By His Excellency Sir Henny Barkly, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath. Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her presont Majesty, initialed, An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of March in the present year, a certain area, therein described, was proclaimed to be a Farmers' Common at Irrewarra: And whereas it is expedient to amend

the description of the said common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as purports to describe the said Farmers? Common at Irrewarra; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be the Farmers? Common for the use of the occupiers of purchased land at or near Irrewarra aforesaid, within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

FARMERS' COMMON FOR AGRICULTURISTS AT IRREWARRA, COUNTY OF POLWARTH, PARISHES OF ELLIMINYT AND YEA.—

EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF INDIA.

THE subjoined Regulations for an Examination of Candidates for the Civil Service in India, appointed to be held in London in 1862, have been transmitted to the Governor by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and are published for general information.

REGULATIONS.

REGULATIONS.

1. In June or July, 1862, an examination of candidates will be held in London. Not less than eighty candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified. Of these, will be selected for the Presidency of Bengal, for that of Madras, and and for that of Bombay.*—Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any natural-born subject of Her Majesty, who shall be desirous of entering the Givil Service of India, will be entitled to be examined at such examination, provided he shall, on or before the 1st May, 1862, have transmitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, Dean's Yard, London, S.W.—

(a) A certificate of his birth, showing that his age on the 1st May, 1862, will be above eighteen years and under twenty-two years;

(b) A certificate, signed by a physician or surgeon, of his having no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him for the Civil Service of India;

(c) Satisfactory proof of good moral character;

(d) A statement of those of the branches of knowledge hereinafter enumerated in which he desires to be examined.

3. In any case in which a doubt may arise as to the eligibility of a candidate in respect of age, health, or character, such inquiries as may be necessary will be instituted by the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination unless he shall be considered to possess a competent knowledge of that subject.

7. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by viva voce examination, as may be deeped necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the eighty candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India. They shall be permitted to choose, according to the order in which they stand, as long as a choice remains, the Presidency to which they shall be appointed.

Note.—(1.) All persons appointed to the Civil Service will be required to attend at the India Office, to make the necessary arrangements for entering into covenant, and for giving a bond for £1000, jointly with two sureties, for the due fulfilment of the same. The stamps payable by civilians on their appointment amount to £4 5s.

(2.) The Secretary of State for India in Council has authorised the Civil Service Commissioners to state that, with the view of meeting the expenses to be incurred by selected candidates during the interval which must elapse before they can proceed to India, it is his intention to allow the sum of £100 to each selected candidate who shall have passed the further examination in 1863 to the satisfaction of the Commissioners, and shall have compiled with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.

(3.) Candidates are at liberty to send in their names and evidence of age as soon as they think fit to do so; but evidence of health and character must bear date not earlier than the 1st March, 1862.

BYE-LAW NO. 13.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF HOUSE AND LAND PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT, FOR THE YEAR 1861.

THE YEAR 1861.

WHEREAS by an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, initialled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make an annual assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district, according to its fair average annual value: Be it therefore enacted, that the assessment on the annual value of property within the municipality of Buninyong, estimated at £6964 5s. as approved of by the justices of the peace in petty sessions assembled, shall be the value on which the rate of One shilling in the pound shall be levied, and shall be legal and in force for the municipal year commencing the 8th August, 1861, and ending the 8th August, 1862.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 13, made by the municipal council of Buninyong, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

BYE-LAW NO. 5.—FOR COMPELLING DRIVERS OF CARTS AND DRAYS TO CARRY LIGHTS AFTER SUNSET.

DRAYS TO CARRY LIGHTS AFTER SUNSET.

