PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the county of Ripon hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-west angle of the township reserve of Crowland; thence in a direct line west to the eastern boundary of the road district of Stawell; thence south and west by the eastern and southern boundaries of the said district to the western boundary of the county of Ripon; thence south and east by the western and southern boundaries of the said county to a point where the electric telegraph line cuts the southern boundary of the said county; thence northerly by the electric telegraph line to the southern boundary of the Lexton road district; thence westerly and northerly by the southern and western boundary of the said Lexton road district to the commencing point; excepting the municipality of Ararat.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Ararat Road District."

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the said colony hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-western angle of the municipality of Sandhurst; thence by the western and northern boundary of the said municipality to the Bendigo Creek; thence northerly by the Bendigo Creek and the western boundary of the Campaspe Road District to the northern boundary of the parish of Huntley; thence by a line due west to the centre of the Loddon River; thence southerly by the centre of the Loddon River to a point opposite the south boundary of the parish of Laanacoorie; thence east by the south boundaries of the parishes of Laanacoorie and Shelbourne to the western boundary of the parish of Ravenswood; thence north by the aforesaid boundary to the south-west angle of the parish of Lockwood; thence east by the southern boundary of the said parish of Lockwood to the electric telegraph line to Sandhurst; thence northerly by the electric telegraph line to the south boundary of the Sandhurst municipality; thence westerly by the said boundary to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Marong Road District."

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the sixth day of July, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the boundaries of "The Upper Plenty Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable again to alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the description of the boundaries specified in the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the boundaries of the said Upper Plenty Road District shall comprise so much of the county of Bourke as is contained within the area the boundaries whereof are hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of Toorourong; and thence on the north by a line bearing east to the centre of the River Plenty; thence on the east by the centre line of the said River Plenty, bearing southerly to a point due east of the south boundary of section XXVIII. of the parish of Keelbundora; thence by the lastnamed boundary westwards to the centre of the Upper Plenty road; thence southerly by the centre of the Upper Plenty road to the north boundary of section X. of the lastnamed parish; thence eastwards to the north-west angle of section XI. of the said parish; thence south and west by the east and south boundaries of the aforesaid section X. to the centre of the Darebin Creek; thence south by the Darebin Creek to a point due east of the south-east angle of section CXXXVIII. of the parish of Jika-jika; thence west along the south boundary of the lastnamed section to the junction of the Epping and Upper Plenty roads; thence by a right line bearing east of north to the Darebin Creek, to the north-west corner of section X. in the parish of Keelbundora; thence northerly by the Darebin Creek to the north-west angle of section XXVII. of the said parish; thence east to the south-west angle of section II. in the parish of Morang; thence north by the west boundaries of sections II., VII., X., XV., XVIII. of the parish of Morang, sections II., VII., X., XV., XVIII. of the parish of Yan Yean, and II., VII., X. of the parish of Toorourong, to the north-west angle of the lastnamed section X.; thence west to the south-west angle of section XV. of the lastnamed parish; and thence north to the commencing point.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the county of Grenville hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point on the eastern shore of Lake Burrambeet, north-west of the south-west angle of portion 140, in the parish of Burrambeet; thence south-easterly by a portion of the south boundary of the Ballaarat road district to the north-west angle of the Buninyong road district; thence due south by the western boundary of the Buninyong road district to the south-west angle of the said district; thence by a line due west to the centre of the Little Woody Yalok Creek; thence southerly by the centre of the said creek to its confluence with the Woody Yalok Creek; thence northerly by the centre of the Woody Yalok Creek to the Upper Western road; thence by the Upper Western road north-westerly to the eastern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence north by the eastern boundary of the said county to a point in the centre of the Emu Creek, opposite the north-east angle of the said county; thence in a direct line north-easterly to a point eight miles south of the Burrambeet Creek, in a direct line with the eastern boundaries of sections XII., XI., and VIII. of the parish of Haddon; thence

north to the centre of Burrambeet Creek; thence westerly by the centre of the said creek to its junction with the Lake Burrambeet; thence northerly by the shores of the lake to the commencing point; excepting the municipality of Smythesdale.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Woody Yaloak Road District."

