REGULATION RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS.

(Issued under the Amended Audit Act, 22 Victoria No. 86, section 2.)

IN cases where the Commissioner of Trade and Customs is satisfied that a refund of duties is justly due, the necessity for such refunds arising either from overpayment of duty or from any error, the repayment may be granted.

This regulation, however, shall not apply to any drawback, refund, or omission authorised by the Customs Act 1857, nor sanction any refund or remission disallowed by the Customs Act 1857.

In order to facilitate refunds the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may obtain from the Governor a *quarterly authority* under the 32nd clause of the regulations respecting public accounts, dated 1st May, 1859, instead of a *special authority* as is now required by the 35th clause of the regulations.

This regulation shall have force from the 1st January, 1861.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT.

SMYTHESDALE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-five householders resident at Smythesdale, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

R. HEALES.

The petitioners state that the township of Smythesdale is situated in the centre of a very extensive mining district; that the dwellings of the inhabitants are of a substantial character, and have been erected at considerable expense; and that there are more than 300 householders resident within the boundaries of the township.

That no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets of the township, which consequently are sometimes nearly impassable, and over which very heavy machinery and merchandise have to be carried at great risk and expense; and that the erection of the township into a municipal district will tend greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government.

The petitioners suggest that the boundaries of the township specified in the *Government Gazette* [of 19th April, 1859, page 508] be the boundaries of the municipality.

And the petitioners pray as follows, viz.:

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality under the name of 'The Municipal District of Smythesdale,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

THE BELLARINE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations of the Bellarine General Cemetery under 17 Victoria No. 12.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Any person or persons making a vault or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person and his representatives for ever.

3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission in the form set out in schedule B will be granted to the party applying for such permission on payment of the charges in schedule A.

4. Orders for interment to be given either to the keeper at the lodge, or at the office of the trustees, on the previous day, between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves or vaults must construct them under the direction of the surveyor to the trustees, or any other person appointed by them for that purpose; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The hour fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. throughout the rest of the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.

11. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

12. The ground will be opened daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

13. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule; and registers of all permissions are kept by the secretary.

14. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the 14th section of the abovementioned Act of Council, and is liable to a penalty of £20, or, at the discretion of the justice, to three months imprisonment, and to the payment of all damages therefor.

15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules and regulations.
