RESIDENCE AND CULTIVATION LICENSES FOR THE OCCUPATION OF COUNTRY LANDS.

REFERRING to the "General directions relative to applications for Licenses to occupy Country Lands already surveyed," published in the Government Gazette of the 28th August, 1861: It is hereby notified, that the following medifications in respect to applications for licenses to occupy such surveyed lands have been adopted by the Board of Land and Works; and the general directions under this head, published on the date before mentioned, are hereby cancelled accordingly.

GENERAL DIRECTIONS RELATIVE TO APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSES TO OCCUPY COUNTRY LANDS ALBEADY SUR-

Persons desirous of occupying, for residence and cultivation, portions of country lands already surveyed, must specify in their applications the number, area, and position of the allotment they wish to hold, and forward with their applications (to be made in the form of the first schedule herewith) a declaration in the form of the second schedule herewith, and also a plan of the survey in which such land is included.

Applications must be limited to one surveyed allotment, and no licenses will be issued for the occupation of any less area of country lands than forty (40) acres, or greater than one hundred and sixty (160) acres.

Should a surveyed allotment contain more than one hundred and sixty (160) acres but less than three hundred and twenty (320) acres, the half of the allotment may be applied for; but should the allotment contain more than three hundred and twenty (320) acres, a portion thereof containing not less than forty (40) acres and not more than one hundred and sixty (160) acres may be applied for: Provided that the boundaries of such portion be duly marked out on the ground at the cost of the applicant by a licensed surveyor holding a certificate of competency from the board of examiners.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the inieteenth day of August now last passed, the boundaries of "The Greensborough Road District" were altered as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to amend the description of the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the description of the boundaries specified in the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the boundaries of the said Greensborough Road District shall comprise the area the boundaries whereof are hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

RESPECTFULLY SHEWETH—
That under and in pursuance of the Act of the local legislature of the said colony of Victoria, known as "The Electoral Act of 1856," an election for the return of two properly qualified persons to serve as members of the Legislative Assembly of the said colony, for the electoral district of North Melbourne, took place on the 10th day of August, One thousand eight hundred and sixty.one

That H. S. Walsh, Esquire, the returning officer of the said district, held, superintended, and directed the said election.

'That the following persons were the candidates at such election, namely:—John Davies, Patrick Costello, Thomas Dickson, John Harbison, James Caple, and James Sim, Esquires, and John Sinclair, your petitioner.

That the election took place by the electors of the district recording their votes in favor of such two, or one; of the seven candidates as they deemed fit to be so returned.

That thereupon the said officer officially declared that the said John Davies and Patrick Costello were duly returned at such election to serve in the said Assembly as such two members. That immediately before the returning officer had so declared the state of the poll, your petitioner handed to him a paper writing, wherein your petitioner, for the reasons therein set forth, publicly protested against the said Patrick Costello being returned as one of the said two members, and that the said Patrick Costello was there and then made acquainted with the nature of such protest."

That the returning officer endorsed upon the writ, by virtue of which he held such election, the names of the said John Davies and Patrick Costello, as being the names of the two persons returned thereat to serve in the Assembly for the district aforesaid.

That the greatest number of votes at the election were recorded in favor of the said John Davies, and that your petitioner admits that he, the said John Davies, was duly elected thereat.

That the said Patrick Costello had, according to the declaration of the state of the poll so made by the returning officer, a majority of forty-two votes over your petitioner.

That, notwithstanding such declaration, your petitioner verily believes that the number of legal votes recorded at the said election in your petitioner's favor exceeded the number of legal votes recorded thereat in favor of the said Patrick Costello.

That the number of legal votes which would have been recorded at the said election in favor of your petitioner would have exceeded by a considerable majority the number of such votes recorded thereat in favor of the said Patrick Costello, had it not been for the illegal and corrupt practices hereinafter mentioned which were resorted to at such election by some persons to your petitioner unknown.

That twenty-one electors of the said district entitled to vote at the said election were not allowed to vote thereat, by reason of certain persons having at such election personated the said electors, and recorded their votes as if they were such electors, before the said electors presented themselves respectively at the polling booths for the purpose of voting.

That your petitioner verily believes that the personators of the said twenty-one electors and of the thirty-eight electors recorded the votes given by them under such assumed characters at the said election in favor of the said Patrick Costello, and that none of such personators recorded such, his illegal vote, in favor of your petitioner.

