## MUNICIPAL EXEMPTION, GISBORNE.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that nothing in the said Act contained should authorise the interference by any municipal council constituted under the said Act with any public place or building, of what description soever, not erected or constructed by such municipal council, that might be excepted from the jurisdiction of such municipal council by any Proclamation made or to be made by the Lieutenant Governor: And whereas it is deemed expedient to except the place and buildings hereinafter mentioned from the jurisdiction of the council of the municipal district of Gisborne: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation, with the advice of the Executive Council, except from the jurisdiction of the municipal council of Gisborne the following premises, situated and being within the said municipal district, that is to say:—

The premises situate in Prince street, Gisborne, appertaining to the Board of Land and Works, and occupied as the office and residence of the district road engineer, under the department of Roads and Bridges.

## THE TULLAROOP ROAD DISTRICT.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the said colony, hereinafter defined, shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at a point in the centre of the Loddon Creek, which is cut by the south boundary of block C/section xiv. of the parish of Rodborough, county of Talbot; thence northerly by the centre line of the said creek to its junction with the Loddon River; thence north-westerly by the centre

line of the said river to its junction with McNeil's Creek; thence south-westerly by the centre line of the said creek to a point due east of the northern boundary of the town reserve, parish of Wareek; thence due west to and along the said boundary to the north-west angle of the town reserve; thence in a direct line south-westerly to the north-west angle of the parish of Bung Bong; thence due south by the western boundary of the said parish to the north-west angle of town reserve of the said parish; thence by a direct line bearing east to a point where the western boundary of the parish of Craigie cuts the northern side of the Amherst and Carisbrook road; thence due south by the said boundary to the north-east angle of block 7 section v., parish of Amherst; thence due east in a direct line to the north-west angle of block 2 section viii., parish of Rodborough; thence to the south-west angle of the said block; thence in a direct line east by the southern boundary of the said parish home to the starting point; excepting the municipalities of Maryborough and Carisbrook.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Tullaroop Road District."

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district. Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the said colony, hereinafter defined, shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—Commencing at a point in the centre of the Loddon River at its junction with McNeil's Creek; thence south-westerly by the centre line of the said creek to a point due east of the northern boundary of the town reserve, parish of Wareek; thence due west to and along the said boundary to the north-west angle of the town reserve; thence in a direct line south-westerly to the north-west angle of the parish of Bung Bong; thence northerly by the western boundary of the parish of Wareek to the north-west angle of the said parish; thence northerly in a direct line to the south-west angle of the township of Moliagul; thence north by the western boundary to the north-west angle of the said township; thence by the northern boundary of the said township and a direct line easterly to the north-west angle of the township of Tarnagulla; thence by the northern boundary of the said township to the north-east angle of the said township; thence in a direct line to the north-west angle of the parish of Leaneecoorie; thence south by the western boundary of the said parish to a point in the centre of the Loddon River, which is in a direct line with the western boundary of the said parish; thence by the centre of the Loddon River home to the commencing point; excepting the municipality of Dunolly.

And I do hereby proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The Bet-Bet Road District."

BYE-LAW No. 24.—FOR REGULATING AND FIXING THE RATES OF TOLLS AND DUES TO BE TAKEN FOR WEIGHING AT THE WEIGHBRIDGE IN MARKET SQUARE.

IN accordance with an Act of Council, 18 Victoria No. 15, section 26, it is necessary to fix by bye-law the tolls and dues to be taken at the weighbridge erected by the municipal council of Ararat on the Market square: Be it therefore enacted by the said council, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, the following shall be the tolls and dues to be levied and charged for weighing at the aforesaid weighbridge:—

## MUNICIPALITY OF FITZ ROY.

BYE-LAW No. 13.—FOR THE REGULATION OF PUBLIC CARRIERS, CARTERS, AND DRIVERS OF PUBLIC AND PRIVATE VEHICLES.

