WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign (Number 13), initialed, An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Licutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Kew.