That your petitioner has been aggrieved by the twenty-one electors not having been allowed to record their votes in his favor at the said election, and that your petitioner has been further aggrieved by the personators of the said twenty-one electors and thirty-eight electors having been allowed to record their votes thereat under such assumed characters.

Your petitioner therefore prays that his petition may be laid before the said Honorable Assembly, and that the said Honorable Assembly may be pleased to refer such petition to "The Committee of Elections and Qualifications" of its House, in order that such committee may enquire into and determine all the material allegations therein contained, and make a report touching the same to the said Assembly.

And your petitioner further prays that the said Honorable Assembly may be pleased, when referring such petition to the committee, to direct that the committee shall in particular take into consideration and determine the points or questions following touching the said election of Patrick Costello, and embody their decisions respecting the same in the said report; that is to say:

Firstly.—How many of the said twenty-one electors and thirty-eight electors were personated at the said election.

Secondly.—How many votes did the personators of such electors record in favor of the said Patrick Costello, and how many (if any) in favor of your petitioner.

Thirdly.—How many of the said twenty-one electors were prevented from voting at the said election by the acts of personation hereinbefore in that behalf mentioned.

Fourthly.—How many votes would those of the said twenty-one electors, who have been prevented from voting by such acts of personation, have been given in favor of the said Patrick Costello, and how many in favor of your petitioner.

The petitioners state the township of Moonambel is the centro of an extensive mining district; that it contains upwards of three hundred resident householders, and that the dwellings are of a substantial character and have been erected at considerable expense, but no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets, which are consequently nearly impassable, and heavy merchandise, &c., has to be carried over them at great risk and expense.

They are therefore of opinion that the formation of the township into a Municipal District will tend greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government, and suggest the following boundaries for such district, viz.—From the south-west angle of McKinnon's pre-emptive right to a point bearing south half a mile; thence by a line bearing west three miles; thence by a line bearing north two miles; thence by a line bearing south one mile and a half to the starting point.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, the preservation of public health, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: And whereas it is expedient to make a bye-law for the more certain prevention of the nuisances occasioned from cattle being allowed to be at large on the streets and unenclosed places within the said municipal district: Be it therefore enacted, that from and after this bye-law coming into operation it shall not be lawful for any person to allow any cow, horse, mule, ass, sheep, goat, or any kind of swine or other cattle belonging to him or her, or under his or her charge, to be at large in any street or public place, or in any unenclosed place, within the said municipal district, unless the same shall be his or her freehold property, or in his or her occupation; and any person who shall so offend shall, on conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Five pounds. BYE-LAW NO. 7.—FOR THE PRESERVATION OF THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS AND WATERCOURSES, AND TO REGULATE THE FORMATION OF PRIVATE DRAINS AND CROSSINGS, AND THE ERECTION OF SHADES OR AWNINGS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council '18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it is enacted, inter alia, that the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act, shall have the care and management of the roads, public streets, paths, &c., within such municipal district: And whereas it is expedient and necessary to preserve the footpaths and watercourses that are or may hereafter be formed by order of the municipal council of Chewton, out of the public moneys: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Chewton, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of the Governor in Council—

1. Any person or persons who shall wilfully ride, drive, or lead, or cause to be ridden, driven, or lod, any horse, cattle, sheep, or beast, or who shall wilfully drive or wheel, or cause to be driven or wheeled, any carriage, dray, cart, barrow, or other vehicle, No. 144.—SEPTEMBER 27, 1861.—2.

upon, along, or across any of the public footpaths or water-courses within the municipality of Chewton, excepting the channels in the carriage or road ways at the intersections of the public streets, unless over and by means of a crossing-place formed in one or other of, the manners hereinafter stated, or who shall in any way wilfully cause damage or obstruction to the said public footpaths or watercourses, or any of them, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter stated for a breach of this hypelaw bye-law.

2. Every owner or occupier of any private gateway, yard, lance or building, to which access or approach by horses, beasts, carriages, carts, or other vehicles can be obtained only by riding, driving, or wheeling, upon, or across any of the said public footpaths or watercourses, is hereby authorised, required, and directed by the municipal council of Chewton, to provide, construct, and maintain such crossing or crossings, in one or other of the manners hereinafter mentioned, over the said public footpaths or watercourses, or any of them, as may be necessary for the approach and access to any such private gateway, right-of-way, yard, lane, or building, at the expense of such owner or occupier: Provided that those about forming such crossing-places shall give notice in writing of such their intention, and shall submit'a specification of the manner in which the work is to be performed, to the town surveyor, who shall give permission for the same to be proceeded with as specified, provided the specified manner is not objectionable.

