## THE DATE OF HOLDING THE NEXT GENERAL SESSIONS AT MELBOURNE ALTERED.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **SIR HENRY BARKLY**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the colony, bearing date the twentieth day of December, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, certain times were appointed at which the several Courts of General Sessions were to be holden during the year 1861: And whereas it is expedient to alter the time appointed for holding the next Court of General Sessions for the district of Bourke: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the time appointed for holding the next Court of General Sessions in and for the district of Bourke aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—From Monday, the first day of April now next ensuing, to Wednesday, the third of April aforesaid.

## THE CAMPASPE ROAD DISTRICT.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **SIR HENRY BARKLY**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the said colony hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

Commencing at the north-east angle of the municipality of Sandhurst; thence east four hundred and ninety chains to the

west boundary of the parish of Axedale; thence north one hundred and six chains to the north-west angle of allotment 10, section XL, parish of Axedale; thence east by the north boundary of the parish of Axedale to the River Campaspe; thence following the River Campaspe bearing northerly to the north-east corner of allotment 4, section 8, parish of Elmore; thence west to the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 8, parish of Elmore, ninety-three chains; thence south 9 degrees 45 minutes west six chains eighty-three links; thence west one thousand one hundred and sixty-six chains; thence by a line south to the south-west angle of allotment 12, section 20, parish of Huntley; thence east by the south boundary of the said allotment to the Bendigo Creek; thence following the said creek bearing southerly to the municipal boundary of Sandhurst; thence by the northern boundary of the said municipality to the commencing point.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Campaspe Road District."

#### THE GLENLYON ROAD DISTRICT ALTERED.

##### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation under the Hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of February, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, the boundaries of "The Glenlyon Road District" were defined as therein mentioned: And whereas it is deemed necessary and advisable to alter the boundaries of such district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as defines the boundaries of the said district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim and declare that from henceforth the said Glenlyon Road District shall be and comprise so much of the county of Talbot as is included within the area hereinafter specified, that is to say:—

Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 7, section 5, in the parish of Wombat; thence due north to the north-west angle of allotment 1 in the said section; thence north one chain to the south side of allotment 4, section 6, of the said parish; thence west to the south-west angle of the said allotment; thence along the western boundaries 4 and 3 of section 6, and allotments 4 and 3 of section 7, in the said parish, and a direct line north to the south side of block 19, in the parish of Holcombe; thence due west by the southern boundary of block 19 of the said parish to the centre of Middleton's Creek; thence northerly along the centre line of Middleton's Creek to the north angle of block 2 of the said parish of Holcombe; thence by a line due north to the northern boundary of the said parish; thence east by the northern boundary of the said parish to the north-west angle of the parish of Burke; thence due east by the northern boundary of the said parish to the south-west angle of the parish of Drummond; thence due north by the western boundary of the said parish to the south-west angle of the parish of Elphinstone; thence due north by the western boundary of the said parish to a point where the south side of the Mount Alexander Railway is intersected by the boundary of the said parish; thence easterly and south-easterly by the southern side of the Mount Alexander Railway to a point where it cuts the southern boundary of the parish of Elphinstone; thence east by the southern boundary of the said parish to a point in the centre of the River Coliban; thence southerly by the centre of the said river to a point in a line with, and due east of, the southern boundary of the parish of Glenlyon; thence by a line due west and the southern boundary of the said parish to the commencing point.

#### SALE OF SPIRITS, ETC., BY WHOLESALE, IN THE DISTRICT OF TALBOT.

##### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the twentieth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act to amend the laws relative to the vending of fermented and spirituous Liquors*, it was amongst other

things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, to declare any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, a city, town, district, or place wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors, in quantities not less than two gallons, might be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the said Act annexed: And whereas divers towns and districts situate in the county of Talbot have been from time to time proclaimed under the said Act: And whereas it is expedient to proclaim the whole of the said county: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke all former Proclamations of towns and districts situate within the county of Talbot aforesaid, under the provisions of the said Act; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do, by this my Proclamation, declare that the whole of the county or reputed county of Talbot shall be a district wherein premises for the sale of spirits or fermented liquors in quantities not less than two gallons may be registered under the authority of the Acts mentioned in the first schedule to the above recited Act.
