THE Right Honorable the Secretary of State for the Colonies has, in a Despatch bearing date the 26th day of February, 1861, intimated to the Governor that the Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the 24th year of Her Majesty's reign, the number, title, and date whereof are hereto subjoined, has been laid before the Queen, and is left to its operation, viz. —

No. 117.—An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes. [Passed 18th September, 1860.]

NOTICE TO HOLDERS OF MINERS' RIGHTS AND OCCUPANTS OF LANDS LEASED FOR MINING PURPOSES.

WHEREAS in certain districts the miners have allowed sludge and tailings to flow into the public water reservoirs on the gold fields: It is hereby notified that the drainage areas of such reservoirs have been reserved by His Excellency the Governor in Council, by Proclamations dated respectively the 15th October, 1860, and 25th January, 1861: and from and after this date any holder of a miner's right will be liable to be summoned by the warden, and any occupier or lessee of lands leased for mining purposes will forfeit all right, title, and interest in lands held by him, if, in conducting mining operations, the said holder of a miner's right, or occupier or lessee, shall allow sludge, tailings, or water polluted by sludge or tailings, to flow into any reservoir constructed for public purposes on the gold fields.

At a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Ararat, begun and holden at the mining board room, Ararat, in the said district, on the 10th day of April, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, it is ordained by the said board as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Shepherding.*—No share or interest in any shepherding claim shall under any conditions become liable to forfeiture except under the following circumstances, viz., absence from such claim during the hours specified in clause 4, bye-law of 15th May, 1860, for regulating alluvial mining in the Pleasant Creek division of the Ararat district.

**LAURISTON AND EDGEcombe ROAD DISTRICT.
BYE-LAWS AND RULES OF THE LAURISTON AND EDGE-
COMBE DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.**

(Established October, 1856.)

Confirmed and adopted at a meeting of the board, held at the office of the board, Wedge street, Kyneton, on the 9th March, 1861. Charles Young, Esq., of Abbeyville, being in the chair.

ORDER OF PROCEEDINGS.

THE business of the board shall on all occasions be conducted with open doors.

2. At all meetings of the board the business shall commence so soon as the legal quorum is present; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of thirty minutes after the hour appointed for meeting, such circumstance shall be noted (with the names of the members present), in the minute book, and such meeting shall lapse.

3. The minutes of any previous meeting not previously confirmed shall be read as the first business at all meetings of the board in order to their being confirmed, and, no discussion thereon shall be permitted, except such as to their accuracy as a record of their proceedings.

4. At all meetings of the board, unless otherwise provided for by law, the reading of correspondence unconnected with the business of the meeting, the presentation of petitions, and the bringing up of reports, shall have the precedence of all motions.

5. Every communication addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded.

6. On the presentation of a petition no debate shall take place thereon until notice has been given in the usual manner, and the only question which shall be entertained on the occasion of its presentation shall be that the petition be received, and if necessary that it be referred to a committee.

7. No report of a committee shall be considered or adopted on its presentation, nor until due notice shall be given. All such reports shall be read and received *pro forma*, and if ordered by the board printed for distribution among the members.

8. If in the report of a committee there are distinct recommendations contained, such report shall not be adopted until the sense of the board has been taken separately on each.

9. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration; any member of the board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of notice of motion. No such motion, however, shall be decided on at any meeting of the board unless notice thereof shall have been given to the secretary in writing by the member bringing it forward, at a meeting previous to that in which the same shall be considered.

10. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some other member authorised by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the papers.

11. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it has been first proposed, nor until the next meeting of the board, regularly convened, and every such bye-law shall in the interim remain open for the inspection of any of the inhabitants, in the office of the board, free of charge.

12. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall be *pro hac vice* a member of such committee.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

1. Any member when proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must address the chairman, and no member shall be interrupted unless by a call to order, the member calling to order shall then be heard and the question decided before the subject is resumed or any other business entered upon.

2. Any member proposing a motion or amendment shall put it in form, sign, and deliver it to the secretary, who shall add thereto the name of the seconder, and no motion or amendment so made shall be withdrawn without leave of the board.

3. No member shall speak twice on the same question unless by way of explanation merely, or in reply, as the mover of the original motion, or upon any amendment, and upon such explanation or reply the question shall be put to the vote.

4. The chairman when called upon to decide a point of order or practice shall state his opinion upon the subject, and if necessary take the sense of the meeting thereupon: the decision of the majority in such cases shall be final.

