MORRISON'S DIGGINGS GOLD FIELDS COMMON ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for regulating the Sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes*, it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time to increase, diminish, alter, or abolish any town common, gold fields common, or farmers' common: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-eighth day of January, in the present year, one of the areas therein described was proclaimed to be a Gold Fields Common for the locality therein designated by the name of MORRISON'S: And whereas it is expedient to abolish the said common, and to proclaim another area in lieu thereof: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the said common situate at Morrison's aforesaid; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim that the Crown lands in the vicinity of the gold field hereinafter mentioned, and comprised within the area the description whereof is subjoined to the name of such gold field, shall (save and except the lands hereinafter declared to be gold fields) be a GOLD FIELDS COMMON within the meaning of the said Act, for the use of all holders of miners' rights, business licenses, carriers' licenses, and other residents on such gold field: And I do further proclaim, with the advice aforesaid, that the portions of Crown lands within such area, upon which mining or digging for gold is or shall be actually carried on now or at any time hereafter, shall be Gold Fields within the meaning of the said Act, and in the vicinity of which Gold Fields Commons may be proclaimed:

Description of the substituted area above referred to.

MORRISON'S DIGGINGS GOLD FIELD COMMON, situate on the Moorabool River, County of Grant.—Commencing at a point on a creek forming the northern boundary of Morrison's pre-emptive right, bearing easterly twelve chains, more or less, from the north-west angle of said pre-emptive right; thence by a line bearing about N. 32° W. two hundred and sixty chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing about N. 72° E. one hundred and sixty-eight chains, more or less, to the Moorabool River, crossing Dolly's Creek; thence southerly by the Moorabool River to its junction with the creek, forming the northern boundary of Morrison's pre-emptive right; thence by that creek westerly to the point of commencement. Approximate area, after deducting all sold and appropriated Crown lands, 3276 acres; as shown on plan deposited in the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF TARADALE.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR HENRY BARKLY, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the eighteenth year of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that any district of the colony of Victoria, the area whereof should not exceed nine square miles, and which should contain a population of householders not less than three hundred, might, subject to the provisions of the said Act, be constituted a municipal district as thereinafter mentioned, provided that no one point in any such area should be distant more than six miles from any other point; and it was further enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, on the receipt of a petition signed by not less than one hundred and fifty householders resident within any such district, praying that such district might be declared a municipal district under the said Act, to cause the substance and prayer of such petition to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and (if no counter-petition, signed by an equal or greater number of householders resident within such locality, should have been delivered at the office of the Colonial Secretary within one month from the date of such publication) the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice aforesaid, might, if he should think fit, declare by Proclamation such locality a municipal district by a name to be mentioned in such Proclamation, and also by the same or any other Proclamation might define the limits and boundaries of such municipal district, and such limits and boundaries at any time thereafter in the same manner, on receipt of a similar petition, might vary and alter, but so as in no case save as thereinafter mentioned to include within the limits or boundaries of such municipal district an area of more than nine square miles, and upon the publication of any such Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, such locality so defined should be deemed and taken to be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas a petition for the purposes aforesaid has been presented to the Governor by the householders at Taradale, in the county of Talbot, the substance and prayer of which petition have been published as directed by the said Act, and no counter-petition has been delivered at the office of the Chief Secretary: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation, declare that the district hereinafter described and named shall be a municipal district within the meaning of the said Act, that is to say:—

THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF TARADALE, Counties of Talbot and Dalhousie.—Commencing at a point on the west side of the main line of road between Taradale and Elphinstone, said point bearing south 52° 37' west from the north-west angle of allotment 1, section 12, Taradale suburban allotments; thence by a line south two hundred and seventy-five chains, more or less, to a point bearing due west from the south-west angle of portion 50, parish of Edgecombe; thence east to said south-west angle of portion 50; thence south fifty links, more or less, to the centre of a road forming the south boundary of portion 50; thence east along the centre of said road to a point in the centre of the Coliban River; thence by a line northerly passing through portions 43, 44, 45, and 46, parish of Edgecombe, to the centre of a road forming the eastern boundaries of portions 2 and 3, parish of Metcalfe; thence east fifty links, more or less, to the west boundary of portion 4, parish of Metcalfe; thence by part of the west boundary of portion 4 north to its north-west angle; thence by a straight line bearing north 20° west one hundred and forty seven chains, more or less, to the centre of a road forming the south boundary of allotment 4, section 5, parish of Metcalfe; thence west by centre of said road and a line west to the Mount Alexander and Murray River Railway; thence by a line bearing south 52° 37' west to the point of commencement.

