**IRREWARRA FARMERS' COMMON ALTERED.**

**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of March in the present year, a certain area, therein described, was proclaimed to be a Farmers' Common at Irrewarra: And whereas it is expedient to amend

the description of the said common: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as purports to describe the said Farmers' Common at Irrewarra; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be the FARMERS' COMMON for the use of the occupiers of purchased land at or near Irrewarra aforesaid, within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

FARMERS' COMMON FOR AGRICULTURISTS AT IRREWARRA, COUNTY OF POLWARTH, PARISHES OF ELLIMINYT AND YEA.—Extent, about 13,440 acres, to be proclaimed in lieu of description of same common published in the *Government Gazette* of 8th March, 1861: Being sections 3, 14, 15, 16, and unalienated portions of sections 18 and 19, in the parish of Elliminyt, and commencing at the south-east angle of section 16 aforesaid; bounded on the south by a line bearing east about five miles; on the east by a line bearing north about four miles to the south-east angle of section 27, parish of Birregurra; on the north by sections 27 and 26 of this parish, bearing west about two miles; on the west by section 25, parish of Irrewarra, bearing south about one mile; on the north by sections 25 and 26 of this parish, bearing west about two miles; on the west by Austin's pre-emptive section, bearing south about one mile; on the north by this pre-emptive section, bearing west about one mile to the north-east angle of section 4, parish of Elliminyt, being a point bearing north about two miles from commencing point.—(61.C.8512.)

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EXAMINATIONS FOR THE CIVIL SERVICE OF  
INDIA.

**T**HE subjoined Regulations for an Examination of Candidates for the Civil Service in India, appointed to be held in London in 1862, have been transmitted to the Governor by the Secretary of State for the Colonies, and are published for general information.

## REGULATIONS.

1. In June or July, 1862, an examination of candidates will be held in London. Not less than eighty candidates will be selected, if so many shall be found duly qualified. Of these, will be selected for the Presidency of Bengal, for that of Madras, and for that of Bombay.\*—Notice will hereafter be given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any natural-born subject of Her Majesty, who shall be desirous of entering the Civil Service of India, will be entitled to be examined at such examination, provided, he shall, on or before the 1st May, 1862, have transmitted to the Civil Service Commissioners, Dean's Yard, London, S.W.—

(a) A certificate of his birth, showing that his age on the 1st May, 1862, will be above eighteen years and under twenty-two years;

(b) A certificate, signed by a physician or surgeon, of his having no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him for the Civil Service of India;

(c) A statement of those of the branches of knowledge hereinafter enumerated in which he desires to be examined.

3. In any case in which a doubt may arise as to the eligibility of a candidate in respect of age, health, or character, such inquiries as may be necessary will be instituted by the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:—

\* The number of appointments to be made in each Presidency will be announced hereafter.

† It should be understood that candidates are at liberty to name at their pleasure any or all of these branches of knowledge (subject only to the restrictions above mentioned as to Natural Science), and that no subjects are obligatory.

5. The merit of the persons examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding regulation denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

6. No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination unless he shall be considered to possess a competent knowledge of that subject.

7. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *viva voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary.

8. The marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the eighty candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates will be set forth in order of merit, and such candidates shall be deemed to be selected candidates for the Civil Service of India. They shall be permitted to choose, according to the order in which they stand, as long as a choice remains, the Presidency to which they shall be appointed.

9. In June or July, 1863, a further examination of the selected candidates will take place in the following subjects:—

In this, as in the preceding examination, the merit of the candidates examined will be estimated by marks, and the number set opposite to each subject denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *viva voce* examination, as may be deemed necessary.

10. No candidate will be permitted to proceed to India until he shall have passed the further examination, or after he shall have attained the age of twenty-four years.

11. The selected candidates who at the further examination shall be found to have a competent knowledge of the subjects specified in Regulation 9 shall be adjudged to have passed, and to be entitled to be appointed to the Civil Service of India.

12. The seniority in the Civil Service of India of the selected candidates shall be determined according to the order in which they stand on the list resulting from the further examination.