5. The chairman shall, in taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and afterwards in the negative, and he may do so as often as is necessary to form and declare his opinion from the show of hands which party has the majority; and at the desire of any member of the board, the names of the members so voting shall be entered on the minutes.

6. Any member desirous of proposing either an original motion or amendment, must state the nature of such motion or amendment previous to addressing the board in support thereof.

7. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded; any member may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the board by simply noticing that such is disobeyed.

8. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

9. No member shall digress from the subject matter of the question under discussion, or impute improper motives to others, and all personal reflections upon any member shall be considered highly disorderly.

10. The chairman shall address the board, standing, in discussing any question.

11. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately on being used.

12. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member shall, if required by the board, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the board.

13. Any member may of right require the production of any document of the board relating to the question or matter in discussion.

14. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved previous to the original motion being put to the vote.

15. Upon the adoption of any amendment by the board, such amendment shall be held to have quashed the original motion; and, for all purposes of subsequent discussion, the amendment so carried shall be acted upon as an original motion.

16. The board shall in all cases vote by show of hand.

17. No discussion will be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board; but if on the question being put, the motion being negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

18. Any member of the board may enter his protest against any resolution of the board, provided that such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the board; notice of intention to protest must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and a protest, signed by the member or members protesting, and signifying the reasons for protesting, must be entered before the next regular meeting of the board by the protesting member, in a book to be kept for that purpose in the secretary's office, and duly referred to in the minutes of the board, the same to be considered also a part of such minutes.

19. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion which has already passed the board, shall be entertained during the same year, unless a call of the whole board has been duly made for that purpose, and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board which shall have been negatived by the board shall be again entertained during the same year.

20. No election to any office at the disposal of the board shall take place until six clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more of the local newspapers inviting applications from candidates properly qualified.

21. The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the board shall in all cases be fixed before proceeding to the election.

FORMATION OF CONTRACTS.

1. No member or officer of the board shall be allowed to tender for any work to be done for or in connection with this board, or be received as surety for any contractor for such work, or surety for any officer of this board; and in all cases where security shall be required, the expense of preparing the bond for the same shall be borne by the party giving the same.

2. All contracts shall be made by tender, advertised not less than by two insertions in the local papers; each tender to be deposited in the tender box, addressed to the chairman, and such tenders only to be opened at the time of their consideration by the board; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered in every case on the minutes of the board; and when tenders are accepted, a contract bond, if required, shall be entered into, and signed by the contractor and the chairman of the board.

PAYMENT OF MONEYS.

1. All payments of moneys shall be by a cheque, signed by the chairman and one member.

LOCAL ASSESSMENT.

1. In all cases it shall be deemed sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due upon the assessment roll, and in the event of any such amount not being paid to him, a notice shall be left stating that unless the amount be paid to the collector of the board before the expiration of one month from the date hereof, legal proceedings will be taken for its recovery, a duplicate of such notice to be deposited in the office of the board.

2. Any one or more payments may be suspended *pro tem*, in case of emergency, with the consent of the majority of the board.

MISCELLANEOUS.

It shall be competent for any member without previous notice to move for a call of the whole board for the consideration of any subject at the next or any subsequent meeting, and upon such motion being carried due notice thereof shall be given in the notice paper for the day.

THE SPRINGS PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations of "The Springs" General Cemetery.

- All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- By the 8th section of the Act, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their representatives for ever.
- Application for such permission to be made at the residence of the secretary. A certificate of permission in the form set out in the schedule will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule.
- The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such cemetery on a certificate of a minister of religion or other evidence, proving to the satisfaction of the trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
- Orders for interment to be given at the residence of the secretary, such notice to be given between the hours of Ten a.m. and Three p.m. the previous day.
- The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wishing brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the trustees; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto, must be left with the order.
- The name, age, late place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, must be stated at the time of giving the order.
- The time fixed for the funeral to be the hour when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.
- Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. in the other four months.
- All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave-stones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.
- Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
- A plan of every monument and tombstone proposed to be erected and placed in the cemetery shall be exhibited to the said trustees before the erection thereof, and the said trustees shall be at liberty to withhold such permission, and also to prevent the erection of any monument or tombstone which shall appear to them inappropriate or unbecoming; and shall determine and fix the position of any monument or tombstone which may be proposed to be erected, according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner.
- No servant or other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.
- The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.
- A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the house of the secretary, together with registers of all grants, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule.
- Any person who shall wantonly and wilfully destroy, or do, or cause to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, in the said cemetery, will be guilty of a misdemeanor, and being convicted thereof, will be liable, for every such offence, to a penalty not exceeding £20, or, at the discretion of the justices, to imprisonment for any period not exceeding three months; and any person who shall do, or cause to be done, any injury to any such monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, shrubbery, tree, or plant, whether the same shall have been done wilfully or wantonly, or otherwise howsoever, shall be liable to pay damages and compensation, which shall be recoverable in any court of competent jurisdiction in the colony by the trustees of the said cemetery, or by any person injured through such damage.
- The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations, from time to time, in these charges and regulations.