And I do hereby, with the advice aforesaid, direct that the council of the said municipal district shall be called by the name and style of "The Municipal Council of Taradale."

The Government Storekeeper will have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and the contractor must take back the rejected article, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra expense, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

10. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or of delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Storekeeper, to such mulct, not exceeding one-fourth the amount of the monthly account, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

11. It will be competent, either for the contractor, on his own behalf, or for the Government Storekeeper, on behalf of the Government, to terminate the contract by giving a notice in writing of three full calendar months to the opposite party, it being understood that such notice can be given only from the first day of a month, and within the period for which the contract is made.

ANNUAL ELECTION.

On the 3rd of May a public meeting of ratepayers was held at the Town Hall to nominate candidates in the room of Council-

lors Fowler, Casey, and Virtue, who retired by rotation. Councillor Fowler, in consequence of his leaving the district, declined being nominated for re-election. Six candidates were nominated, and a poll having been demanded, the same was taken on the 4th of May, with the following result:—

For Mr. Casey, 81 votes; Mr. Macdermott, 70; Mr. Hawkes, 61; Mr. Harkness, 57; Mr. Towerton, 49; Mr. D. W. Virtue, 46.

At the close of the poll the three first-named candidates were declared duly elected.

CHAIRMAN OF COUNCIL.

At the first meeting of the council for the current year, held on the 7th of May, Councillor D. K. Campbell, J.P., was unanimously re-elected chairman of the council.

FINANCE.

A return of rates collected to the 30th of April, amounting to the sum of £1231 5s., has been forwarded to the Treasury. This amount shows an increase of £638 12s. 9d. on the return of previous year. As the grant-in-aid received in 1860 was under £1000, this municipality, according to the plan of distribution adopted by the Legislature, is not included with those municipalities subject to proportionate deductions in the distribution of the grant for the year 1861.

DEPUTATION.

The council, in order to secure the granting of various applications made to Government, deemed it advisable to send a deputation to Melbourne in the month of April last. The successful result of the labors of the deputation, as published in a report of its proceedings, has fully justified the council in incurring this expense to further the interests of the town.

GAS.

A proposition was made to light the town with gas, conditionally on the council taking shares in the undertaking to the extent of £1000. After mature deliberation, the council was satisfied that the scheme would be a profitable one, but considered that in the face of many other public works of equal importance, it would not be prudent to invest the amount of money required, especially as the undertaking (ample proof having been given of its payable nature) was certain to be carried out at no distant period by private enterprise.

PUBLIC WORKS COMPLETED.

Forming and gravelling footways of Russell street.
Forming Gold street and culvert.
Forming and metalling carriage-ways of Stafford, Park, and Victoria streets, and Brick lane.

In consequence of the heavy liabilities entailed on council by the undertakings of the previous half-year, it was resolved not to incur any new liabilities until a considerable portion of the debt had been cleared off.

Tenders were advertised and accepted in the beginning of April for kerbing and channelling Smith street, east side, between Johnston and Rylie streets and Little Oxford street, forming Nicholson street, and gravelling footways of Victoria, Church, and Hoddle streets. These works are now in progress.

VALUATION AND ASSESSMENT.

The valuation of the rateable property for the present year amounted to £89,998 after deductions on appeal, upon which a rate of 1s. 3d. in the pound was fixed and declared by council, and a bye-law (No. 30) affirming such rate was sanctioned by the Governor, and duly gazetted on the 5th February, 1861.

HEALTH.

The local health officer reports that measles and scarlet fever have prevailed as epidemics during the half-year ending 31st December, 1860, and that much of the mortality from these diseases is attributable to the imperfect drainage of the district.

The registrar reports that the births during the year 1860 have been 690, the deaths 391.

The census, taken on the 7th April, 1861, shows that the population of the district consists of 6233 males and 6399 females; total, 12,632.
