MUNICIPALITY OF MARYBOROUGH.

MUNICIPALITY OF MARYBOROUGH.

BYE-LAW NO. 20.—FOR LICENSING AND REGULATING PUBLIC CARTERS AND WATER DRAWERS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it is amongst other things onacted that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district established under the provisions of the sud Act, to make byelaws for the regulation and licensing of public carriers, carters, water drawers, &c.:

Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Maryborough, that every owner of every cart or dray used for hire within the said municipal district shall register his name and place of abode in the municipal office, and if the council think fit shall thereupon receive a license, on which shall be written or printed his name and place of abode, and the number of his license; such licenses to be issued or renewed quarterly on the first day of January, May, July, and October, for all or any part of the ensuing three months; and such owner shall have the number of his license, with his name, legibly painted and conspicuously affixed to the right or off side of the

cart or dray: Provided always, that in case the owner shall have more than one cart or dray plying for hire, he shall take out a license for each and every such cart or dray, in the same manner as though they belonged to different owners.

Be it further ordered and directed, that every public water-carter plying within the said municipal district shall register his name and place of abode in the town clork's ollice, at the same times as hereinbefore ordered that public carters shall do; and if the council shall think fit shall thereupon receive a license, on which shall be written or printed his name and place of abode, the number of the license, and also the reward and amounts which the council shall agree from time to time to pay to water-carters supplying water in cases of fire. The number of the license and owner's name must be legibly painted and conspicuously affixed to each water-cart; and further, every public water-carter shall have the word "water-cart" and the number of his license legibly painted and allived in a numner conspicuous to passers-by and the public, on the outside of his residence or the premises where the said water-cart is placed at night. And further be it ordered, the better to guard against accidents by fire, that the owners of all public water-carts shall keep their water-carts constantly loaded with water during the night, and also if called upon by this council, or any officer duly authorised by this council, shall with all due diligence, and to the best of their ability, supply water for the extinguishing of any fire that may occur on property within this municipal boundary; and any water-carter who shall fail without reasonable cause to keep his water-cart so loaded, or refuse or neglect to supply water to fires when called upon as aforesaid, shall be liable to the penalty hereinaffor imposed.

It shall be lawful for the treasurer of this municipal council to pay out of the municipal funds such rewards to the water-carters who shall supply the first and second loads of water, a

foregoing Bye-law, No. 20, made by the municipal council Muryborough, has been assented to by the Governor in ouncil.

YE-LAW NO. 23.—FOR AN ASSESSMENT OF THE ANNUAL VALUE OF ALL PROPERTY IN HOUSES AND LANDS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF MALDON, FOR THE CURRENT YEAR ENDING 10TH SETTEMBER, 1862.

FOR THE CURENT YEAR INDING 10TH SPITTEREER, 1862.

WHEREAS by an Act of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria and the Legislative Council thereof, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the extabilishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it is enacted that the council of any municipal district shall make an annual assessment of all property in houses and lands within the limits of such district, according to its fair annual value: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of the district of Maldon, that the assessment on the annual value of property within the said municipal district of Maldon, as prepared by Richard Braddon, the assessment amounting, after all appeals have been heard, to the sum of Twenty-one thousand one hundred and twenty-five pounds (£21,125) sterling, and contained in forty-rac (41) pages or sheets of paper, and sized by the chairman at this meeting, shall be the assessment or value upon which a rate for the current year shall be levied, and shall be leval and in force for the municipal year commencing on the 10th day of September, 1862.

BYE-LAW NO. 24.—TO IMPOSE A RATE OF ONE SHILLING AND SIXPERCE IN THE POUND ON AN ASSESSMENT OF ALL PROPERTY IN HOUSES AND LANDS WITHIN THE LIMITS OF THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF MALDON, FOR THE CURRENT YEAR ENDING IOTH SEPTEMBER, 1862.

WHEREAS by an Act of His Excellency the Governor of Victoria and the Legislative Council thereof, 19 Victoria No. 16, intituled, An Act to amend an Act for the establishment of Manicipal Institutions in Victoria, it is hereby enacted that no toil, rate, or due shall be imposed by the council of any municipal district save by bye-law, subject to the assent of the Governor, as in the said recited Act mentioned: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council for the district of Maldon, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of the said Act, the hereinafter rate of One shilling and sixpence in the pound shall be and be taken to be the rate on the assessment of all property in honese and lands within the limits of the municipal district of Maldon aforesaid, for the current year ending the 10th day of September, 1862, to be and remain in force until a new rate be made by the said municipal council, as required by the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No 15, sec. 33.
