REGULATION RESPECTING PUBLIC ACCOUNTS. (Issued under the Amended Audit Act, 22 Victoria No. 86, section 2.)

IN cases where the Commissioner of Trade and Customs is satisfied that a refund of duties is justly due, the necessity for such refunds arising either from overpayment of duty or from any error, the repayment may be granted.

This regulation, however, shall not apply to any drawback, refund, or omission authorised by the Customs Act 1857, nor sanction any refund or remission disallowed by the Customs Act 1857.

In order to facilitate refunds the Commissioner of Trade and Customs may obtain from the Governor a *quarterly authority* under the 32nd clause of the regulations respecting public accounts, dated 1st May, 1859, instead of a *special authority* as is now required by the 35th clause of the regulations.

This regulation shall have force from the 1st January, 1861.

PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT.

SMYTHESDALE.

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-five householders resident at Smythesdale, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that the township of Smythesdale is situated in the centre of a very extensive mining district; that the dwellings of the inhabitants are of a substantial character, and have been erected at considerable expense; and that there

are more than 300 householders resident within the boundaries of the township.

That no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets of the township, which consequently are sometimes nearly impassable, and over which very heavy machinery and merchandise have to be carried at great risk and expense; and that the erection of the township into a municipal district will tend greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government.

The petitioners suggest that the boundaries of the township specified in the *Government Gazette* [of 19th April, 1859, page 808] be the boundaries of the municipality.

And the petitioners pray as follows, viz. :—

“Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality under the name of ‘The Municipal District of Smythesdale,’ according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15.”

Having a large overdraft at the bank, the necessary public
 works alone have been carried out, and a strict regard to
 economy has been exercised over the whole finance department,
 by which means the overdraft is being reduced. The metal for
 the maintenance of the roads forms a large item in the expendi-
 ture for public works, but it was considered necessary to obtain
 a supply of it during the fine weather as the facilities for
 procuring it are then greater, and it is furnished at a cheaper
 rate than during the winter months.

As a large amount of rates remained uncollected at the close
 of the year 1860, the council on the 15th of January instant
 elected Mr. J. Larnach as assistant rate collector for one month,
 by which means they are now being collected more satisfactorily,
 and the council have reason to believe that by a diligent col-
 lection of the revenue, and a judicious application of the same,
 they will be enabled in a few months to pay off the whole of the
 overdraft at the bank, and thereby release the funds from their
 present liability.

With the view of carrying out further public works and permanent improvements, the council have framed a bye-law to empower them to borrow the sum of £12,000 on the credit of the municipal income, at a rate of interest not exceeding £8 per centum per annum, which bye-law has been duly forwarded to, and is now waiting the approval of, His Excellency the Governor.

APPLICATIONS TO GOVERNMENT.

To have the river boundary extended from the banks to the middle.—This has been granted.

Also, that the breakwater may be put in an efficient state before the burden of keeping it in repair is thrown on the council; in this application the town council of Geelong warmly united.—An answer which it is hoped will be favorable is expected shortly.

Also, to form and make footpaths and channelling on the embankments to the Barwon bridge.—The Government in reply declined, but another application has been forwarded.

The Government forwarded to the council a tracing of the proposed town common for approval; the same was approved of and returned, and, in accordance with the request of the Government, rules and regulations for the governance of the same were also forwarded, and the council are in daily expectation of hearing further on the subject.

In accordance with a request of the Government to take steps in the matter, the following gentlemen have been nominated as trustees of the Botanic Garden Reserve, at the junction of the Moorabool and Barwon River, to act with a similar number of trustees, to be nominated by the inhabitants of Newtown and Chilwell, viz.:—Messrs. A. Mackenzie, T. Adcock, J. Matthews, and J. Herd.

At the municipal conference, held in Melbourne, the chairman represented this council, and was elected one of the standing committee of the conference. This has necessitated his frequent attendance in Melbourne.

The tolls have been leased to Mr. J. E. Thomas for the year 1861, at £45 per week.