13. No person will, even after passing the further examination, be allowed to proceed to India unless he shall comply with the regulations in force, at the time, for the Civil Service of India, and shall be of sound bodily health and good moral character.—The Civil Service Commissioners will require such further evidence on these points as they may deem necessary before granting their certificate of qualification.

14. Applications from persons desirous to be admitted as candidates are to be addressed to the Secretary to the Civil Service Commissioners, Dean's Yard, London, S.W.

NOTE.—(1.) All persons appointed to the Civil Service will be required to attend at the India Office, to make the necessary arrangements for entering into covenant, and for giving a bond for £1000, jointly with two sureties, for the due fulfilment of the same. The stamps payable by civilians on their appointment amount to £4 5s.

(2) The Secretary of State for India in Council has authorised the Civil Service Commissioners to state that, with the view of meeting the expenses to be incurred by selected candidates during the interval which must elapse before they can proceed to India, it is his intention to allow the sum of £100 to each selected candidate who shall have passed the written examination in 1930, and to the Civil Service Commissioners, and shall have complied with such rules as may be laid down for the guidance of selected candidates.

(3.) Candidates are at liberty to send in their names and evidence of age as soon as they think fit to do so; but evidence of health and character must bear date not earlier than the 1st March, 1862.

## MUNICIPALITY OF BUNINYONG.

BYE-LAW No. 13.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF HOUSE AND LAND PROPERTY WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT, FOR THE YEAR 1861.

**W**HEREAS by an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15 intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make an annual assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such municipal district according to its fair average annual value: Be it therefore enacted, that the assessment on the annual value of property within the municipality of Buninyong, estimated at £6364 6s. as approved of by the justices of the peace in petty session assembled, shall be the value on which the rate of One shilling in the pound shall be levied, and shall be legal and in force for the municipal year commencing the 8th August, 1861, and ending the 8th August, 1862.

*The foregoing Bye-law, No. 13, made by the municipal council of Buninyong, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.*

## MUNICIPALITY OF KEW.

## BYE-LAW No. 5.—FOR COMPELLING DRIVERS OF CARTS AND DRAYS TO CARRY LIGHTS AFTER SUNSET.

WHEREAS it has been deemed expedient by the municipal council of Kew, in exercise and execution of the powers to them given by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the said municipal council, that, from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, the driver of every licensed cart or dray, who shall drive the same in, upon, or along any road, street, or thoroughfare, or place used as such, within the limits of the municipality, at any time after sunset of any evening and before sunrise of the following morning, shall carry a lamp or lantern, lighted and attached thereto, or suspended from the off side of such cart or dray, in such manner as to be plainly visible to the driver of any vehicle proceeding along the same street, road, thoroughfare, or place, in a contrary direction to that in which such cart or dray shall be proceeding, and any person who shall be driving such cart or dray without having such lamp or lantern lighted and exhibited as aforesaid, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

## BYE-LAW No. 6.—A BYE-LAW FOR REGULATING THE DRIVING OF UNBROKEN HORSES AND CATTLE THROUGH THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF KEW.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act, to make bye-laws for the suppression of nuisances, and the general good rule and management of such municipal district: And whereas great danger to life and property arises from the practice of driving unbroken horses and cattle at all hours into or through the municipal district of Kew, and it is expedient to devise means for the prevention of the same: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Kew, that, from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief of the colony of Victoria, as required by the provisions of the said Act, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to drive into or through the said municipal district any unbroken horses or cattle, excepting between the hours of Nine p.m. and Seven a.m. from 1st of September to 1st of April, and Seven p.m. and Nine a.m. from 1st April to 1st September: provided that nothing herein contained shall be held to extend to horses secured by a bridle or halter, or in harness, milch cows, nor to oxen in yoke.

Any person or persons acting in contravention to this bye-law shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding Five pounds for every such offence.

