PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sie Henry Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes, it is amongst other things enacted, that it is shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called a "Farmers' Common;" provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted, that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land in or near the localities hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for Farmers' Commons in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be Farmers' Commons on the exercise of the right of common is an error may be prescribed, that is to say:

FARMERS' COMMON AT SOUTH BARNAWATHA.—2300 acres,

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or faruers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January in the present year, a certain area, therein described under the designation of Sandhurst, was proclaimed to be a gold fields common: And whereas it is expedient to increase the said common by adding thereto the area hereinafter described: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands here-

inafter described to be an addition to the gold fields common described in the said Proclamation under the designation of Sandhurst, for the use of all holders of miners' rights, business licenses, carriers' licenses, and other residents on the gold fields situate at and near Sandhurst aforesaid, in like manner and to all intents and purposes as if the said additional area had been included within the area described in the said Proclamation, that is to say: that is to say :--

The addition to the Sandhurst Gold Fields Common.—702 acres 2 roods 36 perches, more or less, county unnamed, parish of Lockwoot.