- All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.
- By the 8th section of the Act, any person making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, and his or their heirs or representatives for ever.
- Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in the schedule, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in the schedule.
- The charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in the cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or a certificate signed by at least two known and respectable storekeepers or householders, proving to the satisfaction of the trustee applied to that such person was a pauper, and that the friends and relations of deceased are unable to pay the costs and charges.
- Orders for interment to be given either to the keeper at the lodge, or at the office of the trustees on the previous day.
- The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be required to construct them under the direction of the surveyor, and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

8. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Seven a.m. to Six p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Eight a.m. to Four p.m. throughout the rest of the year, except on Sundays, when the only hours for funerals will be from Two to Five p.m. throughout the year. No funerals will be permitted to take place after Eight p.m. from September to April, nor after Six p.m. during the rest of the year.

9. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, to be kept in repair and proper condition at the expense of the owners.

10. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

11. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be erected, to be submitted to the trustees for approval, who are required by the 8th section of the Act to determine and fix the position of any unobjectionable monument according to the description, size, and character thereof, having reference to the general plan for ornamenting the said cemetery in an appropriate manner. In the erection of tablets copper cramps must be used.

12. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees: no wooden fences will be allowed exceeding four feet six inches in height.

13. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

15. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in the schedule, and registers of all grants are kept by the secretary.

16. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done, any damage to any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the 14th section of the Act of Council.

17. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules and regulations.

ELCOATE, JOHN and **JOHN WEATHERBY**, father and son, the former aged about 52 and the latter about 21. MEETINGS OF COUNCIL.

THERE have been twenty-two ordinary meetings and four special meetings of the council, twenty-two public works and twenty-two finance committee meetings.

OFFICERS.

On 24th September the council solicited the bench of magistrates to appoint an inspector of weights and measures, and procured a standard set to enable him to perform his duties. Mr. Alexander Grant was appointed by the bench of magistrates, but the Government not having supplied the clerk of the court with a set, the appointment was rendered temporarily useless. An Act has, however, just passed the legislature which will remedy this.

On 10th October Sergeant Kenna was appointed inspector of nuisances, at a salary of £25 per annum.
On 12th December Mr. Plues was appointed assessor, at a salary of £10.

POUND.

On 26th September the council petitioned the Government to grant a municipal pound to remedy the great hardship of the inhabitants having their stock driven away to distant parts. The Government, however, by the advice of the local bench of magistrates, moved the Forest Creek Pound close up to the municipality.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have received the assent of the Governor in Council:—
No. 8. To levy a rate of 1s. in the pound on the assessment roll of 1861, amounting to £10,767.
No. 4. To regulate formation of crossings of footpaths, private drains and awnings, and fencing of private lands.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The following works have been completed:—
Kerbing and forming footpaths to sections 3, 4, 6, and 9, and portions of sections 5 and 1, and also the camp frontage.
Culverts have been made across the main road near Last street and across Jennings street.

Bridges have been repaired at Market square, section 3, Ben Nevis, Caledonia Gully, and Wattle Flat.

Parties have been employed in destroying the thistles within the municipal boundaries.

The council, by the sanction and aid of the road board, has cleared the main street of stumps from Richardson's to the Ben Nevis, and a portion of the road at the ends of the municipality.

GOVERNMENT GRANTS.

The council has received the balance of the Government grant-in-aid for last year, amounting to £269 10s. 4d.; and has applied to have the various municipal reserves placed in trust of the municipal council for the time being.

CORRESPONDENCE.

