THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power in him vested in this behalf by the Act 24 Victoria No. 117, has, by divers Orders made on the 25th day of February, 1861, temporarily reserved from sale the lands hereinafter described, for the several purposes specified in connection with each description.

DESCRIPTION OF THE LANDS.

VICTORIA VOLUNTEER ENGINEER CORPS.

The following Rules and Regulations, adopted by the members of the Victoria Volunteer Engineer Corps, having been approved by the Governor in Council, are now published for general information.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

CONSTITUTION OF THE CORPS.

1. The corps shall consist of architects, civil engineers, surveyors, their assistants, and mechanics connected with the above professions exclusively. No person to be admitted under the age of eighteen years.
2. The constitution of the corps to be military, and its drill and duties to assimilate to those of the Royal Engineers as closely as is consistent with the circumstances of the colony and the terms of the Volunteer Act.
3. The corps shall be open to all persons following the professions and trades above indicated; each candidate for admission to be proposed and seconded by members of the corps; the election to be determined by ballot, and a majority of five-sixths of the members present shall be required to sanction admission.
4. The name, occupation, and address of every candidate for admission to the corps shall be posted up in the orderly room at least one week prior to the day of election; the candidate to be proposed at an ordinary meeting for drill or other purposes, and to be balloted for at the next following meeting.
5. Every person on joining the corps shall sign a declaration, to the effect that he is a member of one of the professions or callings above enumerated; and should it be afterwards discovered that he has misrepresented his vocation, he shall be liable to dismissal from the corps.
6. The corps shall have power to construct its own bye-laws, subject to the approval of the officer commanding; provided always that such bye-laws are not opposed to the spirit of the general regulations for the governance of the corps.
7. The corps shall be under the direction of the senior officer of Royal Engineers in the colony, as regards its instruction in military engineering, &c. This officer will act as president of the board of examiners hereinafter detailed.

ACTING GRADES.

8. Until the appointment of a permanent staff the acting grades shall, if required, be selected as follows:—
9. Previous to the first examination they shall be taken in numerical order from a roll of the corps.
10. After the first examination they shall also be taken in numerical order from those who have passed successfully.
11. The acting grades to be changed at periods of not more than one month, and any member failing to act, the next in rotation to take his place.
12. The officer commanding shall be empowered to suspend the rotation of the acting grades on any special occasion when he may deem it necessary, and to appoint the acting grades for the time being.

PROVISIONAL MANAGEMENT.

13. Pending the appointment of permanent officers, the ordinary business of the corps to be managed by a committee of seven members, to be proposed, seconded, and elected by ballot at a general meeting; convened for that purpose. The committee to appoint one of its members to be chairman, and another to act as secretary.
14. A treasurer to be also elected by ballot at the same general meeting.

PERMANENT APPOINTMENTS.

15. When, in the opinion of the commanding officer, the corps is sufficiently advanced in drill and general training to be placed upon a permanent basis, the commanding officer shall hold an examination for the appointment of the first grade of non-commissioned officers, and subsequent examinations for the successively higher grades shall be held at such times as the commanding officer shall think fit. The acting grades to continue in force until the corresponding ranks are permanently filled.
16. No member shall be eligible for examination until he has served at least three months as a private, nor shall he be qualified for any promotion until he shall have passed the examination for the same, and for each lower grade at intervals of not less than three months. No member to be passed for more than one grade at each examination except as hereinafter provided for absentees.
17. Any member, from causes over which he has no control, unable to attend an examination for which he is qualified, can (by previously sending in a written notice to that effect, if the reasons be deemed sufficient by the commanding officer) obtain permission to enter for two grades at the next examination.
18. The members who have passed an examination without being promoted shall receive certificates entitling them to enter the examination for the next higher grade, and on a requisition, signed by not less than six duly qualified members, the commanding officer shall be empowered, if he think fit, to hold an examination after the permanent appointments are made for the purpose of granting pass certificates.

BOARD OF EXAMINERS.

