INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION OF 1862.—COMMISSION.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith:

To our trusty and well-beloved SIR REDMOND BARRY, Knight, one of the Judges of our Supreme Court of our Colony of Victoria; the Honorable SIR FRANCIS MURPHY, Knight, Speaker of the Legislative Assembly of our said colony; the Honorable JOHN HENRY BROOKE, President of the Board of Land and Works of our said colony; the Honorable SIR JAMES FREDERICK PALMER, Knight, President of the Legislative Council of our said colony; the Honorable RICHARD HEALES, Chief Secretary of our said colony; the Honorable WILLIAM CLARK HAINES, the Honorable JOHN O'SHANASSY, the Honorable CHARLES HOTSON EBDEN, the Honorable CHARLES GAVAN DUFFY, the Honorable JOHN BASSON HUMFRAY, Commissioner of Mines of our said colony; JOHN MACADAM, Esquire, Medicine Doctor, Government Analytical Chemist in our said colony, Members of the Legislative Assembly of our said colony; FREDERICK MCCOY, Esquire, F.G.S.L., Professor of Natural Science in the University of Melbourne, in our said colony; ALFRED RICHARD CECIL SELWYN, Esquire, Government Geologist in our said colony; FERDINAND MUELLER, Esquire, Medicine Doctor, Government Botanist in our said colony; RICHARD EADES, Esquire, Medicine Baccalaureus; CHARLES EDWARD BRIGHT, Esquire, and ROBERT MCDUGALL, Esquire, of our said colony of Victoria,

GREETING:

WHEREAS it has been publicly notified that an International Exhibition of Agricultural and Industrial products will be held at London, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two: And whereas it has been proposed that a Commission should be appointed for the purpose of receiving articles the produce or manufacture of our Colony of Victoria, and of exhibiting the said articles in the said colony, and of selecting from and transmitting to London such articles as may be thought worthy of exposition in the said International Exhibition: Now know you, that We, reposing special trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have thought fit to constitute and appoint, and by these presents do constitute and appoint, you, Sir Redmond Barry, President of the said Commission; Sir Francis Murphy and John Henry Brooke, Vice-Presidents of the said Commission; and Sir James Frederick Palmer, Richard Heales, William Clark Haines, John O'Shanassy, Charles Hotson Ebden, Charles Gavan Duffy, John Basson Humfray, John Macadam, Frederick McCoy, Alfred Richard Cecil Selwyn, Ferdinand Mueller, Richard Eades, Charles Edward Bright, and Robert McDougall, to be our Commissioners to devise and carry out the details necessary to facilitate the Exhibition in our Colony of Victoria, of articles the produce or manufacture of our said colony, and the transmission to London of such said articles as may be selected for exposition at the International Exhibition to be held at London in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two: And for the purpose of aiding you in the execution of the premises, We hereby appoint our trusty and well-beloved John Macadam, aforesaid, to be Honorary Secretary to this our Commission: And We do by these presents give and grant to you, or any three or more of you, full power and authority to carry into effect the purposes of this our Commission by all lawful ways and means whatsoever: And We do further will and direct that you do report in writing your proceedings from time to time to His Excellency our Governor of our said colony, and do submit all measures which you may deem requisite for his approval or disallowance previously to carrying the same into execution: And lastly, We do by these presents ordain that this our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, shall and may from time to time, and at any place or places, proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

Witness our trusty and well-beloved SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of our Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, at Melbourne, in our said colony, this eighth day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and in the twenty-fourth year of our reign.

THE CASTLEMAINE AND SANDHURST CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICTS ALTERED.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, by any orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which circuit courts should be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he should, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the acting Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the third day of November, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, the districts within which the Castlemaine and Sandhurst Circuit Courts respectively should have jurisdiction were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary to alter the limits thereof: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, by this present Order, alter the limits of the said Castlemaine and Sandhurst Circuit Court Districts, and doth hereby appoint that the limits of such districts shall be the limits hereinafter defined, that is to say:—

THE CASTLEMAINE CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the River Coliban and the Myrtle Creek; thence by said creek and the dividing range to the most northern part of the county of Talbot north of Mount Alexander; thence by a line westerly to the River Loddon at its junction with McNeill's Creek; thence up the River Loddon to its junction with the Deep Creek; thence southerly up the Deep Creek to confluence of the Bullarook Creek; thence by a line easterly to the range between Joyce's Creek and Bullarook Creek; thence by that range to the main dividing range; thence by the main dividing range to the source of the River Coliban; thence by the River Coliban northwards to the commencing point.

THE SANDHURST CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the River Murray with the River Goulburn; thence by the River Goulburn to its junction with Hughes's Creek; thence by a line south-west to the head of the McIvor Creek; thence by a line north-west to the junction of the Rivers Campaspe and Coliban; thence by the River Coliban, the Myrtle Creek, and the Mount Alexander Range to the most northern part of the county of Talbot north of Mount Alexander; thence by a line westerly to the River Loddon at its junction with McNeill's Creek; thence by said river to its junction with an anabranch of the River Murray; thence by said anabranch westerly to the south-east angle of the township of Castle Donnington; thence by the southern, western, and northern boundaries of said township to the River Murray; thence by said river easterly to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Richard Davies Ireland, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions hereon accordingly.

THE MARYBOROUGH CIRCUIT COURT CREATED.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to make provision for the better administration of Justice in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor of the said colony, by any orders to be by him, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, from time to time made and proclaimed, to define the limits of districts within and the times at which circuit courts should be holden in the said colony, and the said limits and times to alter and vary as he should, with the advice aforesaid, deem necessary, and to direct that Circuit Courts should be holden at such towns or places within those limits as he should, with the advice aforesaid, think fit to appoint: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order direct that a Circuit Court shall be holden at the town of Maryborough, having jurisdiction within

and for the district hereinafter described, to be called "The Maryborough Circuit Court District," and doth define the limits of such district in manner following, that is to say:—

THE MARYBOROUGH CIRCUIT COURT DISTRICT.—Commencing at the source of the Deep Creek in the great dividing range; thence by said creek to its junction with the River Loddon; thence by said river to its junction with an anabranch of the River Murray; thence by the said anabranch westerly to the south-east angle of the township of Castle Donnington; thence by the southern, western, and northern boundaries of said township to the River Murray; thence by said river westerly to the South Australian boundary line; thence by said boundary line southerly to a point bearing west from the south shore of Lake Hindmarsh; thence east to the south shore of said lake; thence easterly to a point on the River Avoca five miles, more or less, north of Corom; thence by said river southerly to its source in the dividing range; thence by said dividing range easterly to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Richard Davies Ireland, Her Majesty's Attorney General for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions hereon accordingly.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF CAMPERDOWN.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Camperdown, the limits whereof are hereinafter defined, shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

And I do hereby define the limits of the said township of Camperdown in manner following, viz.:—Commencing at the north-west corner of allotment 1, section 15, parish of Calongulac; thence east 80 chains; thence south 100 chains partly along the east side of the road from Camperdown to Foxhow; thence west 80 chains; thence north 160 chains along the east side of a road to the commencing point.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fifth day of February, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and in the twenty-fourth year of Her Majesty's reign.