The council applied to have the main road through the municipality made this year, and £5000 has been voted by the legislature for that purpose. £1200 was also asked for a bridge across the McIvor Creek, and £500 towards building a mechanics' institute, in conjunction with a town hall. The two latter amounts have not been granted this year on account of financial difficulties, but will not be lost sight of by the council.

The postman's salary has, on the application of the council, been charged in full to the post office; and receiving boxes have been placed in two places.

The council is yet endeavoring to get the town common extended, which is totally inadequate to the requirements of the district, being mainly old diggings, barren ranges, and flats inundated with sludge.

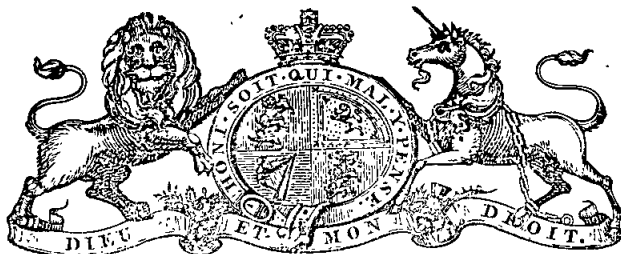

TOLLS ON GOVERNMENT ROADS FROM 1ST JANUARY, 1862.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of his Executive Council, by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to declare the rates of tolls to be collected by any district road board, as thereafter mentioned, and such rates and tolls from time to time to vary and alter, and any such Proclamation to revoke: And whereas by another Act passed in the seventeenth year of the same reign, intituled, *An Act to amend an Act intituled An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor, pursuant to the provisions of the nineteenth section of the said first recited Act, to declare, alter, and revoke the rates of tolls to be collected by the Central Road Board in manner thereafter directed, in like manner as by the said section is directed as to a district road board, and that the provisions in the twentieth section of the said first recited Act as to a district road board levying toll should be deemed to authorise the said Central Road Board to levy tolls and erect toll-bars, toll-gates, and toll-houses: And whereas by an Act passed in the twenty-first year of the same reign, intituled, *An Act to establish a Board of Land and Works*, it was amongst other things enacted that on and after the first day of January, 1858, the Central Road Board should be and the same was thereby abolished, and all the rights, powers, duties, and authorities thereof should be and the same were thereby transferred to and vested in, and should and might be exercised by the said Board of Land and Works: And whereas it is expedient to alter the rates of tolls authorised to be collected on all roads under the charge of the said Board of Land and Works, as hereinafter specified: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare and order that the rates of tolls now collected by the said Board shall cease and determine from and after the thirty-first day of December in the present year inclusively; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby authorise the said Board of Land and Works, from and after the first day of January in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-two, to collect, or cause to be collected, tolls for all animals and vehicles passing or re-passing through or by any toll-bars, toll-gates, or toll-houses now or hereafter erected and built in or upon main or other roads under the charge of the said Board of Land and Works, at rates not exceeding the rates hereinafter declared, that is to say:—

CARISBROOK TOWN COMMON.**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the session held in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the eighteenth day of February now last past, a certain area, therein described, was proclaimed to be a Town Common for the use of the inhabitants of the Town of Carisbrook: And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said common, and to proclaim another area in lieu thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the said common: and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter described to be a "Town Common" for the use of the inhabitants of the Town of Carisbrook, within the meaning and intent and subject to the provisions of the said Act, and also under and subject to such rules and regulations as may be prescribed, that is to say:—

THE WINCHELSEA DISTRICT ROAD BOARD.

BYE-LAWS TO REGULATE THE PROCEEDINGS OF THE DISTRICT BOARD.

THE business of the board shall be conducted, on all ordinary occasions, with open doors, but any two members present may require the exclusion of strangers, until it shall have been decided by the board whether the question proposed to be brought forward shall be discussed publicly or otherwise.

2. The regular meetings of the board shall be held at the office of the board on the first Thursday of every month, at Eleven o'clock in the forenoon. The business to commence as soon as the quorum of three is present; but should a quorum not be present at the expiration of half an hour after the said time appointed for meeting, the same shall be entered, with a note of the members present, in the minute book, and the meeting shall lapse.

3. Special meetings may be summoned at any time by the secretary upon receiving a written requisition signed by two members, stating the matter to be brought forward at such meeting, provided he shall give to each member notice thereof by post seven clear days before such meeting.