*The foregoing Bye-laws, Nos. 5 and 6, made by the municipal council of Kew, have been assented to by the Governor in Council.*

## MUNICIPALITY OF KEW.

## BYE-LAW No. 8.

WHEREAS it is expedient and necessary that, for the purposes of forming, metalling, paving, and repairing the several streets, roads, ways, and footpaths within the municipality of Kew, and for the construction and repairs of drains and sewers, or for the laying of water or gas pipes, or for the taking up and relaying or repairing the same, the street, road, way, or path, or streets, roads, ways, or paths, where any such works are being carried on should be stopped up or closed against public traffic, if considered necessary, during the progress of such works, or any of them: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Kew, that, from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33, &c., it shall be lawful for the said council to order and direct the closing up or stopping of any street, road, way, or path, within the limits of the municipality, against public traffic, during the progress therein of any or all of the works above described, by any suitable barrier or barriers, or by notice or notices in writing, at the ends or junction of any such street, road, way, or path with any other street, road, way, or path, and to continue such barrier or barriers, notice or notices, until such time as such street, road, way, or path shall be ready and fit for public traffic. And be it further ordered and directed by the authority aforesaid, that if any person or persons shall take down, break, or remove any such barrier or barriers, notice or notices as aforesaid, or proceed along any such street, road, way, or path, without the consent of the said council being first obtained thereto, with any cart, waggon, carriage, or other vehicle, or with any horse, bullock, or other beast of burden, or cattle, whether attached to any such cart, waggon, carriage, or other vehicle or not, during the progress of any such work or works as aforesaid, or until such barrier or barriers, notice or notices, shall have been removed at the instance of the said council, any person or persons so offending shall, upon conviction thereof before one or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

## BYE-LAW No. 10.—FOR PREVENTING DAMAGE TO TREES OR SHRUBS.

WHEREAS, for the better protection of ornamental or other timber trees or shrubs within the limits of this municipality, it is deemed expedient to make the following orders and regulations: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the council of the municipal district of Kew, that, from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief, pursuant to 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 33, &c., any person who shall cut, destroy, or damage any timber tree or shrub on any of the streets, roads, or thoroughfares within the boundaries of this municipality, and being under the control of the municipal council thereof, shall, upon conviction before one or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Ten pounds (£10).

## BYE-LAW No. 33.—A BYE-LAW FOR MAKING AN ASSESSMENT AND IMPOSING A RATE OF ONE SHILLING IN THE POUND FOR THE YEAR 1861.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to assess all property in houses or lands within the limits of such municipal district (except property belonging to and in the occupation of Her Majesty), according to its fair average annual value, and to impose a rate on all such properties for the current year: Be it therefore enacted by the council of the municipal district of Sandhurst, that all the several properties within the limits of the said municipal district shall be assessed for the year 1861 according to the several amounts of annual value respectively affixed to the same in the assessment roll confirmed by the said municipal council, and amounting, after all appeals have been heard, to a total sum of One hundred and thirty thousand three hundred and seventy pounds fourteen shillings and sixpence farthing (£130,370 14s. 6½d.); and also that a rate of One shilling in the pound of said annual value is hereby imposed on all the said properties for the year 1861, to be due and payable on the tenth day of December in the present year.

#### CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be eaten, good, sound, and sweet; the straw to be wheat, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (colonial grown) and bran also to be sound and sweet and of the best description.

2. The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the officer in charge of the district or station, the quantities stated in the schedule being, however, only approximative, and it must be understood that the Government will draw either more or less than stated. The excess over the estimate will, however, in no case exceed 50 per cent.

3. The contracts entered into under this notice are not to be considered as being infringed or vitiated by any contracts made by the military commissariat.

4. The forage when delivered must be accompanied by an invoice of quantity, showing the gross weight, the tare, and the net weight (this should be on the back of the requisition or order), which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

5. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account, monthly, in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the district, as may be indicated on the account.

6. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours from a reasonable time to be fixed on the order, it will be competent for the department, should circumstances require it, to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage, as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of a proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when from some other cause injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 6.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent for the Government Storekeeper on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice only can be given from the first day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th April, 1862.
