RULES UNDER THE PLEURO-PNEUMONIA ACT.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, numbered 123, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to make rules respecting any cattle brought into the colony of Victoria by sea or land, and for preventing the introduction of the disease called pleuro-pneumonia, and generally for carrying out the provisions of the said Act: And whereas the cattle in the district around Albury, in the colony of New South Wales, are infected by the said disease: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor in Council doth by this present Order make the following rules respecting cattle to be brought into Victoria from the said district around Albury:—

No person shall bring any cattle into Victoria from the colony of New South Wales across the River Murray, at any place between a point upon the said river ten miles below the township of Wahgunyah and the junction of the Gudgewong Creek with the said river, except at the crossing-places adjoining the township of Wahgunyah and Albury respectively.

No person shall bring cattle into Victoria by the said crossing-places, unless he shall have previously obtained a written authority to do so from a commissioner appointed under the authority of the said Act, or some other person authorised by the Governor in that behalf.

Any such commissioner or person authorised as aforesaid may order that cattle brought into the colony shall be placed in quarantine, in such place as he shall appoint by order under his hand, addressed to any person in charge of such cattle, and such cattle shall thereupon be detained in the place appointed until discharged from quarantine by such commissioner.

If any person shall bring any bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, or calf, into Victoria contrary to these rules, or shall refuse or neglect to place any such animal in any appointed place of quarantine when directed to do so by any such commissioner or person as aforesaid, or shall suffer any such animal which has been placed in quarantine to leave the place of quarantine before being discharged as hereinbefore provided, he shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £50.

The foregoing rules shall take effect from the date of the publication thereof.

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF INGLEWOOD.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case, save as thereinafter mentioned, to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to the Governor by the householders and landowners resident at and near Inglewood, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act: And whereas the counter-petition delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary has been found not to fulfil the requirements of the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:-

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF INGLEWOOD.—County unnamed, parish of Inglewood: Commencing at the south-west angle of the township reserve of Inglewood; thence by a line

bearing north one hundred and sixty chains; thence by a line bearing east one hundred and sixty chains; thence by a line bearing south one hundred and sixty chains; thence by a line bearing west one hundred and sixty chains to the point of commencement.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Inglewood."

THE AVOCA ROAD DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the said colony hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:-

Commencing at a point being the north-east corner of the Stavell Road Board District (township of Navarre); thence easterly by the south boundary of the St. Arnaud Road Board District to its south-east corner (Nattyallock); thence northerly by the Avoca River to a point due west of the north-west corner of the Bet-bet Road District; thence to the said corner; thence southerly by the Bet-bet, Tullaroop, and Amherst Road Districts to the intersecting point of the latter with the Lexton Road District; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the last-named district and that of Ararat to its intersection of the eastern boundary of the Stavell Road District; and thence northerly by that boundary to the point of commencement; excluding the municipalities of Avoca and Moonambel.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Avoca Road District."

THE WINCHELSEA ROAD DISTRICT ENLARGED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-second day of October, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the boundaries of "The Winchelsea Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient to enlarge the said district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the boundaries specified in the said Proclamation; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the boundaries of the said Winchelsea Road District shall comprise the area the boundaries whereof are hereinafter specified, that is to say:-

Commencing at a point in the centre of the River Barwon due west from the south-west angle of the parish of Whorell, in the county of Polwarth; thence on the west by the centre line of the River Barwon northerly to a point due east of the south boundary line of allotment N of section 28, in the parish of Birregurra; thence westward to the south-west angle of the last named allotment; thence northward to the south boundary of allotment A of section 28 in the last named parish; thence south-east along the south boundary of the last named allotment to its south-east angle; thence due north along the eastern boundaries of allotments A, B, C, D, and E, of said section 22,

to the north-east angle of said allotment E; thence westward to the south-east side line of a government road (bounding the last named section on the north-west); thence north-east along the side line of the said road and of allotment E of section 19, in the last named parish, to a point due south of the dividing line of allotments B and C of the last named section; thence northerly by the said dividing line (crossing the Birregurra Creek into the county of Grenville) and the dividing line of allotments B and C of section 12, in the last named parish, to the Colac road; thence north-east along the said Colac road to a point due south of the east side line of allotments 50 and 57 of the last named parish, and onwards to the south side of section 104, in the parish of Gellibrand; thence further north by the western boundaries of the parishes of Gellibrand and Hesse to the north-west angle of section 7, in the parish of Hesse; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of sections 7, 2, and 1, of the parish of Hesse to the western boundary of the parish of Murdeduke; thence northerly by the west boundary of the last named parish to the centre of the Warramine Creek; thence easterly by the centre line of the Warramine Creek and the centre line of the River Barwon to a point due north of the north-east angle of the parish of Carrung Emurong, in the county of Grant; thence southwards along the east boundary lines of the parishes of Carrung Emurong and Lake Lake Wollard to the northern boundary of the parish of Gherang-gherang; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the said parish to its north-east angle; thence south by the eastern boundary of the said parish to its south-east angle; thence west by the southern boundary of the said parish to the south-east angle of the parish of Tutegong; thence westerly to the east boundary of the parish of Yan Yangurt; thence south to the south-east angle of the last named parish; thence south-west by west to the south-east angle of the parish of Whoorell; and thence by the south boundary of the last named parish westwards to the commencing point.

