THE REMOVAL OF TIMBER FROM CERTAIN CROWN LANDS PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things provided, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, by proclamation, to declare that it shall not be lawful for any person to remove live or dead timber from such portions of Crown lands as may be named in such Proclamation: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-second day of November, in the year 1860, it was declared that it should not be lawful for the holders of miners' rights, business licenses, or carriers' licenses to remove live or dead timber from the Crown lands therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to alter the terms of the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor or Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the said Proclamation: and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare that it shall not be lawful for any person, other than such person or persons as shall have been duly authorised by the Board of Land and Works, to cut and remove live timber on and from any unappropriated Crown lands situate within ten miles of the city of Melbourne, or within seven miles of the town of Geelong, or within the boundaries of any proclaimed townships or reserved lands throughout the colony of Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.

GLENLYON ROAD DISTRICT.

PROPOSED ENLARGEMENT.

THE Chairman of the Glenlyon District Road Board (John Joseland, Esq.) has made to this Department an application, stating, amongst other things, as follows:—

"I am in receipt of a communication from eighteen landholders residing within the parishes of Burke and Drummond, on behalf of the landholders and householders generally, proposing an amalgamation of their district with that of ours, for the purpose of a road board. On many accounts this would be very desirable, for our district in its present position and extent does not yield sufficient revenue as assessment dues to cover the incidental expenses connected therewith. The salaried officer of our board is a great part of his time quite unoccupied with our duties, and at the same time, from our isolated position, he is unable to be engaged in any other business of a professional nature, so that if the two districts were comprised under one board, the clerical and professional superintendence for the one would also suffice for the two. * * * The area available for a new road district is very limited between our boundary and the Malmsbury township, but at the same time the line of road from our locality to the proposed terminus at Malmsbury can only be by the already enclosed three-chain road which is at all times in a wretched condition. * * * I respectfully pray your earliest attention to this matter, and trust it will receive your favourable consideration, for I conceive it will be, if effected, an arrangement highly beneficial to this important district."

MUNICIPALITY OF DAYLESFORD.

BYE-LAW No. 9.—TO REPEAL BYE-LAW No. 5 OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF DAYLESFORD, TO PROVIDE FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE ROADS, STREETS, LANES, AND FOOTPATHS, ETC., ETC., ETC.

WHEREAS it has been found expedient to repeal bye-law No. 5 of the municipal council of Daylesford, intituled, "A bye-law to provide for the protection of the roads, streets, lanes, and footpaths within the boundaries of the municipality of Daylesford." Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Daylesford, under the authority vested in them by the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria, the said bye-law No. 5 shall be and is hereby repealed.

THE following Report of the several matters and questions decided at a public meeting of the resident householders and the landowners within the municipal district of Chewton, held on Monday, the 7th instant, together with the list of votes for seven councillors, taken at a poll on Wednesday, the 9th instant, is published pursuant to 15 Victoria No. 15, sec. 15. S.671.

RICHARD HEALES.

REPORT.

Captain Bull attended Chewton at Nine a.m. the 7th instant, as chairman appointed to conduct a meeting of householders and landholders for the purposes specified in the 10th section of the Municipal Institutions Act.

On opening the meeting the chairman read the *Gazette* appointing him chairman, also the proclamation and the notices in two *Government Gazettes*. This was done with some difficulty from interruptions, there being considerable opposition, and a desire to postpone the proceedings for six months. The chairman then proceeded to elect two assessors, and put the first clause of the 10th section to the meeting, when it was decided by a unanimous show of hands in favor of the council, consisting of seven members. On putting the second (pecuniary remuneration) it was negatived; and on submitting the third, so much confusion ensued, and doubts arising as to the parties in the room being duly qualified, it was found advisable to adjourn the meeting to Eight a.m. the following morning, and to a larger room.

Accordingly at Eight a.m. the chairman opened the adjourned meeting in the hall of the Red Hill Hotel, the assessors passing only such into the hall as were supposed to be duly qualified voters.

Objections were then made to the assessors appointed on the previous day, and as they themselves wished to become candidates, they resigned, and other two were appointed without opposition, viz., Mr. Waite and Mr. Marsh; and the meeting proceeded by submitting the names of twenty-eight persons whom they desired to be elected by ballot. Accordingly the meeting was adjourned to Eight a.m. the following day, when a poll was taken, resulting in the election of the following gentlemen to be members of the first municipal council:—

MUNICIPALITY OF EMERALD HILL.

REPORT OF THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL FOR THE HALF-YEAR ENDING 31ST DECEMBER, 1860.

DURING the last half-year a large number of public works have been executed, amongst which may be enumerated the erection of lamps on the railway bridges; laying down of stone and wood kerbing in various streets; channelling and crossings in Cecil, Moray, Raglan, Little Raglan, Little Park, Bridport, Dorcas, Clarendon, and Bank streets; metalling in Moray, Raglan, Little Raglan, Little Park, Dorcas, Napier, Cobden, and Clarendon streets; pitched crossings leading into several streets; formation of portions of Raglan, Park, Little Park street, and completion of Moray street; formation of footpaths and water channels in Bank street west, Moray place east, &c. In addition to which contracts have been entered into for the extirpation of thistles within the town limits; laying down of pitched channels in various streets; formation of portion of Moray place and Coventry street east; formation of Little Raglan street from Moray street to the Eastern road; metalling portion of the Three-chain road, and other works.

The pile-cased embankment along portion of the south side of the River Yarra has been completed, and its efficiency was thoroughly tested during the recent heavy floods.
