CRANBOURNE TOWN COMMON ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of February in the present year, a certain area, therein described, was proclaimed to be a Town Common for the use of the inhabitants of the town of Cranbourne: And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said common, and to proclaim another area in lieu thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the said Town Common; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim that the Crown lands hereinafter mentioned shall be and constitute a Town Common for the use of the inhabitants of the said town of Cranbourne, within the intent and meaning of the said Act, that is to say:-

TOWN COMMON FOR CRANBOURNE.—400 acres, more or less, County of Mornington, Parish of Sherwood, allotment 20 and part of allotment 21: Commencing at a point on the north boundary of allotment 21, two chains west from the intersection of the main line of road from Western Port to Cranbourne with the north boundary of said allotment 21; thence south eighty chains thirty-seven links; thence east one hundred and thirteen chains thirteen links, more or less, to the south-west side of the main road from Western Port; thence by that side of the main road north-westerly to a point due east of the commencing point; thence west two chains to the point of commencement.—(9450.)

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE TOWNSHIP OF WOODEND.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intitled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the township of Woodend shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO CERTAIN MUNICIPAL DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's Reign (Number 13), intitled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct; and it was also enacted that for the purposes of the said Act the corporations of the city of Melbourne and of the town of Geelong, and the council of any municipal district then or thereafter to be created, should be the local boards of health within their respective limits and jurisdictions so soon as the said Act or any portion of it should be extended to such city, town or district: And whereas the said Act has been extended to divers municipal districts, and it is deemed expedient to make the same also applicable to the districts hereinafter mentioned: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force in the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:-

The municipal district of Malmsbury.
The municipal district of Moanabell.

The petitioners state that they are all householders resident at and near Essendon and Flemington, within the meaning of the Municipal Institutions Act, 18 Victoria No. 15; that they are more than one hundred and fifty in number; and that the area within which they reside contains a population of more than three hundred householders, and does not exceed nine square miles, wherein no one point is six miles distant from any other point.

They further state that they are desirous that their locality should be erected into a municipal district to be governed by a council as provided by the said Act, and suggest the following boundaries for such district (as described on a plan which accompanied the petition), viz.:
