## RULES UNDER THE PLEURO-PNEUMONIA IN CATTLE ACT.

**T**HE Governor, in Council, in exercise of the power conferred in the 11th clause of the Act 24 Victoria No. 123, has made the subjoined Rules respecting cattle brought into Victoria by sea, viz:—

1. Upon the arrival at Port Phillip Heads, or any port of the colony of Victoria, of any vessel having on board cattle of any description brought either from any of the neighboring colonies or from parts beyond the seas, the officer of customs at such port shall forthwith notify the same by telegraphic message to the Chief Secretary, at the same time reporting the number and description of such cattle.

2. That the said officer of customs shall serve a notice upon the master or other person having the charge or command of such vessel, in the following form, viz:—

Sir,—

Take notice: You are hereby required, in accordance with the provisions of the Pleuro-Pneumonia in Cattle Act, 24 Victoria No. 123, to retain on board your vessel all cattle now No. 95.—JUNE 25, 1861.—1.

on board thereof, and not to land the same or any of them until they have been examined and pronounced clean by the commissioners acting under the authority of the said Act.

3. That after service of such notice, the master or other person having the charge or command of such vessel shall not land or permit to be landed any such cattle until after they have been examined by the commissioners appointed under the Act 24 Victoria No. 123, and a certificate given by them that such cattle are free from the disease called Pleuro-Pneumonia.

4. That the said commissioners, on receiving information, shall proceed on board such vessel and examine such cattle, and act in relation thereto in accordance with the provisions of the 4th section of the said Act.

5. That in case the said commissioners shall order any cattle to be destroyed which shall appear not to be affected with the disease called Pleuro-Pneumonia, they shall ascertain and determine and certify to the value thereof as and in manner set forth in the 6th section of the said Act; and if the owners thereof shall feel aggrieved by such valuation, such proceedings shall be taken as directed by the 7th section of the Act.

7. Any person guilty of a breach or neglect of these rules shall forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds.

#### THE MELBOURNE AND GEELONG ROAD DISCONTINUED AS A MAIN ROAD.

##### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **SIR HENRY BARKLY**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the Colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for making and improving roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor from time to time to proclaim, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, the roads in the said colony which should be and be deemed Main Roads under the provisions of the said Act, and any such Proclamation, if necessary, to revoke: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the ninth day of March, in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, amongst other things the road commonly called and known as the Melbourne and Geelong road, commencing at Flemington, on the Mount Alexander road, in the county of Bourke, and terminating at Geelong, in the county of Grant, was proclaimed as and to be a Main Road within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas it is expedient that the said road should cease to be deemed a Main Road: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of Executive Council, revoke so much of the said Proclamation as relates to the Melbourne and Geelong Main Road hereinbefore mentioned.

##### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **SIR HENRY BARKLY**, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Colony of Victoria, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of the colony of Victoria, passed in the sixteenth year of Her present Majesty's reign, intitled, *An Act for making and improving Roads in the Colony of Victoria*, it was amongst other things enacted, that it should be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, from time to time, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to proclaim and declare any such portion of the said colony as to him should seem meet, as and to be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, and also to define the boundaries of every road district thereby proclaimed and declared, and to give a specific name or designation to every such road district: Now therefore I, Sir Henry Barkly, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the portion of the said colony hereinafter defined shall be a road district for the purposes in the said Act contained, that is to say:—

Commencing at the northern boundary of the Natté Yallock pre-emptive section on the River Avoca; thence by a line west to the eastern boundary of the Stawell Road District at the township of Navarre; thence by the north-east boundary of the Stawell Road District and the Wimmera River to the divergence of the Yarriambiack Creek; thence northerly by the Yarriambiack Creek to the southern margin of Lake Corrong; thence east to the southern margin of Lake L'Albert; thence south by the L'Albert Creek and the River Avoca to the point of commencement.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare that the specific name or designation of such road district shall be "The St. Arnaud Road District."

of Dunolly, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor, if at any election the chairman for the time being shall be a candidate for re-election, or shall be incapacitated from presiding, either from illness, absence from the district, or any other cause, it shall be competent for the council to appoint some one of themselves to act as chairman for the purpose of carrying out such election.

## MUNICIPALITY OF KEW.

BYE-LAW No. 4.—FOR REGULATING THE FORMATION OF PRIVATE DRAINS AND CROSSINGS OVER PUBLIC FOOTPATHS, ALSO THE PREVENTION OF DAMAGE TO THE PUBLIC FOOTPATHS.

