No. 119.—An Act to repeal certain clauses of the "*Customs Act, 1857*," and to substitute others in lieu thereof. [Passed 18th September, 1860.]

BELVOIR TOWN COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS in an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim that any Crown lands in the vicinity of any town shall be a Common for the use of the inhabitants of such town, and all the inhabitants of such town and its vicinity shall, from the time of such proclamation, be entitled to depasture their cattle and horses on such Common, and such Common shall be called a "Town Common;" and it is further enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, or, in case such Town Common shall be included within or adjoin the limits of any municipal district, then for the municipal council of such district, with the consent of the Governor in Council, to make rules and regulations for determining how many horses and cattle every such inhabitant shall be entitled to depasture on any Town Common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the Crown lands comprised within the area hereinafter described shall be a Town Common within the meaning of the said Act, for the use of the inhabitants of the town of Belvoir, that is to say:—

TOWN COMMON FOR BELVOIR, Murray River.—Available extent, about 360 acres: Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 5 of section 15, country lands, parish of Belvoir: bounded on the west by a line bearing north about one hundred and seventy-three chains to the Murray River; on the north by the Murray River, bearing easterly to the north-west angle of the township of Belvoir; on the east by part of the west boundary of this township, bearing south about one hundred and forty-six chains; and on the south by the south boundary of allotment 5 aforesaid, bearing west twenty-six chains twenty-eight links to commencing point.—(61.D.3926.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this second day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

For a portion of the vote for enclosing and improving park lands for botanic gardens.—£100 granted for fencing only.

For an exchange of land for the site of the intended botanic gardens.—Granted.

For our proportion of the vote for the supply of the gold fields and towns with water, to aid in the construction of a reservoir. Our fair share promised.

For confirmation and proclamation in *Gazette* of bye-law No. 24.—Granted.

For the remaining instalment of the grant in aid of municipalities for 1861.—Not yet passed for payment.

For the confirmation of a new and more liberal rule and regulation for the town common, fixing the number of horses and cattle to be depastured thereon by each inhabitant at six.—Acknowledged, but not yet confirmed.

THE FIRE ENGINE.

As our fire engine had long remained useless for want of suction hose of the proper size, which could not be procured in the colony, we had a sufficient quantity wired and prepared for it by Messrs. Fulton and Co., of Melbourne. The engine was repaired and put into complete working order, and an efficient volunteer fire brigade has been enrolled, and a good furnishment ordered for their equipment, towards the cost of which the Melbourne fire insurance companies have handsomely subscribed £15, this council agreeing to provide any balance that may be required to complete the same; and they have handed over the engine, &c., solely to the care and management of the brigade, and provided a man to keep the engine and equipment in repair and efficient working order; and the brigade are now prepared to act should any fire unfortunately occur.

THE WEIGHBRIDGE.

Has been removed, re-erected, adjusted, and put into efficient working order, and has been rented by tender for the term of one year, for the sum of £24.

WATER WORKS.

The council intend to proceed with the construction of a reservoir as soon as they have received the grant-in-aid for the purpose; and they propose to carry out a scheme for supplying the town with water commensurate with the means at their disposal.

PUBLIC OR BOTANICAL GARDENS.

A suitable site has been granted by the Government, and as soon as the £100 granted to aid in fencing in the same is received, means will be taken to fence the gardens, which are much wanted as a place for public recreation for the use of the inhabitants.