Contracts are in hand to finish metalling the Colac road, for work on the Germantown road, and for supply of metal.

Tenders are about to be called to erect a bridge over the Waurin Ponds, on the Mount Colite road, and works on other roads.

SANDHURST MUNICIPALITY.
TENTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT.

REPORT of the proceedings of the Municipal Council of Sandhurst for the half-year ending 10th January, 1861.

PUBLIC WORKS.
The works completed during the past half-year, or now in progress, are the formation of parts of Wattle street, Nolan street, Mundy street, Lucan street, Mitchell street, Bullock Creek road, and Bridge lane; the construction of road the entire length of Raglan street; kerbing and channelling in Hargreaves street, High street B, Plumridge street, Mitchell street, and Forest street; flagging footpath in William street; drains and footpaths Lytletton terrace, Bayne street, Lower Bridge street, Molvor road, and from Forest street and View place; the levelling, fencing, and planting of open space in Pall Mall; the erection of cattle market; cutting furrows round the municipal boundary, with many other minor works, and the general maintenance of existing works, at a total cost of £2533 19s. 6d.

The expenditure for lighting, sweeping, prevention of fires, &c., has amounted to £224 17s. 9d. for the half-year.

BYE-LAWS PASSED.

No. 25.—For the better regulation of public vehicles.
No. 26.—For making the assessment and rate for the year.
No. 27.—For the prevention of fires, fencing in of waste lands, &c.

FINANCE.

The sum of £2703 4s. 6d. has been received from the Government as balance of the grant-in-aid for 1860.

The assessment for the year 1860 numbers 4025 properties, amounting to £141,416, on which a rate of 1s. 6d. in the pound has been levied, giving as the total amount of rate for the year £10,606 4s.

The sum of £300 has been received from the Government for improvement of public reserves in consideration of the council expending an equivalent amount for the same purpose.

The amount received for market dues and tolls for the half-year is £1050 8s. 4d., making the total revenue under this head for the entire year £2213 4s. 10d.

MISCELLANEOUS.

For the prevention of fires, besides passing a bye-law to check the erection of inflammable buildings in crowded localities, the council have purchased the fire-engine belonging to the Government, which would otherwise have been removed from the town; have established a small paid brigade in lieu of the No. 2 volunteer brigade dissolved; and have also agreed to give grants-in-aid to No. 1 volunteer fire brigade equal to any amount the brigade can raise from other sources.

The cattle market having been at last proclaimed, the necessary works have been put in progress, and the market will very shortly be opened.

The municipal conference referred to in the last half-yearly report has been held in Melbourne, and attended by Councillor Strickland as the delegate from the council.

The difficulty attending a proper consideration by the Government of the necessity of a bridge for the main road at View Point, induced the council to send Councillors Casey and O'Keefe as a deputation to the Government on this subject, and the result was that £1500 has been placed on the estimates to be expended for the purpose, provided the municipal council furnished the like amount.

Several applications have been made to the Government in furtherance of the public accommodation, but with little success, except the establishment of a direct mail to Inglewood.

In consequence of the reported appearance of scarlatina in the district, the council have had several meetings as local board of health to take such steps as the reports of their health officer rendered advisable, and have also found funds for the purchase of disinfectants, the payment of nurses, and such other disbursements, as any reported cases occurred.

PUBLIC ABATTOIRS.

WHEREAS by the second section of an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend an Act intituled An Act to provide for the establishment of Public Abattoirs in the City of Melbourne, and for preventing certain Nuisances therein*, it is enacted, that from and after the expiration of twenty days from the completion of any abattoir under the provisions of that Act, notice whereof shall have been given in the *Government Gazette*, it shall not be lawful for any person to slaughter, or cause to be slaughtered, any cattle, or any sheep, lamb, pig, or goat, within the boundaries of the said city, or within one mile of the said boundaries, except at abattoirs erected by the said city council, or any municipal council, either in existing abattoirs or elsewhere, and that any person who shall so offend shall forfeit and pay on conviction for every such offence any sum not exceeding Ten pounds.