MEPUNGA FARMERS' COMMON.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common," provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land in or near the locality hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for a Farmers' Common in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be a FARMERS' COMMON for the use of the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and also under and subject to such conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common as are or may be prescribed, that is to say:—

FARMERS' COMMON FOR AGRICULTURISTS AT MEPUNGA.—County of Heytesbury: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 26, Mepunga; thence north-westerly by the south-west boundaries of allotments 26 and 25 along the reserve on the sea-shore to the south-west angle of allotment 25; thence north to the north-west angle of said allotment 25; thence east by the north boundary of allotment 25 to the margin of tea-tree scrub; thence south-easterly by that margin, being the north-east boundaries of allotments 25 and 26 to the north-east angle of allotment 26; and thence south by the east boundary of allotment 26 to the point of commencement. PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and sixty-nine householders resident at and near Essendon and Flemington, in the parish of Douita Galla, in the county of Bourke, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are all householders resident at and near Essendon and Flemington, within the meaning of the Municipal Institutions Act, 18 Victoria No. 15; that they are more than one hundred and fifty in number; and that the area within which they reside contains a population of more than three hundred householders, and does not exceed nine square miles, wherein no one point is six miles distant from any other point.

They further state that they are desirous that their locality should be erected into a municipal district to be governed by a council as provided by the said Act, and suggest the following boundaries for such district (as described on a plan which accompanied the petition), viz:—

“Commencing at a point on the northern boundary fence of the Melbourne and Mount Alexander railway at its intersection with the western side of Moonee Ponds Creek; thence along the northern fence of the railway for a distance of eighty-seven chains, more or less, by a curved line having an average bearing

of west by 8° 30' north to its intersection with the eastern side of the Saltwater River; thence for a distance of three hundred and four chains, more or less, along the eastern side of the Saltwater River, being an irregular line having a general bearing of north by 38° 30' west to the intersection of the western boundary of No. 1 allotment of portion 7, in the parish of Jika-jika, with the northern side of the Saltwater River; thence by a line for a distance of one hundred and thirty chains, more or less, bearing due north to its intersection with the northern side of the one-chain Mount Macedon road; thence by a line for a distance of seventy-two chains, more or less, bearing east by 8° south to the intersection of the eastern side of the Main Melbourne road with the northern side of Woodland street; thence due east for a distance of one hundred and fourteen chains, more or less, along the northern side of Woodland street to its intersection with the western side of Moonee Ponds Creek; thence for a distance of five hundred and twenty-six chains, more or less, along the western side of Moonee Ponds Creek, being an irregular line having a general bearing of south by 10° east to the point of commencement, all the above being situate in the parish of Douita Galla, county of Bourke.”

PROCLAMATION
CONTAINING REGULATIONS UNDER THE DISEASED CATTLE
ACT, 1861.

WHEREAS by the *Diseased Cattle Act*, 1861, it was provided that the Governor in Council might, by warrant under his hand, from time to time delegate to the Superintendent of any province within the said colony, all or any of the powers vested in the Governor or Governor in Council by the said Act, subject to such regulations as he might think fit, and might from time to time rescind such delegation: And whereas the said Governor hath, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, delegated to William Sefton Moorhouse, Esquire, so long as he shall hold the office of Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, the several powers vested in the said Governor by the second, fourth, fifth, seventh, ninth, and tenth sections of the said Act, subject to being rescinded as in the said Act provided, and subject to the regulations issued by the Governor in Council on the first day of October, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and to any other regulations to be from time to time duly made:

Now therefore I, the said William Sefton Moorhouse, by virtue of such powers in me vested, do hereby proclaim and declare:—

1. That after the date hereof the several Colonies of Australia, that is to say, the Colony of Victoria, of New South Wales, of Queensland, of South Australia, and Western Australia, as well as the Colony of Tasmania and the Colony of the Cape of Good Hope, and the Islands of Great Britain and Ireland, shall be deemed to be, for the purposes of the above recited Act, infected districts within the meaning of the said Act; and that no cattle shall be allowed to be imported from the abovementioned districts; and that in the case where any cattle may be imported from the said districts, such cattle shall be destroyed forthwith, in such manner and at such places as the Superintendent may proclaim and appoint.

2. That after the date of these regulations the Provinces of Otago and Southland, in the Colony of New Zealand, shall be deemed to be infected districts within the meaning of the said Act, and that no cattle shall be imported from the said provinces either by land or sea.

CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran also to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in the schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will, however, in no case exceed 50 per cent.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage when delivered must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account, monthly, in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated on the account.

6.