19. The senior officer of Royal Engineers shall be empowered to select not less than three duly qualified persons to act with him as a board to examine candidates for promotion, as vacancies occur or an increase of the staff may become necessary. The board to report all such examinations to the commanding officer for his approval prior to any appointment being made.

20. The examinations to be in such studies and drill as may be approved by the president of the board of examiners, and no candidate shall be allowed to pass unless he has obtained the minimum number of marks (to be fixed by the president of the board of examiners) on each of the subjects for examination.

ADDRESS.

21. Any member changing his permanent address must give notice of the same in writing to the officer commanding within fourteen days of such change, under a penalty of Five shillings.
22. Any member of the corps intending to be absent from his usual address for a period of more than three months, must give notice of the same in writing to the officer commanding, and deposit his arms and accoutrements in the regimental store, under penalty of Ten shillings.

DRILL.

23. Every member on joining shall attend recruit drill, and shall not be supplied with uniform until dismissed such drill.
24. Every member of the corps, after having been dismissed recruit drill, shall attend at least three-fourths of the drills ordered during the period of instruction.
25. The names of all members attending drill shall be taken down in a book to be kept for such purpose, and any member whose name shall not appear on such attendance book shall be deemed to have been absent, unless reasonable excuse shall be forwarded to the officer in command within twenty-four hours from the termination of such drill.
26. Any member coming late may report himself to the officer in command, assigning a reason for his late arrival at drill, such reason, if deemed sufficient, the member shall be considered as having been present, provided he is permitted to fall in.
27. Every member will be liable to be sent to instruction drill, by order of the commanding officer, for want of knowledge occasioned by absence or other cause.

REGIMENTAL PROPERTY, UNIFORM, ETC.

28. Every member shall be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing, and any damage done thereto must be made good by him if not caused in the performance of his duty.
29. No changes whatever shall be made in the uniform of the regiment unless published in regimental orders and agreed to at a general meeting.
30. Any person ceasing to be a member of the corps must forward his uniform and other regimental property in his possession to the officer in command, or in default he will be prosecuted according to law.
31. Any member leaving or expelled the corps within twelve months of receipt of new uniform, shall be liable to pay the contract price for the same.

MEETINGS.

32. The officer commanding the corps shall be empowered at any time to convene a special general meeting.
33. On a requisition signed by not less than fifteen members, the commanding officer shall call a special general meeting, giving not less than seven days' notice. No business shall be transacted other than that notified in such requisition.
34. At every general meeting the senior officer present shall be chairman.
35. No person shall be permitted to speak to any question more than once (unless in explanation), except the mover, who will be entitled to a reply.
36. All motions must be delivered to the chairman in writing, and shall be decided by the holding up of hands, unless a division be demanded by two or more members.
37. No protest can be received.
38. No meeting shall be adjourned or dissolved without a motion to that effect being agreed to.

ARREST.

39. Any member of the corps is liable to be placed under arrest under the following circumstances:—
40. By order of the officer commanding the corps, pending investigation of any charge.
41. By the senior officer present, for any misconduct in uniform, in which case the person so placed in arrest must, without remark or altercation, proceed immediately and change his dress.
42. No member placed under arrest shall wear his uniform until released.
43. Non-compliance with any part of this rule shall render any such member liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

COURTS MARTIAL.

44. The commanding officer may at any time order a court martial.
45. A court martial has power to censure, fine, or expel.
46. Any member feeling himself aggrieved may demand a court martial.
47. All courts martial shall consist of seven members, of the age of twenty-one years and upwards (including the president), of whom one at least shall be commissioned or non-commissioned officer; the president shall be appointed by the commanding officer, and the other members shall be taken from a roster.
48. A list of members composing any such court martial will be given to the member accused, who, on showing sufficient cause, may challenge any member or members not exceeding half the number.
49. The order observed on such courts martial will be as nearly as possible in accordance with that in force in Her Majesty's army.
50. The decision of a court martial, subject to the confirmation of His Excellency the Governor or his representative, shall be final.
51. All regimental communications from members of the corps, of whatever rank, are to be addressed to the officer in command.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is empowered to make bye-laws for the general good rule and government thereof: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Dunolly, that it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to turn loose, or allow to be at large, or to wander upon any public road, street, reserve, or thoroughfare, within the boundaries hereinafter set forth and described, within the municipal district of Dunolly, any cow, bull, ox, or any cattle whatsoever, or any horse, ass, mule, sheep, goat, or swine, belonging to him, her, or them, or under his, her, or their care.