WHEREAS by the Act of Council 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, *An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria*, the council of any municipal district is authorised to make bye-laws for the protection of the public roads and footpaths: Be it therefore ordered and directed, that from and after this bye-law receiving the sanction of the Governor in Council, any person who shall ride, or drive, any horse, cattle, sheep, or beast, or who shall drive or wheel any carriage, dray, cart, or vehicle upon or across any public footpath within the municipality of Kew, or who shall in any way cause damage by permanent obstruction or otherwise to any of the public footpaths or waterchannels within the said district, shall, upon conviction before any two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds sterling (£20).

Nevertheless, it shall be lawful for every owner or occupier of any gateway, yard, lane, or building, to which access can alone be obtained by riding, driving, &c., across the aforementioned footpaths and watercourses, who shall make and keep in repair such crossings or bridge over the said watercourse or footpath as may be necessary for approach or access to any such gateway, right-of-way, yard, or back premises, at his own expense, and under the superintendence of the officer appointed by the council for that purpose, to use such crossing without being liable to penalty.

The owner or occupier of any building, premises, or land, who shall permit any drainage water or offensive matter to flow over from his premises any public footpath or highway, after receiving seven days' notice from the officer authorised and appointed by the council for that purpose, shall, upon conviction before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay for every such offence a sum not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20).

Nevertheless, should any owner or occupier of land or premises make and maintain, at his own expense, and to the satisfaction and in accordance with the instructions of the officer appointed by the municipal council for that purpose, such drains as may by him, the said officer, be considered efficient to discharge the water, &c., from such premises into the public water-tables, channels, or gutters, he, the said owner or occupier, shall not be liable to the abovementioned or any penalty.

THE period embraced in this report is from the 18th November, 1860, to the 17th May, 1861, both inclusive.

## ELECTIONS.

At the annual election of three councillors to serve in the places of F. B. Salmon, Charles Callaway, and Henry Robinson, who retired by rotation, the following were elected:—Thomas Pierce, Braham Phillips Mosely, and Edward Tufson Smith.

On the 26th March, a meeting took place to elect three councillors in the places of Thomas Evans, John Patterson Smith, and R. J. Mustow, senior, who were disqualified through non-attendance. A poll was taken the following day, when James Jones, Thomas Dale Wrigley, and Robert Buchanan Bell, were duly elected.

On the 8th May, James Scott was elected in place of Edward Tufson Smith, resigned.

## CHAIRMAN.

On the 22nd November, 1860, Councillor Andrews was elected chairman for the ensuing year. On the 11th of April, in consequence of his resignation (retaining, however, his seat in the council), Councillor Bell was elected chairman for the remainder of the year.

## REMOVAL OF SITTINGS.

In consequence of the rising importance of the Back Creek portion of the municipality, the council (having previously passed a resolution to that effect), on 20th December, 1860, removed their sittings to temporary municipal chambers, Scandinavian crescent, Back Creek, which they have rented from Messrs. Harbottle and Co.; and although the minority of the council resident at Amherst protested against such a step, the council have the satisfaction of finding that it has met with the approval of a majority of the ratepayers, as evidenced in the large attendances and interest displayed at the weekly meetings and at the late municipal elections.

## OFFICERS.

On the 27th December, 1860, Mr. John Mohr was elected acting town clerk in the room of Mr. W. Wood, which office he held till the 7th February, 1861, when Mr. W. D. Banks was elected town clerk and surveyor at a salary of £250 per annum.

## ASSESSMENT.

By the annual valuation returns (after deducting £185 allowed by courts of appeal), property to the amount of £13,666 has been assessed, which, at a rate of 1s. 6d. in the pound, gives an annual revenue of £1024 19s.

## BYE-LAWS.

The following bye-laws have been made by the council, and received the assent of His Excellency the Governor:—

No. 11. For the better prevention of fire.

No. 12. For levying a rate of 1s. 6d. in the pound.

## PUBLIC WORKS.

In consequence of the council, on entering on the present municipal year, being indebted to contractors and others to the extent of upwards of £300, they have been unable to effect any improvements worthy of notice; as, however, they expect shortly to be in receipt of the first instalment of the Government grant-in-aid, that, together with the amount of rates to be collected, will enable them to enter on a course of general improvements.