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the sixth day of July, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the boundaries of "The Greensborough Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable again to alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the description of the boundaries specified in the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the boundaries of the said Greensborough Road District shall comprise so much of the county of Evelyn as is contained within the area the boundaries whereof are hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Plenty, opposite the south boundary of section XXVIII. in the parish of Keelbundera; thence west to the centre of the Upper Plenty road; thence southerly by the centre of the said road to the north boundary of section X. in the said parish; thence east to the centre of River Plenty; thence northerly by the centre of the said river to the north-west angle of section III., parish of Nillumbik; thence east to the centre of Arthur's Creek; thence northerly by the centre of the said creek to its source; thence to the Great Dividing Range; thence north-westerly by the Great Dividing Range to the source of the River Plenty; thence by the centre of the said river southwards to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Officer then administering the Government, and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of September, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, the boundaries of "The Upper Yarra Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable to alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the said Upper Yarra Road District shall be and comprise so much of the county of Evelyn as is included within the area hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Mooroolbark; thence north by the western boundaries of the parishes of Mooroolbark and Yering to the centre of the River Yarra Yarra; thence easterly and southerly by the centre of the said river to the south-eastern angle of the parish of Gruyere; thence by the southern boundary of the parish of Gruyere and the eastern and southern boundary of the parish of Mooroolbark to the commencing point.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the counties of Grant and Grenville, hereinafter defined, shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

Commencing at a point in the centre of the junction of the Barwon and Moorabool Rivers; thence northerly by the centre line of the Moorabool River to the centre of a road which forms part of the northern boundary of portion 25, in the parish of Gheringhap; thence westerly by the centre line of the said road to its junction with the Geelong and Balaarat road; thence westerly by the centre of the Upper Western road, *via* Bannockburn and Teesdale, to the centre of the Yarrowee Creek; thence north-westerly by the centre of the said creek to the north-east angle of the parish of Lawaluk; thence due west to the centre of the Little Woody Yaloak Creek; thence southerly by the centre of the said creek to the centre of the Woody Yaloak River; thence by the centre of the Woody Yaloak southerly to the Cressy and Foxhow road; thence easterly by the said road through Cressy to the Geelong and Cressy road; thence easterly by the Geelong and Cressy road to the western boundary of the parish of Wingcel; thence south by the western boundaries of the parishes of Wingcel and Hesse to the north boundary of the parish of Warracharunah; thence east to the western boundary of the parish of Murdeduke; thence by the western boundary of Murdeduke northward to the centre of the Warrambine Creek; thence easterly by the centre of the Warrambine Creek to the centre of the Barwon River; thence easterly by the centre of the said river home to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Shelford Road District."

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, to proclaim, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, the roads in the said colony which should be and be deemed Main Roads under the provisions of the said Act: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighth day of October, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, the Main Central road, Gipps Land, was amongst other roads proclaimed to be a Main Road: And whereas it is expedient to amend the description of the said road: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the said road, and with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim that the road hereinafter described, situate in the district of Gipps Land, shall be and be deemed a Main Road within the meaning and under the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MAIN CENTRAL ROAD, GIPPS LAND:—Commencing at the Government wharf at Port Albert, and proceeding north-westerly by a road one chain wide through Port Albert to the southern boundary of the township of Palmerston; thence as a three chain road to the River Tarra Bridge; thence *via* Tarraville, Lilliesleaf, Woodside, Stradbroke, Longford, Sale, Stratford, Bairnsdale, and Sarsfield, to the Tambo.

FARMERS' COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a Common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common;" provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land in or near the localities hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for Farmers' Commons in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be FARMERS' COMMONS for the use of the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and also under and subject to such conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common as may be prescribed, that is to say:—

AT AVOCA, Parish of Avoca, County unnamed.—Extent, about 6600 acres: Commencing at the north-west angle of the Avoca Gold Field Common; bounded on the north by a line bearing west about two miles and three-quarters; on the west by a line bearing south about three miles and three-quarters; on the south by a line bearing east about two miles and three-quarters; and on the east by the Avoca Gold Field Common aforesaid, bearing north about three miles and three-quarters to commencing point.—(61.C.5925.)

