YEAR.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to impose a rate on all houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district, according to the fair average annual value thereof, such rate not to exceed the sum of Two shillings in the pound: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Richmond, that a rate of One shilling in the pound on the fair average value of all property in houses and land within the limits of the municipality be imposed and levied for the current year.

The alterations in the council have been the disqualification of Councillor Talbot through non-attendance, and election of Councillor Antill; the retirement of the latter gentleman, and

Councillors Herd and Powell, in rotation, at the annual election, and the election of Councillors Powell, Herd, and Benari.

Councillor Herd has been elected chairman for the year. As will be seen by the balance sheet, the council have been actively engaged in various works of an important and useful character; nor have they neglected the interests of the district in other respects.

The late chairman has, at the request of the council, proceeded to Melbourne on several matters.

The council regret that their endeavors to induce the Government to complete the bridge and repair the breakwater have not been successful.

Finding it necessary that to secure a common a portion of the district should be declared a township, sections 22 and 25, Barrabool, were selected, and gazetted on the 30th April as the "Township of Belmont."

On the 7th May, a common was proclaimed for the inhabitants, consisting of about 620 acres. This being far less than the quantity originally set apart, the council used all the exertions they could to obtain the other portion also, but without success. The half-yearly health reports have been prepared and forwarded.

The attention of the members of Parliament have been directed to several matters affecting the interest of the district.

Petitions on the District Councils Bill and Distillation, with a differential duty, were prepared and presented to the Assembly. Application was made to Government to have the reserve at Germantown, and the water reserve on the Barwon, vested in trustees, but the application was declined.

Considerable correspondence has taken place with the council of Newtown and Chilwell, in regard to a new bridge over the Barwon. This council, while not assisting, have expressed their intention not to oppose the erection of the bridge, provided the interests of this district in regard to the toll are protected.

A bye-law of rules, in regard to the common, has been adopted by the council, and forwarded to Government.
