THE PUBLIC HEALTH ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF KEW.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session held in the eighteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign (Number 13), intituled, *An Act for promoting the Public Health in populous places in the colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that the said Act, or any clause or section thereof, should apply to such city, town, district, or place in Victoria as the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, might by Proclamation see fit to direct: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare and direct that the said Act shall apply to and be in force within the municipal district of Kew.

SECTIONS V. TO X. OF THE TOWN AND COUNTRY POLICE ACT EXTENDED TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF CLUNES.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty (Number 14), intituled, *An Act to provide for the Management of Towns and other places in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that so many of the provisions of the said Act as relate to the good order of towns and other populous places, being sections numbered V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X., in the said Act, should extend to and be in force in such cities, towns, districts, and places as the Lieutenant Governor might by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare to come under the operation of the same respectively, or any of them; and it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor to define the limits of such places, and to vary and alter such limits and revoke any such Proclamation; and all the other provisions of the said Act except the last (being numbered XXXIX.) should extend to and be in operation throughout Victoria and its dependencies from and after the passing thereof: Now I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare that the municipal district of Clunes shall come under the operation of the sections of the said Act numbered respectively V., VI., VII., VIII., IX., and X.

The deaths of children under three years of age amounted at South Yarra to 6 out of 7; in Collingwood to 18 out of 23; at Prahran to 6 out of 7; and in Richmond to 7 out of 11. In the latter district fever is reported as being on the increase, and measles very prevalent, five cases of fever connected with measles or diphtheria having proved fatal. At Kew scarlatina is still prevalent; while in Upper Kellor many cases of that disease of a malignant character have appeared.
