FARMERS' COMMONS.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of parliament holden in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the petition of not less than ten occupiers of not less than five hundred acres of adjacent purchased land, to proclaim that any Crown lands within five miles of such purchased land (the area of such Crown lands not being more than three times the area of the purchased land) shall be a Common for the use of such occupiers of the said purchased land as shall cultivate at least one-fourth of his or their purchased land, and every such common shall be called, a "Farmers' Common;" provided that nothing in the now reciting section shall be deemed or taken to prevent any such lands from being sold under the said Act upon the application of persons desirous of purchasing the same; and it is also enacted that the Governor in Council shall have full power from time to time to make any rules and regulations for imposing any conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common upon any Farmers' Common: And whereas the occupiers of purchased land in or near the localities hereinafter mentioned have petitioned for Farmers' Commons in accordance with the said Act: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be FARMERS' COMMONS for the use of the occupiers of purchased land within the meaning and intention and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and also under and subject to such conditions or limitations on the exercise of the right of common as may be hereafter prescribed, that is to say:—

BACCHUS MARSH FARMERS' COMMON, COUNTY OF BOURKE, PARISH OF COIMADAI.—Extent, about 4500 acres: Commencing at the north-east angle of section 2 A, parish of Coimadai; bounded on the south by sections 2 A and 2; on the east by the Lerderg River; on the south by portions 9 and 1 of section 22, parish of Korkuperimul; on the west by section 8, parish of Myrniong, and by a line bearing north about 2 miles 30 chains; on the north by a line bearing east about 3 miles to Goodman's Creek; and on the east by Goodman's Creek to commencing point, exclusive of quarries.

BLACKWOOD AND MYRNIONG FARMERS' COMMON, COUNTY OF BOURKE, PARISH OF BLACKWOOD.—Extent, about 4800 acres: Commencing at a point on the Korjannunip Creek about 30 chains north-west from the north-west angle of portion 4 of section 8, parish of Blackwood; bounded on the north by a line bearing east about 5 miles to the road to the township of Blackwood passing by Mount Blackwood; on the east by the same road and part of the Korobeit Creek; and on the south and west by the road to Greendale, the north boundary of Greendale township, alienated lands, and Korjannunip Creek, to commencing point.

**PETITION UNDER THE MUNICIPAL INSTITUTIONS ACT.
SMYTHESDALE.**

IN pursuance of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to His Excellency as hereinafter set forth, signed by one hundred and fifty-five householders resident at Smythesdale, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that the township of Smythesdale is situated in the centre of a very extensive mining district; that the dwellings of the inhabitants are of a substantial character, and have been erected at considerable expense; and that there are more than 300 householders resident within the boundaries of the township.

That no provision exists for the formation and maintenance of the roads and streets of the township, which consequently are sometimes nearly impassable, and over which very heavy machinery and merchandise have to be carried at great risk and expense; and that the erection of the township into a municipal district will tend greatly to advance its interests and materially aid its improvement and good government.

The petitioners suggest that the boundaries of the township specified in the *Government Gazette* [of 19th April, 1859, page 808] be the boundaries of the municipality.

And the petitioners pray as follows, viz.:-

"Your petitioners therefore humbly pray that the district so defined may be proclaimed a municipality under the name of 'The Municipal District of Smythesdale,' according to the provisions of the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15."

WHEREAS by an Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intitled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the conducting of elections (18 Victoria No. 15, section 26).

Elections to be taken by ballot.—Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of Gisborne, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, the chairman of the municipal council of Gisborne, or his deputy or deputies, be hereby severally empowered to take elections by ballot to supply vacancies occurring, from time to time, in the municipal council of Gisborne, in like manner, as far as the case may apply, as elections by ballot are now, from time to time, taken to supply

vacancies in the Legislative Council and Assembly of Victoria, according to the provisions to that effect in the Act of Council 19 Victoria No. 12, intitled, *An Act for the election of Members, &c.*

MUNICIPALITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BYE-LAW No. 27.—FOR AUTHORISING THE RAISING THE SUM OF FIFTEEN HUNDRED POUNDS BY WAY OF MORTGAGE ON THE INCOME OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

(Under 18 Victoria No. 15, sec. 36.)

WHEREAS the revenue of the Municipal Council of Warrnambool, from municipal rates for the three years ending third January last, amounted to Two thousand nine hundred and eighty-two pounds: And whereas the Municipal Council of Warrnambool are desirous of borrowing by mortgage or otherwise, on credit of their income from municipal rates, the sum of Fifteen hundred pounds, at interest at the rate of not exceeding Ten pounds per centum per annum, for the purpose of carrying on and maintaining the tramroad between the new jetty and the town of Warrnambool, and to pay for iron rails and other permanent improvements; such sum, with interest at the rate aforesaid, to be repaid by half-yearly payments: And whereas by Bye-law No. 10 the sanction of His Excellency the Governor and the Executive Council have been given for the formation of said tramroad: Be it therefore enacted, that from and after this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor and the Executive Council, it shall and may be lawful for the said municipal council to borrow, on mortgage or otherwise of municipal rates, the sum of Fifteen hundred pounds, at interest, at the rate of not exceeding Ten pounds per centum per annum, for the purpose aforesaid.

BALLAARAT DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

A BYE-LAW TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

THE business of the board shall be conducted with open doors, except on special occasions, when any one member may require the exclusion of strangers until it shall have been decided by the board whether the question proposed to be introduced shall be discussed with open doors.

2. The board shall commence business so soon after the time notified as there is a sufficient number of members in attendance to constitute a quorum; but if, at the expiry of half-an-hour from the time specified, there is not a quorum present, no business shall be transacted by the board at the meeting.