4. At every regular meeting of the board the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting for confirmation the minutes of any preceding meetings; and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes then confirmed shall be signed by the chairman for the time being.

5. After the confirmation of the minutes, the order of business shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable:—

1. Reading copies of letters sent.
2. Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
3. Reception and reading of petitions.
4. Reading and ordering on reports of permanent committees.
5. Reading and ordering on reports of special committees.
6. Orders of the day.
7. Motions of which previous notice shall have been given.
6. Every petition addressed to the board shall be in proper form, and presented by one of its members, who shall be responsible for the petition being respectfully worded.

7. On the presentation of a petition, or the bringing up of a report, no debate shall take place thereon, unless notice have been given in the usual manner; and the only question that shall be entertained shall be, that the petition or report be received, and, if necessary, that it be referred to a committee.

8. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the board, and any business which the chairman may think fit to bring under consideration. Any member of the board may, however, bring forward such business as he may consider advisable, in the form of notice of motion. No such motion, however, shall be decided on at any meeting of the board, unless notice thereof shall have been given to the secretary, in writing, by the member bringing it forward, at the meeting previous to that in which the same shall be taken into consideration.

9. No motion entered on the notice paper shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or somebody authorized by him, be present when the business is called in order. Notices not so proceeded with shall be struck out of the paper.

10. No bye-law shall be finally passed or adopted at the meeting at which it shall have been first proposed, nor until the next meeting.

11. The mover of any motion which may be referred to any committee shall, for that occasion, be a member of such committee.

12. Any bye-law may be suspended *pro tem.*, in case of emergency, with the consent of the majority of the members present at any meeting of the board.

ORDER OF DEBATE.

13. Every member, including the chairman, shall stand up while addressing the board.

14. The presiding chairman's ruling shall be final on all matters of order or practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

15. Every motion and amendment shall be entered on the minutes, with the names of the mover and seconder, and on a division thereon the votes shall be recorded.

16. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost, another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote.

17. All questions before the board shall be decided by open voting.

18. No discussion will be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the board, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, or the next on the notice paper, shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the board.

19. No motion, the effect of which, if carried, would be to rescind any motion that has already passed the board, shall be entertained during the same year, unless a call of the whole board shall have been duly made for that purpose; and no such motion for rescinding any resolution of the board that shall have been negatived by the board shall be again entertained during the same year.

20. Any member who shall use any expression capable of being applied offensively to any other member, shall, if required by the board, withdraw such expression, and make a satisfactory apology to the board.

21. Any member may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a member immediately on the same being used.

CONTRACTS

22. All contracts shall be made by tender, advertised not less than twice in a local newspaper, unless the board shall otherwise direct. Tenders shall be addressed to the chairman, and only opened at the time of their consideration by the board; the respective amounts, together with the names of the parties tendering, to be entered in every case on the minutes of the board. When tenders shall have been accepted for an amount exceeding the sum of Fifty pounds sterling, a contract bond shall be entered into, signed by the contractor and two sureties, and by two members of the board, one of whom shall be the chairman of the board, or, in his absence, the chairman of the meeting at which such tender shall have been accepted, and the expense (if any) of preparing such bond shall in all cases be borne by the person or persons giving the same.

23. No officer or member of the board shall have any pecuniary interest, either directly or indirectly, in any contract under the board.

PAYMENT OF MONEYS.

24. All payments shall be made by cheque, signed by the chairman and one other member of the board, and countersigned by the secretary; and no such cheques shall be given unless passed at a regular meeting of the board.

LOCAL ASSESSMENT.

25. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due on the assessment roll, and in the event of any such amount not being paid to him, a notice shall be left, stating that unless the amount be paid to the secretary of the board before the expiration of one month from the date thereof, legal proceedings will be taken for its recovery.

26. The collector shall, once a week at least, pay into such bank as the board shall direct, to the credit of such board, all moneys received by him from time to time, and at the same time furnish the secretary with an account of such moneys.

27. The collector and treasurer shall present their accounts at each regular meeting of the board.

At a meeting of the Winchelsea District Road Board, held at the board room, Winchelsea, within the said district, on the eighth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, the foregoing bye-laws were adopted, and were ordered to be forwarded to His Excellency the Governor in Council for his approval, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of Council 16 Victoria No. 40, section 4.

THE YAMBUK PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES and Regulations of the Yambuk General Cemetery. Under 17 Victoria No. 12.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given, or before the ground or vault is opened.

