## PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

## WOODEND.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of the petition hereinafter set forth, signed by One hundred and fifty-six householders, resident at and near Woodend, in the county of Dalhousie, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders resident in the township and district of Woodend, in the county of Dalhousie, and represent that their locality has greatly increased in importance, and now contains a population of resident householders larger than that required under the Municipal Institutions Act.

They therefore request that it may be erected into a municipal district, and suggest an area of six square miles for the same, bounded as follows, viz.:—"On the west by the Campaspe River; on the south by the boundary of the parish of Woodend and sixty chains into the parish of Newham; on the east by a road running north-east to a point four miles and ten chains distant from the southern boundary; and on the north by a road running west to the Mount Alexander road; and thence by a line in continuation to the Campaspe River."

And the petitioners pray as follows, viz.:—"That as the formation of such municipality will be of the greatest benefit to this township and district, your petitioners humbly pray that your Excellency will be pleased to take this their petition into your consideration, and to grant its prayer."

## MUNICIPALITY OF MARYBOROUGH.

BYE-LAW NO. 20.—FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING PUBLIC CARTERS AND WATER DRAWERS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the said Act, to make bye-laws for the regulation and licensing of public carriers, carters, water drawers, &c.:

Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Maryborough, that every owner of every cart or dray used for hire within the said municipal district shall register his name and place of abode in the municipal office, and if the council think fit shall thereupon receive a license, on which shall be written or printed his name and place of abode, and the number of his license; such licenses to be issued or renewed quarterly on the first day of January, May, July, and October, for all or any part of the ensuing three months; and such owner shall have the number of his license, with his name, legibly painted and conspicuously affixed to the right or off side of the

cart or dray: Provided always, that in case the owner shall have more than one cart or dray plying for hire, he shall take out a license for each and every such cart or dray, in the same manner as though they belonged to different owners.

Be it further ordered and directed, that every public water-carrier plying within the said municipal district shall register his name and place of abode in the town clerk's office, at the same times as hereinbefore ordered that public carters shall do; and if the council shall think fit shall thereupon receive a license, on which shall be written or printed his name and place of abode, the number of the license, and also the reward and amounts which the council shall agree from time to time to pay to water-carriers supplying water in cases of fire. The number of the license and owner's name must be legibly painted and conspicuously affixed to each water-cart; and further, every public water-carrier shall have the word "water-cart" and the number of his license legibly painted and affixed in a manner conspicuous to passers-by and the public, on the outside of his residence or the premises where the said water-cart is placed at night. And further be it ordered, the better to guard against accidents by fire, that the owners of all public water-carts shall keep their water-carts constantly loaded with water during the night, and also if called upon by this council, or any officer duly authorised by this council, shall with all due diligence, and to the best of their ability, supply water for the extinguishing of any fire that may occur on property within this municipal boundary; and any water-carrier who shall fail without reasonable cause to keep his water-cart so loaded, or refuse or neglect to supply water to fires when called upon as aforesaid, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter imposed.

It shall be lawful for the treasurer of this municipal council to pay out of the municipal funds such rewards to the water-carriers who shall supply the first and second loads of water, and such amounts to those supplying water after the second load, in all cases of fire in the municipality, as the council shall from time to time appoint.

Any person committing any act against the provisions of this bye-law, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions or regulations contained herein, shall, upon conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 20, made by the municipal council of Melbourne, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria and the Legislative Council thereof, 19 Victoria No. 16, intituled, *An Act to amend an Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is hereby enacted that no toll, rate, or due shall be imposed by the council of any municipal district save by bye-law, subject to the assent of the Governor, as in the said recited Act mentioned: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Maldon, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, as required by the provisions of the said Act, the hereinafter rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be and be taken to be the rate on the assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of the municipal district of Maldon aforesaid for the current year ending the 10th day of September, 1862, to be and remain in force until a new rate be made by the said municipal council, as required by the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No 15, sec. 33.

7. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage, as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of a department, and the decision of the board to be considered final.

8. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of a proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 6.

9.