Be it further ordered and enacted, that this bye-law shall henceforth extend and take effect within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Camp street on the north to Orms street on the south, and from Hospital street on the east to Maude street on the west.

And any person or persons so offending shall, upon conviction thereof, before any two or more justices of the peace for the said district, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum or penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is amongst other things enacted, that every such municipal council may also make such bye-laws as may be necessary for the care and maintenance of the destitute poor and sick, and the general good rule and government of such municipal district: And whereas many of the destitute poor and sick of the municipal district of St. Kilda are at present relieved and taken care of by the Ladies' St. Kilda Benevolent Society in a more efficient manner than can otherwise be provided by the municipal council: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the council of the municipal district of St. Kilda, that it shall be lawful for the said council to appropriate such sums as may to them seem desirable in aid of the said St. Kilda Ladies' Benevolent Society, and any other society or institution that may hereafter be formed within the said municipal district having for its (or their) object the relief or maintenance of the destitute poor and sick, as contributions for such maintenance and relief: Provided, nevertheless, that the aggregate of such contributions shall not exceed in any municipal year the sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds sterling.

MUNICIPALITY OF SANDRIDGE.

BYE-LAW No. 5.—FOR THE REGULATION OF PUBLIC VEHICLES WITHIN THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF SANDRIDGE.

WHEREAS by Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the council of any municipal district may make bye-laws for the regulation of public vehicles: Be it therefore enacted by the municipal council of Sandridge, with the assent of His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief of Victoria:—

1. That such places as the said municipal council shall from time to time appoint shall be stands for public vehicles plying for hire within the municipal district aforesaid; provided that the said council may from time to time, as they shall see fit, alter the situations and number of the said stands so appointed and of the vehicles on each stand; and that six clear days' notice of such appointment or alteration shall be given by such council by advertisement in one newspaper published within the city of Melbourne, and in the local newspapers.

2. That the owner or driver of any public vehicle shall not permit any part of such vehicle, or of any horse drawing the same, to stand within ten feet of the corner of any street, whether for hire or otherwise.

3. That at every fourth vehicle on each stand there shall be left a space of at least six feet for passengers to pass through.

4. That public vehicles shall take their stations on the stand in the order of their arrival, and when any vehicle shall be called or driven off any stand, the vehicle immediately behind shall draw up to the place vacated, and any other vehicle behind in like order.

5. That no driver of any public vehicle shall suffer the same to stand for hire across any street, or alongside of any other public vehicle, nor obstruct the driver of any other vehicle in taking up or setting down any person, nor wilfully, wrongfully, or forcibly prevent, or endeavor to prevent, the driver of any other vehicle from taking a fare.

6. That no owner or driver of any public vehicle shall permit his vehicle, with or without horses, to stand in any stand in any street, lane, thoroughfare, or public place, longer than may be necessary for loading or unloading, or taking up or putting down any passenger, except while standing for hire in some lawful place appointed for that purpose, as provided by this bye-law, or waiting for the hirer.

7. That the driver of every public vehicle shall be constantly attendant on the same when plying on any public stand or otherwise, or engaged for hire within the said municipality.

8. That every public vehicle plying for hire, or engaged after sunset and before sunrise within the said municipality, shall be provided with proper carriage lights, and the driver shall keep the same lighted while so plying or engaged for hire.

9. That the driver of every public vehicle shall place a muzzle upon the head of any vicious horse used or employed by him, and keep the same thereon whilst on any stand within the said district.