WHEREAS by Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it is enacted, that it shall be competent for the council of any municipal district to make bye-laws for the regulation of public carriers, carters, and drivers of public vehicles, and for the general good rule and management of such municipal district: Be it therefore enacted, that from and after the date hereof, the driver, or person in charge of every cart, dray, furniture van, spring cart, or light cart, who shall drive for hire or otherwise, in, upon, or along any street, road, thoroughfare, or place used as such within the municipal district of Fitz Roy, shall have firmly attached to the near side of such vehicle or conveyance a drag chain of sufficient strength and in such manner as shall be most suitable and convenient for locking the near wheel thereof so as effectually to prevent its rotation; and every driver or person in charge of such aforesaid vehicle or conveyance shall, before leaving the same to a greater distance than six feet, for any purpose whatsoever, pass, and securely fasten such chain as aforesaid around the nearest part of the rim of the near wheel in such manner as effectually to prevent the rotation thereof; and every driver or person in charge of every other description of vehicle, whether for public or private use, shall not leave the same to a greater distance than six feet, unless in charge of some competent person, or unless guarded with a kerb chain as hereinbefore directed.

Further be it enacted, that every driver or person in charge as aforesaid of any vehicle, cart, dray, or conveyance of whatsoever description, whether plying for hire, or otherwise, shall carry a lamp or lantern from sunset to sunrise, lighted and attached to or suspended from the off side of such cart, dray, vehicle or conveyance, and on an elevation, and in such manner as to be plainly visible at a distance of thirty yards to any person coming from an opposite direction.

And be it also enacted, that every driver or person in charge of any conveyance of whatsoever description shall drive such conveyance at a walking pace—and in cases of public conveyances shall cease to call out his destination or fare—while passing or within a distance of thirty yards of any place of public worship, from Ten a.m. to Four p.m., or Six to Nine p.m. on Sunday, Christmas Day, or Good Friday.

And be it also enacted, that no driver of any public conveyance shall be permitted to carry more at one time than six persons exclusive of himself for any description of conveyance drawn by one horse; and not more than fifteen persons exclusive of himself and guard, for any description of conveyance drawn by two horses; and that he shall not drive at a greater speed than eight miles per hour along the streets, thoroughfares, or other public places of the said municipal district of Fitz Roy.

Further be it enacted, that the municipal council of Fitz Roy is hereby empowered to fix the rates and fares that shall be charged by the drivers of public conveyances proceeding in any direction from any public stand within the municipal district of Fitz Roy; provided always that one month's notice of any alteration of such fares or rates as may have been previously fixed, be given by an advertisement published at least once each week in four newspapers circulating in the said district. And any person refusing to pay such rate or fare, or any driver demanding more than such rate or fare as may from time to time be fixed and determined upon by the said council, or refusing to produce his table of fares or rates when required, shall be deemed guilty of an infringement of this bye-law; and any driver or person in charge of any cart, dray, or other description of public or private vehicle or conveyance, failing to comply with the provisions of this bye-law shall, on conviction thereof before two or more magistrates, forfeit and pay for each offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

Of the 19 deaths registered in Collingwood 14 were of children under three years of age. Scariatina is still prevalent at Broadmeadows and Kew. The mortality in Melbourne has been very heavy; 57 deaths have been recorded to 43 births; 39 of these fatal cases were of children under three years of age. Scariatina is still prevalent at Richmond; of the 9 deaths occurring in that district 5 were of infants. The other districts are generally reported upon more favorably.

**SANDHURST MINING DISTRICT.**  
**BYE-LAW (15TH NOVEMBER, 1860).**

**A**T a meeting of the mining board of the mining district of Sandhurst, begun and holden at Sandhurst, in the said district, the 15th day of November, 1860, it is ordained as follows, that is to say:—

1. *Purposes of this bye-law.*—Funds to be expended by the said board in and about the repairing, clearing, and keeping clear the various sludge and water channels now existing within the division of Sandhurst, and for defraying all costs incurred in raising the said funds, and for the due distribution of such funds, shall be raised as follows:—

2. *Assessment on horse puddling machines.*—For the purposes aforesaid the owner of every horse puddling machine, and of every site for a horse puddling machine, shall pay in advance to the said mining board a quarterly assessment of Two pounds. Provided always that in case such owner shall hold two or more such puddling machines, all of which shall be situated within a distance of fifty yards from each other, he shall for every such machine exceeding one pay as aforesaid a quarterly assessment of One pound, and the owner of such machine or site shall be responsible for the payment of such assessment until he shall have abandoned said machine or site, and given notice in writing of such abandonment to the superintendent of the subdivision wherein the same is situated.