2. Any person or persons making a vault, or erecting, and placing a monument in the cemetery by and with the permission of the trustees, under these rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person and his representatives for ever.

3. Applications for such permission to be made at the office of the trustees. A certificate of permission, in the form set out in schedule B, will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in schedule A.

4. Orders for interment to be given either to the keeper at the lodge or at the office of the trustees, on the previous day, between the hours of Eight o'clock a.m. and Five o'clock p.m.

5. The trustees will cause all common graves to be dug, but parties requiring brick graves or vaults must construct them under the direction of the surveyor to the trustees, or any other person appointed by them for that purpose; and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent (in writing) of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

6. The time fixed for the funeral to be the time when the procession is to be at the cemetery, and the same must be punctually observed.

7. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for the performance of funerals will be from Ten o'clock a.m. to Six o'clock p.m. in the months of September to April inclusive, and from Ten o'clock a.m. to Four o'clock p.m. throughout the rest of the year.

8. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones to be kept in repair and proper condition, at the expense of the owners.

9. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave to be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of freestone, slate, or iron.

10. No catacombs or any wooden fencing allowed without first submitting a plan for the approval of the trustees.

11. No servant or other person employed by or engaged in any duty on behalf of the trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

12. The ground will be opened daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

13. A plan of the cemetery, showing the situation of the purchased and other graves, is kept at the office, and may be inspected at the charge set out in this schedule, and registers of all permissions are kept by the secretary.

14. Any person who shall wantonly or wilfully destroy, or do or cause to be done any damage to, any monument, vault, tombstone, building, erection, railing, fence, shrubbery, tree, or plant, will be proceeded against as directed by the 14th section of the abovementioned Act of Council, and is liable to a penalty of £20, or, at the discretion of the Justice, to three months imprisonment, and to the payment of all damages therefor.

15. The trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these rules and regulations.

MEETINGS OF COUNCIL.

THERE have been twenty-two ordinary meetings and four special meetings of the council, twenty-two public works and twenty-two finance committee meetings.

OFFICERS.

On 24th September the council solicited the bench of magistrates to appoint an inspector of weights and measures, and

procured a standard set to enable him to perform his duties. Mr. Alexander Grant was appointed by the bench of magistrates, but the Government not having supplied the clerk of the court with a set, the appointment was rendered temporarily useless. An Act has, however, just passed the legislature which will remedy this.

On 10th October Sergeant Kenna was appointed inspector of nuisances, at a salary of £25 per annum.

On 12th December Mr. Plues was appointed assessor, at a salary of £10.

POUND.

On 26th September the council petitioned the Government to grant a municipal pound to remedy the great hardship of the inhabitants having their stock driven away to distant parts. The Government, however, by the advice of the local bench of magistrates, moved the Forest Creek Pound close up to the municipality.

BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have received the assent of the Governor in Council:—

No. 8. To levy a rate of 1s. in the pound on the assessment roll of 1861, amounting to £10,767.

No. 4. To regulate formation of crossings of footpaths, private drains and awnings, and fencing of private lands.

PUBLIC WORKS.

The following works have been completed:—
Kerbing and forming footpaths to sections 3, 4, 6, and 9, and portions of sections 5 and 1, and also the camp frontage.

Culverts have been made across the main road near Last street and across Jennings street.

Bridges have been repaired at Market square, section 3, Ben Nevis, Caledonia Gully, and Wattle Flat.

Parties have been employed in destroying the thistles within the municipal boundaries.

The council, by the sanction and aid of the road board, has cleared the main street of stumps from Richardson's to the Ben Nevis, and a portion of the road at the ends of the municipality.

GOVERNMENT GRANTS.

The council has received the balance of the Government grant-in-aid for last year, amounting to £269 10s. 4d.; and has applied to have the various municipal reserves placed in trust of the municipal council for the time being.

CORRESPONDENCE.

The council applied to have the main road through the municipality made this year, and £5000 has been voted by the legislature for that purpose. £1200 was also asked for for a bridge across the McIvor Creek, and £500 towards building a mechanics' institute, in conjunction with a town hall. The two latter amounts have not been granted this year on account of financial difficulties, but will not be lost sight of by the council. The postman's salary has, on the application of the council, been charged in full to the post office; and receiving boxes have been placed in two places.

