WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time by proclamation to make any rules and regulations for the more fully carrying out the objects and purposes of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, make the regulation following, that is to say:—

If two or more persons apply simultaneously under the thirtieth section of the Act 21 Victoria No. 117, to select allotments not taken up on the previous day, it shall be determined by lot who shall select the land.

Considerable correspondence has taken place with the council of Newtown and Chilwell, in regard to a new bridge over the Barwon. This council, while not assisting, have expressed their intention not to oppose the erection of the bridge, provided the interests of this district in regard to the toll are protected. A bye-law of rules, in regard to the common, has been adopted by the council, and forwarded to Government.