3. *Assessment on steam puddling machines.*—For the purposes aforesaid the owner of every puddling machine worked by steam power shall pay in advance to the said mining board a quarterly assessment of One pound per horse-power of the engine or engines used by him for such puddling purposes.

4. *Assessment on other steam machines.*—For the purposes aforesaid the owner of every machine worked by steam power, and used for the purpose of crushing cement, or alluvial soil, or gravel, shall pay as aforesaid a quarterly assessment of Ten shillings per horse-power of the engine or engines used by him for such purpose; and the owner of every quartz crushing machine shall pay as aforesaid a quarterly assessment of Five shillings per horse-power of the engine or engines used by him for such purpose.

5. *When assessments payable.*—The foregoing assessments shall be due and payable quarterly in advance by the said owners of machines, on the eighth day of February, eighth day of May, eighth day of August, and the eighth day of November, each year; and the first assessment shall be due and payable on the tenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-one.

6. *Labor contribution may be required.*—Until the drains in said division are put in complete order, it shall be lawful for the superintendent, to be hereinafter appointed in pursuance of the provisions of clause seven (7) of this bye-law, to require from the owner of any machine situated within his subdivision a contribution in labor to effect the purpose first abovementioned; and every owner of a machine shall comply with any order to furnish labor at the time and place therein mentioned.

7. *Board may appoint officers, powers of officers, &c.*—It shall be lawful for the board to appoint such officers, collectors, and servants, at such salaries and on such terms as to security or otherwise as the board shall deem expedient; and such officers, collectors, and servants shall, subject to the control of the said mining board as hereinafter is mentioned, collect, sue for, and recover, if necessary, in the name of the chairman and members of the mining board of Sandhurst for the time being, all assessments, and if salaried officers perform such other duties as the board may from time to time direct.

8. *Duties of collector.*—All moneys collected under this bye-law shall be paid by the collector receiving them into such bank as the mining board may from time to time appoint, to the credit of the members of the finance committee to be hereafter

appointed in pursuance of and subject to the provisions of clause 9 of this bye-law; and each collector shall once a week furnish to the board a correct account of his receipts, together with his bank book, with a list of all arrears in the subdivision of which he is collector.

9. *Duties of superintendent, finance committee, &c.*—The superintendent, officer or officers, shall furnish to the mining board once a month, or at such other times as the board may require, a clear statement of the works then in progress, together with the cost of the same, and shall apply once a fortnight to the board for the sum necessary to defray such cost; and thereupon three members of the board, who shall be appointed by the board to act as a finance committee, may draw a cheque in their joint names for the required amount, and said cheque shall be countersigned by the clerk of the board: Provided that such committee shall be appointed at a meeting of the board to be specially called for that purpose, of which meeting one week's notice in writing shall be given by the clerk to each member of the board.

10. *Subdivision of the Sandhurst division.*—For the purposes of this bye-law, it shall be lawful for the said mining board at any time hereafter to divide the Sandhurst division of the mining district of Sandhurst into any number of subdivisions, and from time to time increase or decrease the number of said subdivisions, and to alter and vary the extent of the same from time to time as to said board shall seem necessary.

The council having obtained a grant of the reserve lying between Blessington and Dickens streets, containing 16 acres, have had the whole of the gravel, amounting to over 2000 cubic yards, dug up and screened, and have thus accomplished the twofold purpose of obtaining a large quantity of material and trenching a considerable portion of the grounds.

They have likewise had the whole of this area enclosed by a substantial picket fence 6 feet high; and having the intention of forming this into a public gardens and promenade, they called for designs for laying out the same, offering a premium of £10. Various designs having been sent in, the council accepted that of Mr. Gloystein, and awarded him the prize.

The council have also had a very substantial iron roller cast for rolling the metal of the various streets, in order to prevent as much as possible the inconvenience arising to traffic passing over newly-metalled roads.

##### SPECIAL ELECTION.

Councillor Hale, whose term of office would have expired on the 10th of March, 1861, resigned his seat on the 14th of March last, and Mr. William Halliday was elected in his place on the 12th of April.