The council is yet endeavoring to get the town common extended, which is totally inadequate to the requirements of the district, being mainly old diggings, barren ranges, and flats inundated with sludge.

MUNICIPALITY OF BELFAST.

THE NINTH HALF-YEARLY REPORT OF THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF BELFAST, ENDING 27TH MARCH, 1861.

ELECTIONS.

ON the 29th of September, the annual election to fill seats rendered vacant by effluxion of time, took place this year, three in number, and the same day having been appointed for the election of a member to serve in room of Councillor Mason, resigned, the issue was as follows:—Councillor Bland was re-elected, and Messrs. A. J. Brown, W. Beaver, and J. Scott, were returned to fill the other three seats.

On the 3rd of October, Councillor Bland was elected chairman for the current year.

OFFICERS.

The former town clerk, Mr. S. J. Bayly, having resigned at the expiration of the last municipal year, and the council having decided, by resolution, on amalgamating the offices of town surveyor and town clerk, applications from persons competent to fill the amalgamated offices were invited: three applications were received, and, on the 17th October, Mr. George Kelly, C.E., was elected to fill them at a salary of £300 a year, the duties of valuator and compiler of the Rate and Assessment Rolls having been super-added on the day of election, and this officer has also to perform the duties of secretary to the local board of health.

Mr. Owen Flannery was elected rate collector on the same day, having been elected from four candidates, but he resigned on the 23rd of January, and fresh applications having been invited, and two received, Mr. J. N. Kelly was elected for the current year, on the 6th of February.

On the 31st of October, the council requested the late town clerk, Mr. S. J. Bayly, solicitor, to act as their solicitor, and that gentleman having consented, the staff of officers required to enable them to carry out and execute their functions was then completed.

BYE-LAWS.

No. 20. For levying a rate of One shilling in the pound, was duly gazetted.

No. 21. For abating the nuisance of flocks of geese being allowed to wander through the streets and public thoroughfares, has been returned from the Chief Secretary's Office several times for amendment, and has not yet been gazetted.

No. 22. Consisting of regulations for the management of the bathing-house erected by the council at Boarding School Bay has not been gazetted, the opinion of the Crown Solicitor having been that the existing laws are sufficient for the protection of the bath-keepers and the management of the bathing-house.

PUBLIC WORKS AND BUILDINGS.

During the past half-year upwards of £1000 has been expended within the municipality on public works and buildings: 30 chains of new streets 99 feet wide have been formed, 15 chains of other streets have been metalled, 10 chains of foot-path and hip 30 feet wide have been formed, and 25 chains repaired, and about 23 chains of Beach street, Belfast East, have been fenced off from Mr. Burnside's allotments, for the purpose of preserving a public right-of-way at that place. The deep pitched crossings at intersection of Bank and William streets, have been bridged over, and the thoroughfare made level there. About 15 chains of the worst part of a road leading into the back country near Rosebrook has been formed where some deep cutting and embankment was found necessary, and several other street or road works of minor importance have been carried out, including the erection and painting, &c., of some sawn-stuff fencing on the Rosebrook road, at points where such was considered necessary for the public safety.

The botanical gardens have also received a considerable share of attention; twelve garden seats, each 8 feet long, have been

fixed in convenient positions, with one closet for each sex. A wateringcart has been provided, and a plan has been prepared for a summer house, but the necessary curtailment of expenditure has prevented its erection.

The council has also endeavored to supply a want long felt in Belfast, by the erection of a public bathing-house at Boarding-school Bay. When completed it was late in the season, but since then, notwithstanding, numbers of both sexes have availed themselves of it. The charges are the very lowest which could be made consistent with order and comfort, and it is hoped that the health of the townspeople will be improved by it, cleanliness promoted, and a greater number of visitors induced to come to Belfast during the bathing season to enjoy its advantages.

FINANCE.

On the 30th October, the balance of the Government grant-in-aid for 1860 was received, amounting to £471 19s. 6d., which, when added to the balance then in the treasurer's hands, enabled the council to proceed with the works hereinbefore referred to.

The cost of those works, and general expenditure, however, having exceeded the revenue from all sources in the month of January, it was then found necessary to provide further funds, and the members of the council gave their personal security to the bank for an advance of £500. That advance has been also expended and not yet re-paid, but the rates which are now being collected will soon have amounted to a greater sum, and leave a balance for further expenditure in the hands of the treasurer.