AT CROXTON WEST, Parish of Croxton West, County of Normanby.—Extent, about 2600 acres: Being sections 1, 10, 11, allotments 1, 2, and 3 of section 13, and allotments 1, 2, and 3 of section 8.—(61.D.6783.)

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim that any Crown lands in the vicinity of any gold field shall be a common for the use of all holders of miners' rights, business licenses, and carriers' licenses, and other residents on such gold field, and every such holder or other resident shall, from the time of such proclamation, be entitled to depasture his horses and cattle on such common, subject to rules and regulations hereafter to be made, and such common shall be called a "Gold Fields Common;" and it is also enacted, that it shall be lawful for the mining board of the mining district within which such Gold Fields Common shall be included, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for determining how many horses and cattle every holder of a miner's right, business license, or carrier's license, or other resident on a gold field, shall be entitled to depasture on any Gold Fields Common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the Crown lands in the vicinity of the gold field hereinafter mentioned, comprised within the area the description whereof is subjoined to the name of such gold field, shall (save and except the lands hereinafter declared to be a gold field) be a GOLD FIELDS COMMON within the meaning of the said Act, for the use of all holders of miners' rights, business licenses, carriers' licenses, and other residents on such gold field: And I do further proclaim, with the advice aforesaid, that the portions of Crown lands within such area, upon which mining or digging for gold is or shall be actually carried on now or at any time hereafter, shall be Gold Fields

within the meaning of the said Act, and in the vicinity of which Gold Fields Commons may be proclaimed:—

GOLD FIELDS COMMON AT HEPBURN, Parishes of Franklin and Wombat, County of Talbot.—Extent, about 9000 acres: Commencing at the north-east angle of Daylesford Gold Field Common; bounded on the south by the north boundary of the same and a line bearing west, together about five and a quarter miles to Bullarook Creek; on the west by Bullarook Creek and part of the west boundary of the parish of Franklin, bearing northerly about three and three-quarter miles to south-west angle of Franklin Farmers' Common; on the north and east by Franklin and Glenlyon Farmers' Commons, bearing east about three miles and south-easterly about five miles to commencing point. Exclusive of any appropriated land within the beforementioned boundaries.—(61.D.6356.)

A decrease in the mortality of Melbourne and suburbs was announced in the report for June, and a further decrease took place in July, the returns for the latter showing only 265 deaths in 31 days, against 280 deaths in the 30 days of the former month. The comparison with the month of June, 1860, is more favorable still, as, in that month 319 deaths occurred, or 54 in excess of the month under notice. The returns for June, 1859, showed 251 deaths, but that mortality, compared with the then existing population, would be equivalent to 274 deaths compared with the population as ascertained by the recent census, or in other words, had the population of Melbourne and suburbs in July, 1859, been equal in number to its present inhabitants, the rate of mortality which then obtained would have produced 9 more deaths than actually occurred in July, 1861, so that in spite of the number of deaths being rather less, the comparison of July, 1859, with July, 1861, is still in favor of the latter month.

The mean height of the thermometer in the shade during the month was 46.6° against 50.5° for June, and against 47.3° for July, 1860. The days of highest and lowest temperature were the 2nd and the 24th, at 1 p.m., on the first of which days the thermometer stood at 59.6°, and from 5 to 6 a.m. on the latter day it stood at 31.8°, the range between the highest and lowest of the month thus being 27.8°. The greatest daily range was 22.4°, and the least 6.2°, the former on the 24th from a maximum of 54.2° to a minimum of 31.8°, and the latter on the 1st from a maximum of 57.2° to a minimum of 51.0°, the mean daily range being 12.61°. The greatest height reached by the barometer (30.246 in.) was at 10 a.m. on the 23rd, and the lowest point (29.346 in.) was at 3 p.m. on the 2nd, the range for the month thus being .9 in. The mean atmospheric pressure for the month was 29.859 in. against 30.114 in. for July, 1860.