3. Three members shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of the board, and if, at any day named for a meeting, such number shall not be present at the hour at which the business ought to be commenced, such fact, together with the names of the members present, shall be recorded in the minute book by the secretary.

4. The minutes of any preceding meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board, in order to their confirmation, and no discussion shall be permitted thereupon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

5. At all meetings of the board (except otherwise provided by law), the reading of correspondence unconnected with the orders of the day, the presentation of petitions by members of the board, and bringing up of reports of committees, shall have precedence of the regular business.

6. Every petition or memorial addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and be presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

7. On the presentation of a petition, no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given as hereinafter provided, and the only questions that shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be, that the petition be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

8. No report of a committee shall be considered or adopted on its presentation, nor until due notice shall be given. All such reports shall be read and received *pro forma*, and, if ordered by the board, printed for distribution among the members.

9. If, in the report of a committee, there are distinct recommendations contained in such report, such report shall not be adopted until the sense of the board has been taken separately on each.

10. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration; any member of the board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be given in writing to the secretary at least six clear days previous to the meeting at which the same is to be taken into consideration; and all such notices of motion shall be considered in the order in which they were given.

11. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some one authorised by him, be present when the business is called on. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

12. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next

meeting of the board regularly convened; and every such bye-law shall, in the interim, remain open for the inspection of any of the ratepayers, in the office of the board, free of charge.

13. No motion in which it is proposed to take action on any petition, or in which it is proposed to adopt any address, bye-law, or standing order, shall be entertained unless the mover shall submit therewith a draft of such petition, bye-law, or standing order; and the draft so submitted shall in no case be taken into consideration until it shall have been referred to the legislative committee, who shall report thereon; and the mover of every such proposition shall be *pro hac vice* a member of such committee.

14. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be *pro hac vice* a member of such committee.

15. Before any motion is put from the chair, in case the mover is not prepared with his motion in writing, the secretary shall take down the same in writing, and obtain signatures of the mover and the seconder.

16. It shall be competent for any member, without previous notice, to move for a call of the whole board, for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting; and upon such motion being carried, due notice thereof shall be given by the secretary to each member of the board, by post, of the day for which the order of the day or notice of motion for which such call is made is set down for consideration; and any member not in attendance when such order of the day or notice of motion comes under consideration, or not in attendance at the voting upon such question or any amendment thereof, shall be liable to a penalty of Ten shillings, unless reasonable cause for such absence be shown to the satisfaction of the board.

17. On any motion being put from the chair, the secretary shall enter in the minute book the names of the members who voted thereon, and specify whether such members voted for or against the motion so put from the chair.

18. All reports sent in to the board by any member or members thereof, or by any officer of the board, shall be written on sheets of large foolscap paper, on one side only, a broad margin being left so that they can be properly bound together.

19. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

20. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

21. No member shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the amendment last proposed; and the chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the board, call to order any member proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment. After the reply the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

22. The chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule of precedent applicable to the case, without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final *pro hac vice* in each case.

23. The chairman shall stand up when addressing the board in discussion of any question.

24. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately upon the same being used.

25. Any member may, of right, require the production of any of the documents of the board relating to the question or matter in discussion.

26. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time; but if lost, another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried, it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but not more.

27. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the board, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and for all purposes of subsequent discussion the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

28. The chairman shall, on taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative, and then in the negative; and he may do so as often as is necessary to enable him to form and declare his opinion, from the show of hands, as to which party has the majority.

29. The board shall vote in all cases by show of hands.

30. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

31. Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, provided such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the board. Notice of intention to protest must however, in every case, be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest, signed by the member or members protesting, and specifying the reason for protesting, must be entered before the next regular meeting of the board by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the secretary's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of the board; the same to be considered also a part of such minutes.

32. No motion the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the board, shall be entertained during the same year, unless a call of the whole board has been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board which shall have been negatived by the board shall again be entertained after the expiration of six months.

33. A notice of motion may be dispensed with in cases of emergency where the board considers it necessary to do so, there being not more than one member absent at such board meeting.

34. No election to any office at the disposal of the board shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers, inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

At a meeting of the Ballarat District Road Board, held at the Ipad Room, Learmonth, within the said district, on the twenty-first day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the foregoing bye-law was adopted, and was ordered to be forwarded to His Excellency the Governor for his approval, in accordance with the provisions of Act of Council 16 Victoria No. 40, sec. IV.

Having a large overdraft at the bank, the necessary public works alone have been carried out, and a strict regard to economy has been exercised over the whole finance department, by which means the overdraft is being reduced. The metal for the maintenance of the roads forms a large item in the expenditure for public works, but it was considered necessary to obtain a supply of it during the fine weather as the facilities for procuring it are then greater, and it is furnished at a cheaper rate than during the winter months.

As a large amount of rates remained uncollected at the close of the year 1860, the council on the 15th of January instant elected Mr. J. Larnach as assistant rate collector for one month, by which means they are now being collected more satisfactorily, and the council have reason to believe that by a diligent collection of the revenue, and a judicious application of the same, they will be enabled in a few months to pay off the whole of the overdraft at the bank; and thereby release the funds from their present liability.

With the view of carrying out further public works and permanent improvements, the council have framed a bye-law to empower them to borrow the sum of £12,000 on the credit of the municipal income, at a rate of interest not exceeding £8 per centum per annum, which bye-law has been duly forwarded to, and is now waiting the approval of, His Excellency the Governor.


