# SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF LEARMONTH AND THE VICINITY.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the district hereinafter defined, comprising the town of Learmonth and the vicinity, shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

And I do hereby define the limits of the said district in manner following, viz.:—Commencing in the centre of a road one chain wide, said road forming the western boundaries of lots 10, 14, 15, 16, 17, and 18, section B, and lots 13, 14, 15, and 16 of section D, parish of Burrambeet; thence by centre of said road south to the south side of allotment 16, section D; thence by a line south to its intersection with the centre of a road one chain wide, said road forming part of the south boundary of portion 55, a reserve, and portions 52, 51, 49, 48, Burrambeet; thence by centre of last-named road east to the centre of a road, said road forming the eastern boundaries of portions 48, 32, 26, and 13; thence by the centre of last-named road bearing north to the centre of a road one chain wide, said road forming the north boundaries of portions 13, 12, 11, 10, and the village of Learmonth, and portions 7, 6, 5, and 4, all in the parish of Burrambeet; thence by the centre of the last-named road west to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and in the twenty-fifth year of Her Majesty's reign.

Given under my hand this thirty-first day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, at the Gaol of Melbourne.

We do hereby testify and declare that we have this day been present when the extreme penalty of the law was carried into execution on the body of Thomas Sanders, convicted at the Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court, held at Melbourne on the seventeenth day of October instant, and sentenced to death, and that the said Thomas Sanders was, in pursuance of the said sentence, hanged by the neck until his body was dead.

## LANDS TO BE PERMANENTLY RESERVED.

IT is hereby notified, in pursuance of the 4th section of the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, that, upon the expiration of one month from the undermentioned dates, it is the intention of the Governor in Council to permanently reserve from sale the lands hereinafter described, for the several purposes specified in connection with each description.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted that every work proposed to be executed by any municipal council by money or aid received from the Government shall be the subject of a distinct and separate bye-law: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Creswick, that the sum of One thousand and ninety-three pounds nine shillings and fourpence (£1093 9s. 4d.), being the total amount of the grant-in-aid received from the Government by the said council for the year, 1861, be expended in rebuilding Slaty Creek Bridge, grading and levelling portions of Albert street, forming and metalling portion of Victoria street and portion of the Ascot road, and in maintenance metal for the streets and roads generally.

The petitioners state that they are all householders resident at and near Essendon and Flemington, within the meaning of the Municipal Institutions Act, 18 Victoria No. 15; that they are more than one hundred and fifty in number; and that the area within which they reside contains a population of more than three hundred householders, and does not exceed nine square miles, wherein no one point is six miles distant from any other point.

They further state that they are desirous that their locality should be erected into a municipal district to be governed by a council as provided by the said Act, and suggest the following boundaries for such district (as described on a plan which accompanied the petition), viz.:-

"Commencing at a point on the northern boundary fence of the Melbourne and Mount Alexander railway at its intersection with the western side of Moonee Ponds Creek; thence along the northern fence of the railway for a distance of eighty-seven chains, more or less, by a curved line having an average bearing of west by 8° 30' north to its intersection with the eastern side of the Saltwater River; thence for a distance of three hundred and four chains, more or less, along the eastern side of the Saltwater River, being an irregular line having a general bearing of north by 33° 30' west to the intersection of the western boundary of No. 1 allotment of portion 7, in the parish of Jika-jika, with the northern side of the Saltwater River; thence by a line for a distance of one hundred and thirty chains, more or less, bearing due north to its intersection with the northern side of the one-chain Mount Macedon road; thence by a line for a distance of seventy-two chains, more or less, bearing east by 8° south to the intersection of the eastern side of the Main Melbourne road with the northern side of Woodland street; thence due east for a distance of one hundred and fourteen chains, more or less, along the northern side of Woodland street to its intersection with the western side of Moonee Ponds Creek; thence for a distance of five hundred and twenty-six chains, more or less, along the western side of Moonee Ponds Creek, being an irregular line having a general bearing of south by 10° east to the point of commencement, all the above being situate in the parish of Dootta Galla, county of Bourke."

The petitioners state, lastly, that they are desirous that the district above described be proclaimed as the municipal district of Essendon and Flemington, and pray as follows, viz.:-

"Your petitioners therefore pray your Excellency that the before described boundaries may be constituted the limits of the municipal district; that your Excellency will be pleased to constitute the same under the name of 'The Municipal District of Essendon and Flemington'; and that your Excellency will also be pleased to issue the necessary Proclamation for declaring it a municipality, and defining the limits accordingly."

LIST OF WORKS COMPLETED, FROM THE 11TH MARCH, 1861, TO 10TH SEPTEMBER, 1861.

*Streets formed.*—Mort street east side, Byron street south side, Queen street, Little Alma street, and Little Inkermann street.

*Kerbing, channelling, and metalling.*—Argyle street west near Barkly street, Bath street next Argyle street, Fitz Roy street on both sides opposite railway terminus, Frampton street west side, and Carlisle street east at railway bridge.

*Metalling.*—Carlisle street east from Hotham street eastwards. A large quantity of blue metal has been purchased, and used in repairing and maintaining the roads previously metalled.

The bridge in Acland street has been widened from 25 to 66 feet, and stone piers placed to same.

*Abattoirs* have been erected, and will be completed and ready for slaughtering in a week or two.

*Drainage.*—The main drain from Acland street to the sea has been opened out and permanently constructed, at a cost exceeding £2000.

*Planting.*—A considerable portion of the walks and paths in the public gardens have been formed and gravelled, and the bed-laid out, and several hundred plants and shrubs (principally contributed by the Botanical Gardens, and also by private gentlemen) have been planted; and a gardener is now kept at work, the Government having contributed £100 as a grant-in-aid. The slopes of the esplanade have been trenched and soiled in various places where the rock protruded, and a great number of plants and trees planted, and seeds sown.
