PROCLAMATION.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

Where Media the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act to amend the laws relative to the vending of fermented and spirituous liquors, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Excentive Council, by proclamation, to declare any city, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act annexal: Now therefore I. Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke all former proclamations of towns and districts situate within the county of Hampden, under the provisions of the said Act; and, with the advice of the county or reputed county of Hampden shall be a district whorein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors in quantities not less than two gallons may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the above recited Act.