10. That every driver of a public vehicle who shall feed any horse whilst on any stand within the said district, shall use a nose-bag to contain the forage, and shall not remove such horse's blinkers during the time of feeding.

11. That for every offence against any provision of this bye-law, the offender shall, upon conviction, be liable to and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds (£10): provided that where by this bye-law any penalty is imposed upon the owner and driver, or driver and conductor of any public vehicle for one and the same offence, only one prosecution shall be had or maintained for the recovery of such penalty against such owner, driver, or conductor, at the option of the person prosecuting the same.

12. The words "public vehicle and vehicles" where used in this bye-law, shall be understood to mean all coaches, omnibuses, cars, cabs, and other carriages, plying for hire or carrying passengers for hire within the municipal district of Sandridge, whether at separate and distinct fares for each passenger, or at one fare for the whole vehicle or otherwise, and not impelled otherwise than by animal power. The word "owner" shall signify every person possessed of a beneficial interest in any public vehicle, and the word "conductor" shall include every person other than the driver who shall attend upon any public vehicle, or upon the passengers therein; and whenever in this bye-law, with reference to any person, animal, matter, or thing, any word or words is or are used importing the singular number only, yet such word or words shall be understood to include several persons, animals, matters, or things, unless there be something in the subject or context repugnant thereto.

FINANCE.

To enable this council more effectually to carry out public works they have reduced salaries from £470 to £200 per annum, causing the united duties of their officers to be discharged by one individual.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT, ETC.

The following works have been satisfactorily carried out during the past half-year, according to plans and specifications, namely:—

The first contract for erecting the piers, platform, and railing of Union street bridge has been completed. A second contract for erecting wing-walls, sodding embankments, additional railing and metalling of same, has been completed. Also, a third contract for underpinning and tuck pointing the joints with cement and sand, and painting and tarring the woodwork of same, has been completed.

A contract for cutting, filling, and forming ten chains of Andrew street and footpaths has been completed.

First six months' contract for cleaning the channels, culverts, and sewers, has been complete; and another contract for a like period and for similar purposes has been entered into.

Contracts have been fully carried out for the eradication of thistles off the municipal reserves, and adjoining streets.

A contract has been entered into, and is nearly completed, for the removal of the weighbridge from its former unsuitable site

in Sydney street, and for its re-erection upon a more suitable one in Foot street.

The contract for repairs to the fire-engine is nearly completed; and the stable upon the premises occupied by the council has been repaired and converted into an engine-house for the use of the same.

Applications to the Government were made to place the whole of the letter-carrier's salary on the estimates, one moiety of which has hitherto been paid by this council.—Granted, from 1st January last.

Application was also made, in accordance with a previous promise, to place upon the estimates a sufficient sum for the erection of a new Government post office and telegraph station, upon a most central site liberally given to the Government by Mrs. Morris for that purpose.—So far acceded to that a sum of money has been placed upon the supplementary estimates for carrying out the design.

An application was made under the new land bill for a further extension of our town common to the extent, in all, of 10 sections.—Just granted to the extent of 7½ sections.

An application was also made to have open cube crossings or culverts laid down at the points where the main streets intersect the Sydney road, to provide for more effectual drainage.—Plans are now being prepared for effecting same.

Application was made to the Honorable the Commissioner of Public Works for a share of the vote for the supply of water.—Our claim was to be considered when the distribution of the grant takes place.

Also, to the Honorable the Chief Secretary to place upon the estimates for 1861 £10,000, to assist us in obtaining an abundant supply of good water, of which this municipality is so much in want.—At present refused, owing to the deficiency in the revenue.

The assent of the Government has been given to Bye-law No. 22, for levying a rate for the current year of 1s. in the pound.

SPECIAL ELECTION.

Andrew Caldwell having resigned his seat as councillor on the 27th November last, Wednesday, the 30th January last, was fixed upon for the nomination to supply such vacancy, and in the event of a poll being demanded, Thursday, the 31st January last, was determined upon for taking the same, and Mr. John Gilmour Brown was declared duly returned as a member of the municipal council for Kilmore.
