POLLING PLACES FOR CERTAIN ELECTORAL DISTRICTS ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of an Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the nineteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act to provide for the Election of Members to serve in the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Victoria respectively*: I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation abolish the polling places already appointed for the divisions of the electoral districts mentioned in the schedule hereunto annexed; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby appoint that the places mentioned in the third column of the said schedule shall be the polling places of the said divisions for the purpose of taking the poll at any contested elections for the said districts, and that all votes in respect of qualifications within the boundaries and limits of each of the said divisions shall be taken at any elections for such districts respectively at the polling place or polling places mentioned in the said third column, that is to say:—

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SMYTHESDALE.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the municipal district of Smythesdale shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

LANDS TO BE PERMANENTLY RESERVED.

IT is hereby notified, in pursuance of the 4th section of the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, that, upon the expiration of one month from the date hereof, it is the intention of the Governor in Council to permanently reserve from sale the lands hereinafter described for the several purposes specified in connection with each description.

The temporary reservation of such of the said lands as have been temporarily reserved will from thenceforth be revoked.

ARARAT—THE OLD BURIAL GROUND, IN THE TOWNSHIP OF ARARAT, PARISH OF ARARAT, AND COUNTY OF RIPON (pursuant to Order in Council of 12th August, 1861).—Two acres one rood thirty-five perches: Commencing at the south-east angle, bearing from the north-west angle of the hospital reserve S. 0° 16' W. twenty-seven links; thence S. 73° 5' W. five chains forty links; thence S. 23° 19' E. four chains thirty-eight links; bounded on the east by a line bearing N. 1° 30' W. four chains eighty links; thence on the north by a line bearing S. 88° 30' W. five chains fifteen links; thence on the west by a line bearing S. 1° 30' E. four chains eighty links; thence on the south by a line bearing N. 88° 30' E. five chains fifteen links to the point of commencement.—(61.D.6653.)

MUNICIPALITY OF NEWTOWN AND CHILWELL.

BYE-LAW No. 25.—EMPOWERING THE COUNCIL TO ESTABLISH A PUBLIC LIBRARY, BOTANICAL GARDENS, OR MUSEUM, WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT, AND TO EXPEND MONEYS TOWARDS THE MAINTENANCE AND MANAGEMENT THEREOF.

WHEREAS by the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, power is given for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the establishment of public libraries, museums, and botanical gardens, and the maintenance and management thereof: And whereas it is deemed advisable by the municipal council of Newtown and Chilwell to make such a bye-law: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the said council, that from and after the date of this bye-law coming into operation, the said council may, when and so soon as they think fit, establish a public library, a museum, and a botanical garden, or any of them, within the municipal district, and may, from time to time, pay and expend out of the rates, tolls, dues, or other funds at the disposal of the council, such a sum or sums as the council may deem expedient or necessary for or towards the maintenance and management of any such public library, museum, or botanical garden to be established by the said council.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF LICENSED SURVEYORS.

THE Board of Land and Works has approved of the following Instructions for the guidance of Licensed Surveyors when marking out allotments for applicants for the occupation of unsurveyed country lands under residence and cultivation licenses:—

Manner in which boundary lines are to be marked.—The boundary lines of any allotment consisting of country lands not already comprised in a Government survey, must be defined by a licensed surveyor on the ground by stakes, trenches, and marked trees, in the manner prescribed in the general specification for contract surveying.

Connection with existing surveys.—The position of such allotment with reference to existing Government surveys must be determined by a careful and well checked traverse, made with the aid of a theodolite and chain, and connecting one of the corners of the allotment with the nearest fixed point in the Government surveys.

Preparation of plan.—A plan of the allotment must be drawn to a scale of four inches to a mile, showing the lengths and bearings of the boundary lines of the allotment, its area, and its topographical features; also, the lengths and bearings of the connecting traverse lines.

Fees to be paid to licensed surveyors, by applicants, for survey and plan.—The maximum scale of charges which a licensed surveyor is authorised to exact from any person who may

employ him to make the survey and supply the plan of an allotment, for the occupation of which, under a residence and cultivation license, application is intended to be made, is as follows:—

Licensed surveyor to correct defective survey without additional fee.—Should any application for a residence and cultivation license be not entertained by the Board of Land and Works, owing to the insufficiency of the survey and plan made by the licensed surveyor, he will be expected to supply the deficient information or make the required correction without further cost to his employer, on pain of the cancellation of his certificate.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT.