WHEREAS it has been deemed expedient by the municipal council of Kew, in exercise and execution of the powers to them given by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Pictoria: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the said municipal council, that, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, the driver of every licensed cart or dray, who shall drive the same in, upon, or along any road, street, or thoroughfare, or place used as such, within the limits of the nunnicipality, at any time after sunset of any evening and before surrise of the following morning, shall carry a lamp or lantern, lighted and attached thereto, or suspended from the off side of such cart or dray, in such manner as to be plainly visible to the driver of any vehicle proceeding along the same street, road, thoroughfare, or place, in a contrary direction to that in which such eart or dray without having such lamp or lantern lighted and athibited as aforesaid, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

BYE-LAW NO. 6.-A BYE-LAW FOR REGULATING THE DRIVING OF UNBROKEN HORSES AND CATTLE THROUGH THE MUNI-CIPAL DISTRICT OF KEW.

WHERRAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any nuncipal district established under the provisions of the said Act, to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, and the general good rule and management of such municipal district: And whereas great dauger to life and property arises from the practice of driving unbroken horses and cattle at all hours into or through the municipal district of Kew, and it is expedient to devise means for the prevention of the same. Ile it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Kew, that, from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief of the colony of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to drive into or through the said municipal district any unbroken horses or cattle, excepting between the hours of Nine p.m. and Seven a.m. from 1st of September: provided that nothing herein contained shall be held to extend to horses secured by a bridle or halter, or in harness, milch cows, nor to oxen in yoke.

Any person or persons acting in contravention to this bye-law shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 5 and 6, made by the municipal council of Kew, have been assented to by the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary that, for the purposes of forming, metalling, paying, and repairing the several streets, roads, ways, and footpaths within the municipality of Kew, and for the construction and repairs of drains and sewers, or for the laying of water or gas pipes, or for the taking up and relaying or repairing the same, the street, road, way, or path, or streets, roads, ways, or paths, where any such works are being carried on should be stopped up or closed against public traffic, if considered necessary, during the progress of such works, or any of them: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Kew, that, from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33, &c., it shall be lawful for the said council to order and direct the closing up or stopping of any street, road, way, or path, within the limits of the municipality, against public traffic, during the progress therein of any or all of the works above described, by any suitable barrier or barriers, no tice or notices in writing, at the ends or junction of any such street, road, way, or path, and to continue such barrier or barriers, notice or notices in writing, at the ends or junction of any such street, road, way, or path, with any other street, road, way, or path, and to continue such barrier or barriers, notice or notices as aforesaid, or proceed along any such street, road, way, or path, without the consent of the said council being first obtained thereto, with any eart, waggon, carriage, or other vehicle, or with any horse, bullock, or other beast of burden, or cattle, whether attached to any such cart, waggon, carriage, or other vehicle, or with any horse, bullock, or other beast of burden, or cattle, whether attached to any such cart, waggon, carriage, or other vehicle or not, during the progress of any such work or other vehicle or not, during the progress of any such work or other v

WHEREAS, for the better protection of ornamental or other timber trees or shrubs within the limits of this municipality, it is deemed expedient to make the following orders and regulations: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the council of the nunnicipal district of Kew, that, from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33, &c., any person who shall cut, destroy, or damage any timber tree or shrub on any of the streets, reads, or thoroughfares within the boundaries of this municipality, and being under the control of the municipal council thereof, shall, upon conviction before one or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 10, made by the municipal council of Kew, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

Bye-law No. 33.—A Byr-law for making an Assessment and imposing a Rate of One shilling in the pound for the Year 1861.

POUND FOR THE YEAR ISGI.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, the council of any municipal district is empowered to assess all property in houses or lands within the limits of such municipal district (except property belonging to and in the occupation of Her Majesty), according to its fair average annual value, and to impose a rate on all such properties for the current year: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Sandhurst, that all the several properties within the limits of the said municipal district shall be assessed for the year 1861 according to the several amounts of annual value respectively affixed to the same in the assessment roll confirmed by the said municipal council, and amounting, after all appeals have been heard, to a total sum of One hundred and thirty thousand three hundred and seventy pounds fourteen shillings and sixpence farthing (£130,370 14s. 64d.); and also that a rate of One shilling in the pound of said annual value is hereby imposed on all the said properties for the year 1861, to be due and payable on the tenth day of December in the present year.