3. In streets where a stone or wood kerb is now or hereafter may be laid, the crossing shall be paved with stone pavement the whole width of the footpath from the building line to the waterchannel, and shall be euclosed on both sides with a stone or wood kerb of the same size and description as the street kerbing, which it must join closely with a proper curve: Provided, that in places where the waterchannel is not paved, then the pavement of the crossing must extend to a distance of not less than six feet from the kerb line of the footpath. In streets where a footpath and channel are now, or may hereafter be formed, and where no kerbing is laid, crossings may be constructed by paving and kerbing as before mentioned, or by erecting suitable wooden or other bridges of sufficient strength over the waterchannel, such bridges to project into the public roadway not less than four nor more than five feet from the outer edge of the footpath, and a clear space of not less than nine inches must be left between the under portion of the bridge and the waterchannel; such crossing-place must be metalled or gravelled in such manner as to be always as clean and dry as the adjoining footpath, and the waterchannel must not in any way be obstructed, but must be kept at all times in good repair by those having the crossing, premises, or land, who shall cause or suffer any weter or reflexive metter to her should be suffered to the provider of the properties of the provider to her should be suffered to the provider of the provider to her should be a suffered to the provider and weter or provider.

4. The owner or occupier of any building, premises, or land, who shall cause or suffer any water or offensive matter to be discharged or to overflow from any building, premises, or land, into, on, or over any public footpath, highway, or thoroughlare within the municipality aforesaid, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter stated for a breach of this bye-law: Provided, that if any such owner or occupier shall make and maintain such drains leading through and under the adjoining public footpath, highway, or thoroughfure, as shall be necessary to discharge the water from such building, premises, or land, into the public water from such building, premises, or land, into the public watertables, channels, or gutters, at the expense of such owner or occupier, and under the superintendence of such officer as the said municipal council may appoint for that purpose, then such owner or occupier shall not, be liable to the penalty imposed in this clause.

5. Any person or persons who shall erect or cause to be

imposed in this clause.

Any person or persons who shall erect, or cause to be erected, any shade, awning, or other obstruction, over, upon, or across any public footpath within the said municipality without first having obtained, in writing, the consent of the said municipal council to such erection, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter stated for a breach of this bye-law; and be it further ordered and directed by the authority aforesaid, that every such shade, awning, or other obstruction, when such consent to the erection of the same shall have been obtained, shall be erected with the upright posts or pillars thereof immediately at and in a line with the outside of the kerb or boundary of the footpath, and that no plate, rafter, or tie of any such shade, awning, or other obstruction, shall be of a less height above the surface of such footpath than seven feet in the clear to the under side of such rafter, plate, or tie.

And be it further ordered and directed, that it shall be lawful

And be it further ordered and directed, that it shall be lawful for the said municipal council to direct and require the removal of any shade, awning, or other obstruction, erected across, over, or upon any public footpath within the said municipality, except the same be in strict accordance with the foregoing directions, whether such shade, awning, or other obstruction, shall have been erected prior to the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of the Governor in Council, or subsequently thereto; and it shall be further lawful for the said municipal council to give notice for the removal of any such shade, awning, or other obstruction, by means of the surveyor or other officer of the said council, to any owner or occupier by whom, or for whom such shade, awning, or other obstruction, shall have been erected, and any such owner or occupier who shall refuse or neglect to remove any such shade, awning, or other obstruction, within twenty-one days from the time of such notice of removal being given, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter stated for a breach of this bye-law.

6. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to remove

It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to remove the surface soil, or dig any hole, or sink a shaft for any purpose whatsoever, upon any of the public roads, footpaths, or water-courses within the boundaries of the municipality aforesaid, whether the same be formed or not, without first having obtained the consent, in writing, of the said municipal council for such purpose; and any person or persons committing either of these offences shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter stated for a breach of this bye-law.

For the purposes of this bye-law, the terms "watercourse" and "channel" in any street, shall mean a space of six feet from the outer edge of the kerb or boundary of the footpath in such street, or it shall mean any channel, drain, or ditch, formed or maintained by or under the direction of the municipal council