MOONAMBEL.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-four householders resident at Moonambel, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state the township of Moonambel is the centre of an extensive mining district; that it contains upwards of three hundred resident householders, and that the dwellings are of a substantial character and have been erected at considerable expense, but no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets, which are consequently nearly impassable, and heavy merchandise, &c., has to be carried over them at great risk and expense.

They are therefore of opinion that the formation of the township into a Municipal District will tend greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government, and suggest the following boundaries for such district, viz.:—From the south-west angle of McKinnon's pre-emptive right to a point bearing south half a mile; thence by a line bearing west three miles; thence by a line bearing north two miles; thence by a line bearing east three miles; and thence by a line bearing south one mile and a half to the starting point.

And the petitioners pray as follows:—

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the district as above defined may be proclaimed a Municipality, under the name of 'The Municipal District of Moonambel,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

CARNGHAM DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

[Passed by the Board, 8th August, 1861.]

BYE-LAWS.

THE business of the board shall be conducted with open doors.

2. The board shall commence business as soon after the time stated in the circular as there is a sufficient number of members present to constitute a quorum; but if at the expiring of half an hour from the time specified in the circular there is not a quorum present, the meeting shall stand adjourned to that day week.

3. Five members shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of the board, and if at any named for a meeting such member shall not be present at the hour at which the business ought to be commenced, such fact, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute book by the secretary.

4. The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon except as to their accuracy as a record of their proceedings.

5. At all meetings of the board, the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions by members of the board, and bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of the regular business.

6. Every petition or memorial addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and be presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

7. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon, and the only question that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that the petition be received and taken into consideration after the orders of the day, or at any future meeting, or, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

8. That no report of a committee shall be considered or adopted on its presentation, but shall be read and received *pro forma*, to be taken into consideration after the orders of the day, or at some future meeting.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration; any member of the board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the secretary at least three clear days previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration, and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they were given.

10. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

11. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the board regularly convened, and every such bye-law shall, in the interim, remain open for the inspection of any of the ratepayers, in the office of the board, free of charge.

12. No motion proposing any petition, address, bye-law, or standing order, shall be entertained unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such petition, bye-law, or standing order.

13. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall be a member of such committee, and to attend its meetings.

14. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or amendment, or of discussing any matter under consideration, must rise and address the chairman, and no member shall be interrupted when speaking, unless called to order, when he shall sit down, in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the subject is resumed or any other subject entered upon.

15. Before any motion is put from the chair, in case the mover is not prepared with his motion in writing, the secretary shall take down the same in writing, and obtain signatures of the mover and seconder.

16. It shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole board, for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting; and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each member of the board, by post, of the day for which the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration.

17. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded; any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the board by simply noticing that such is disobeyed.

SANDHURST STREETS.

18. On any motion being put from the chair, the secretary shall enter in the minute book the names of the members who voted for or against the motion so put from the chair.

19. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

20. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

21. No member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or the mover of the amendment last proposed; and the chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the board, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment; after the reply, the amendment, or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

22. No member shall digress from the subject-matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to others; and all personal reflections upon any member shall be considered as highly disorderly; and the member making use of such offensive expressions and not explaining or retracting the same, or offering an apology for the use thereof to the satisfaction of the board, shall not be allowed to hold his seat, or vote on any question before the board until the offensive words shall have been retracted by him, and an apology rendered to the satisfaction of the board.

23. The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule of precedent applicable to the case without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final in each case.

24. The chairman shall stand up when addressing the board in discussion of any question.

25. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

26. Any member may of right require the production of any of the documents of the board relating to the question or matter in discussion.

27. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but, upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but no more.

28. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the board, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and for all purposes of subsequent discussion, the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

29. The chairman shall, on taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative, and next in the negative; and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion, from the show of hands, as to which party has the majority.

30. The board shall vote in all cases by show of hands.

31. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

32. Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, provided such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the board; notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest, signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reason for protesting, must be entered before the next regular meeting of the board, by the protesting member, in a book kept for that purpose in the secretary's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of the board, the same to be considered also a part of such minutes.

33. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the board, shall be entertained during the same year, unless a call of the whole board has been duly made for that purpose.

34. That the standing orders may at any time be suspended by a two-third vote of the members present.

At a meeting held at the Carngham District Road Board Room, within the said district, on the 8th day of August, 1861, the foregoing bye-law was adopted, and was ordered to be forwarded to His Excellency the Governor for his approval, in accordance with provisions of Act of Council 16 Victoria No. 40, section 14.
