LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.—SESSION 1861.

CASTLEMAINE ELECTION.

I HEREBY notify that there was presented to me on Friday, the thirteenth day of September instant, a Petition of which the following is a true copy.

The Petition of ROBERT BRAITHWAITE TUCKER, of
Malsbury, in the county of Talbot, in the colony of
Victoria, Esquire,

RESPECTFULLY SHEWETH—

1. That His Excellency Sir Henry Barkly, K.C.B., Governor of Victoria, did, on or about the 16th day of July, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, issue according to law, under his hand and the seal of the colony, a writ, directed to David Mackay, Esquire, returning officer for the electoral district of Castlemaine, requiring him, the said David Mackay, to proceed as therein directed according to law for the purpose of procuring the return of three members for the said electoral district to serve in the Legislative Assembly of Victoria.

2. That in accordance with the exigency of the said writ the said returning officer duly convened a meeting of the electors of the said district for the purpose of nominating candidates and otherwise proceeding to such election.

3. That such meeting was duly held on the fifth day of August last past, at Castlemaine, and that there were nominated and proposed as candidates thereat the Honorable Vincent Pyke, Esquire; Alexander John Smith, Esquire; the Honorable John Macadam, Esquire; John Joseph Walsh, Esquire; James

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Chapman, Esquire; and certain other persons whose names are not material to this petition.

4. That after a show of hands had been called for by the returning officer, and after the persons upon whom the election had thereby fallen had been by him declared, a poll was then and there demanded in due form, according to law, by or on behalf of certain other candidates, and such poll was duly taken on the day and in the places specified in the said writ.

5. That your petitioner is an elector of the said district, and voted at the said election.

6. That on or about the twelfth day of August the said returning officer openly declared that the general state of the poll, at the close of the polling, as made up by him, was as follows (that is to say):—

Vincent Pyke polled votes	...	1893
A. J. Smith	"	1066
John Macadam	"	1938
John Joseph Walsh	"	790
James Chapman	"	1187

7. That accordingly the said returning officer publicly declared that the said John Macadam, Vincent Pyke, and James Chapman were duly elected as members to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the electoral district of Castlemaine.

8. That your petitioner believes and is prepared to prove that the aforesaid James Chapman, at the time of the said election, was an uncertificated insolvent, and was therefore not capable of being elected a member of the Legislative Assembly.

Your petitioner therefore respectfully prays—

1. That you will, as soon as conveniently may be, lay this petition before the Legislative Assembly.

2. That the Legislative Assembly will be pleased to refer the same to "The Committee of Elections and Qualifications," either forthwith or as soon as the said committee has been duly appointed and confirmed.

3. That when such reference has been made, "The Committee of Elections and Qualifications" will determine and report to the Assembly that the said James Chapman was not duly elected, and that the said Alexander John Smith was duly elected as a member to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the said electoral district of Castlemaine.

4. That thereupon the said Alexander John Smith may be sworn as a member of the said Assembly, and may take his seat therein accordingly.

5. That your petitioner may have such further and other relief as the nature of the case requires.

And your petitioner will ever pray.

ADDITIONAL RULES OF THE PILOT BOARD.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has approved of the following rules and regulations, which have been made by the Pilot Board in conformity with the 12th section of the Act 17 Victoria No. 28, being added to the regulations sanctioned and published in the *Government Gazette*, page 1710, by notice dated 7th September, 1857, and page 974, by notice dated 6th May, 1859.

48. The executive duties of the Pilot Board shall be performed by the secretary, who, in all cases of doubt, must apply for instructions to the president, or in his absence to a member of the board.

49. The secretary will have all documents and papers under his charge; he will make out all accounts and keep the books in such form, as may be prescribed by the board, and place the cash and bank books and exemption certificate account upon the table for inspection every board day.

50. All moneys received under the Act shall be paid daily by the secretary into such bank as the board may from time to time determine.

51. All payments duly authorised by the board shall be made by cheque signed by the president (or acting chairman) and one member of the board, who shall also compare them with the blocks, see that they correspond, and initial the latter; and the amounts of all such payments shall be entered in the minutes of the proceedings, as also the cash balance at the bank on that day.

52. All debentures, deeds, or money securities shall be deposited by the secretary, in the name of the Pilot Board of Victoria, in such bank as the board may from time to time determine.

53. No debenture or money security shall be withdrawn from the bank without a written order addressed to the manager of the bank, and signed by the president and one member of the board.

54. The board shall, at the first meeting after every quarter, audit and verify the books and cash balances at the bank.

The petitioners state the township of Moonambel is the centre of an extensive mining district; that it contains upwards of three hundred resident householders, and that the dwellings are of a substantial character and have been erected at considerable expense, but no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets, which are consequently nearly impassable, and heavy merchandise, &c., has to be carried over them at great risk and expence.

They are therefore of opinion that the formation of the township into a Municipal District will tend greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government, and suggest the following boundaries for such district, viz.—From the south-west angle of McKinnon's pre-emptive right to a point bearing south half a mile; thence by a line bearing west three miles; thence by a line bearing north two miles; thence by a line bearing east three miles; and thence by a line bearing south one mile and a half to the starting point.

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the district as above defined may be proclaimed a Municipality, under the name of 'The Municipal District of Moonambel,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

The following applications were made to Government, the results being as under, viz.:

1. For pitched crossings to be formed to the Post Office, Harbor Yard, and road leading alongside of it.—Acceded to.
2. For similar crossings to be formed in Osborne street, leading to the residence of Captain Norman and Mr. Woods.—Refused.
3. To the Surveyor General, forwarding a tracing of the land selected for a town common, and requesting that it might be gazetted for such purpose.—A town common has been proclaimed, but not exactly in accordance with the tracing forwarded.
4. To the Chief Secretary, requesting that certain private streets dedicated by Captain Ferguson and Dr. Wilkins might be gazetted as public thoroughfares.—Complied with.

6. To the Postmaster General, requesting that a second letter carrier might be appointed for this district.—Acceded to.
7. To the Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works, requesting that a quantity of gravel similar to that used in making the footpaths at the railway station might be delivered free of charge at the North Williamstown Railway station, for the purpose of repairing the footpath in Ferguson street.—Refused.

8. To the Honorable the Treasurer, requesting that the pound might be removed to the village reserve on the Kororoit Creek adjoining the Guiding Star.—Acceded to.

9. To the Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works, requesting that the goods traffic on the Victorian railways might be leased to private individuals.—Reply received, "that it was not the intention of the Government at present to entertain such a proposal."

DEPUTATION.

A deputation, consisting of the chairman, and Councillors Mason and La Roche, introduced by the Honorable George Verdon, waited upon the Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works, having reference to the extension of the Yan Yean water to this town.

The Commissioner in reply, stated, "that the pipes which were then on hand should be laid along the line forthwith, and others ordered immediately to complete the work."
