THE METROPOLITAN CRICKET GROUND.

NEW TOLLS ON GOVERNMENT ROADS FROM 1ST
JULY, 1862.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under my Hand and the Seal of the colony, bearing date the fifteenth day of April in this present year, it was declared and ordered that the rates of tolls then collected by the Board of Land and Works for all animals and vehicles passing or repassing through or by any toll-bars, toll-gates, or toll-houses then or thereafter erected or built in or upon main or other roads under the charge of the said Board, should cease and determine from and after the thirty-first day of December instant, and that the rates of tolls therein specified should be collected in lieu thereof from and after the first day of January, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two: And whereas it is expedient to postpone the operation of the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as declares that the rates of tolls then and now collected by the Board of Land and Works as hereinbefore mentioned shall cease and determine from and after the thirty-first day of December instant and that the new rates of tolls shall be collected from and after the first day of January next ensuing; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby declare and order that the existing rates of tolls shall continue to be collected until the thirtieth day of June, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, and from thenceforth shall cease and determine; and that rates of tolls not exceeding the rates specified in the said Proclamation shall commence to be collected by the said Board from and after the first day of July then next ensuing.

DISTRICTS BROUGHT UNDER THE GUNPOWDER
ACT.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-first year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to regulate the importation, carriage, and custody of Gunpowder*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to proclaim any town, township, or municipal district, not being a sea-port town, as a district in which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person shall bring more than One hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and shall not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it shall be forfeited: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the town and municipal district hereinafter mentioned to be respectively districts within the meaning and intent and for the purpose mentioned in the above-recited clause of the said Act, that is to say:—

The Town of Stawell.
The Municipal District of Maryborough.

HIGHWAY ROBBERY.

ONE HUNDRED POUNDS REWARD.

PARTICULARS.

Property stolen.—From one of the passengers (James Ray) £9 15s. in money, an open-faced English gold watch with three-quarter plate and a white dial cracked through the centre, and a small gold chain with key attached; from another of the passengers (Patrick Corbett) 6 oz. of small gold nuggets and some silver; from another (Jacob Woolfe) 3 oz. of gold and some silver; and from the driver (William Hoffman) £6 15s. in money.

Description of the Offenders.—First man, 35 or 40 years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, with dark hair and complexion, and the upper portion of the whiskers shaved off, wearing a long-skirted blue pilot coat, dark moleskin trousers, and black wide-awake hat. Second man, about 30 years of age, with light brown hair, wearing a grey tweed coat and Panama hat. These two men wore handkerchiefs over their faces. Third man, similar in description to the second; he wore a black veil. The others have not been described, but one of them carried a double-barrelled gun and a blanket. All were armed with revolvers. Four men whose descriptions lead to the suspicion of their having been concerned in this robbery passed through Furlong's paddock towards Longwood on the same evening.

MUNICIPALITY OF GISBORNE.

29th November, 1861.—It is ordered (no objections having been received), that the road through Mr. John-Beatty's land, as described in the *Gazette* notice of 18th October last, be opened to the public, and that the area of land contained in certain existing roads, also described, be transferred to and vested in the owner of the adjacent property in lieu of the land so taken.—R.&B.1402.

BALLAN PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations of the Ballan General Cemetery.

1. All charges must be paid to the treasurer when the order for interment is obtained.
2. Any person making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep up such vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons and their representatives for ever.
3. Application for such permission must be made at the office of the treasurer, and in his absence that he have power to depute one other of the trustees to act in his behalf. A certificate of permission in the form set forth in schedule B will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges in schedule A.
4. Orders for interment must be obtained at the office of the treasurer, and in his absence, to his deputy; and notice must be given to the sexton (if any) six working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, if not an extra charge will be made (see schedule A).
5. The sexton (if any) will dig all ordinary graves, if required, in which case an extra fee of Ten shillings will be charged, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees, or any two of them. And in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.
6. The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of applying for the order. (See schedule C.)
7. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Eight o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Eight o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months.
9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, must be kept in repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owners.
10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked up and covered by a slab or stone, slate, iron, or brick; and every coffin in a private grave must have on the lid the name and age of the deceased.
11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, must be submitted to the trustees for approval; but a copy of every epitaph or inscription intended to be placed on such stone, tomb, pedestal, monument, or tablet, must be submitted to the trustees only of the ground in which it is intended to place it, for approval.
12. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the graves, is kept at the office of the treasurer, and may be in-

spected at the charge set out in schedule A, and registers of all grants are kept by the treasurer.

13. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these charges and regulations.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in the schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will, however, in no case exceed 50 per cent.

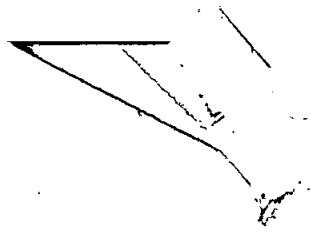