The mean temperature, number of deaths, and daily average of mortality, for the first four weeks in July, were as follow:—

The 265 deaths which occurred during the month were divided as to sexes in about the average proportions as follow:—Males, 151 or 57 per cent.; females, 114 or 43 per cent. For the first time since August, 1860, the number of deaths of persons of five years old and upwards exceeded those of children under the age of five years, 133 of the former having died to 132 of the latter. It has been remarked in previous reports that for several months past the deaths of young children have been declining in their proportions to the total, whilst those of older children and adults have been increasing in the same ratio; in the month under review the latter have at length outnumbered the former by one death.

Eighteen deaths occurred on the 26th, on no other day during the month does a higher number than 13 appear in the returns.

Three octogenarians were carried off during the month, one at 87 and two at 83 years of age; one death also occurred at the age of 79 years, one at 76, and another at 75. These old persons were all males.

Thirty-eight deaths, or about a seventh of the total mortality of the month, occurred in public institutions, apportioned as follows:—Melbourne Hospital, 23; Benevolent Asylum, 5; Lying-in Hospital, 1; Immigrants' Home, 2; Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, 4; Melbourne Gaol, 1; Western Gaol, 2.

The following table shows the number of persons of all ages at the time of the recent census, the number of deaths of persons under and over five years of age, the total at all ages, and the number of deaths to every 1000 of the population during the month of July, in the Statistical District of Melbourne and suburbs, and in each of the sub-districts of which it is composed:—

The above returns, on being compared with those of the previous month, show zymotic diseases to be again on the increase in their proportion to the deaths generally, as 34.34 per cent. of the deaths were caused by them in July, against 32.14 per cent. in June. Deaths from scarlatina, however, decreased from 53 to 41, and those from whooping-cough from 7 to 4; but deaths from diphtheria, measles, croup, typhus, and dysentery, all show a slight increase. In July, 1860, the deaths from zymotic diseases amounted to 34 per cent. of the total, or the same proportion within a fraction as is shown in the above table.

Reviewing the different classes of sporadic diseases from which deaths resulted during the month of July, it is found that those of the nervous system and digestive organs, although in common with the deaths generally they showed a slight decrease in their actual numbers as compared with the previous month, they remained with their proportions to the total unaltered; but diseases of uncertain seat increased from 31 to 39 and from 11.07 to 14.72 per cent. of the total, whilst those of the respiratory system decreased from 56 to 48 in numbers and from 20 per cent. of the total to 18.11 per cent.; diseases of the circulatory system and those of the generative organs also showed a decrease, both of those classes having been above the average in June.

The alterations in the council have been the disqualification of Councillor Talbot through non-attendance, and election of Councillor Antill; the retirement of the latter gentleman, and Councillors Herd and Powell, in rotation, at the annual election, and the election of Councillors Powell, Herd, and Benari.

Councillor Herd has been elected chairman for the year.

As will be seen by the balance sheet, the council have been actively engaged in various works of an important and useful character; nor have they neglected the interests of the district in other respects.

The late chairman has, at the request of the council, proceeded to Melbourne on several matters.

The council regret that their endeavors to induce the Government to complete the bridge and repair the breakwater have not been successful.

Finding it necessary that to secure a common portion of the district should be declared a township, sections 22 and 25, Barrabool, were selected, and gazetted on the 30th April as the "Township of Behnont."

On the 7th May, a common was proclaimed for the inhabitants, consisting of about 620 acres. This being far less than the quantity originally set apart, the council used all the exertions they could to obtain the other portion also, but without success.

The half-yearly health reports have been prepared and forwarded.

The attention of the members of Parliament have been directed to several matters affecting the interest of the district.

Petitions on the District Councils Bill and Distillation, with a differential duty, were prepared and presented to the Assembly.

Application was made to Government to have the reserve at Gernantown, and the water reserve on the Barwon, vested in trustees, but the application was declined.

Considerable correspondence has taken place with the council of Newtown and Chilwell, in regard to a new bridge over the Barwon. This council, while not assisting, have expressed their intention not to oppose the erection of the bridge, provided the interests of this district in regard to the toll are protected.

A bye-law of rules, in regard to the common, has been adopted by the council, and forwarded to Government.
