IN pursuance of the Act 18 Victoria No. 15, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has directed the publication of the substance and prayer of a petition addressed to his Excellency as hereafter set forth, signed by One hundred and sixty-four householders resident in the township of Rutherglen, praying for the erection of their locality into a municipal district.

The petitioners state that they are householders residing in the township of Rutherglen, and that it is in the centre of a large and important mining and agricultural district, the popu-lation of which, according to the census returns, is over four

muon of which, according to the census returns, is over four thousand.

They further state, that the town contains more than three hundred householders; that the buildings are, for the most part, well and substantially constructed; and that at the carnest wish of the townspeople the land in the township has recently been sold; but that as at present no means exist for effecting local improvements otherwise than by private enterprise, the streets and roadways are unformed, and in winter partially impassable.

They therefore believe that the establishment of a municipality will greatly conduce to the prosperity and permanent welfare of the town, and suggest the following municipal boundaries, viz.—Commencing from a point sixty-seven chains south-east (magnetic) from the south-eastern angle of allotment No. 7, section 20, parish of Carlyle; bearing thence due west one mile; bearing thence due north two miles; bearing thence due cast one mile; bearing thence due south two miles to the commencing point.

Byellaw No. 28.—To regullate the Election of Managers for the Area to the Legislature of Victoria 25 Victoria No. 145, initiuled, An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to the sale and occupation of Crown Lands, section 69, it is enacted, that the municipal council of any municipal district within or in the vicinity of which any town or municipal common is situated, shall elect annually, in such manner as they may by bye-law prescribe, three persons to be managers of such common, and may at any time remove any one or more of such managers and elect others in their stead: And whereas by a proclamation of His Excellency the Governor in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, and made under the provisions of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria No. 117, intituled, An Act for the sale of Crown Lands and for other purposes, the boundaries of the Ararat town common are duly gazetted: Be it therefore ordered and enacted by the municipal council of Ararat, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governor in Council, the election for managers for the Ararat town common shall be conducted in the following manner, that is to say:—

1st. Before any election under this bye-law, the chairman of the Ararat municipal council shall cause to be given to each member thereof written notice of the day on which it is proposed that the election of the managers for the town common shall be held, such notices to be delivered at least fourteen days prior to the day of election; and any member of said council desirous of the receipt by him of said notice, do so by giving to the town clerk, in writing, the name of such candidates or candidates. The names of the candidates thus handed in shall be publicly read by the chairman of the council at the general meeting held previous to that on which the election shall take place.

2nd. If the number of candidates nominated as aforesaid shall not exceed the number of managers to be appoi

WHEREAS by an Act of the Lieutenant Governor and Legislative Council of Victoria, 18 Victoria No. 15, intituled, An Act for the establishment of Municipal Institutions in Victoria, it is amongst other things enacted, that the council of any municipal district may make bye-laws for the conducting of elections: And whereas by an Act of His Excellency the Governor and Parliament of Victoria, intituled, An Act to consolidate and amend the laws relating to the sale and occupation of Crown Lands, 25 Victoria No. 145, section 69, power is given to the municipal council of any municipal district within or in the vicinity of which any town or municipal district within or in the vicinity of which any town or municipal common is situated, to elect annually, in such manner as they may by bye-laws prescribe, three per-ons to be managers of such town or municipal common, and may at any time remove any one or more of such managers, and elect others in their stead: Be it therefore ordered and directed by the municipal council of Malmsbury, that from and after the date of this bye-law receiving the assent of His Excellency the Governer, the election of managers for the management of the Malmsbury municipal common shall be held and conducted at the time and in the manner following:—

- 1. That the election for the appointment of managers for the management of the Malmsbury municipal common shall be held annually in the Municipal Council Chambers, Malmsbury, on the third Thursday of December in each year, at Eight o'clock in the evening of said day.
- 2. That the election shall be conducted by ballot.
- 2. That should any manager be removed by order of the municipal council of Malmsbury, a meeting for the election of a successor to the manager so removed shall be held within one month from the date of such removal, the day for holding such meeting to be appointed at the regular meeting of the council

which shall be held next after the date of the removal of a manager as aforesaid; such meeting to be held at the same hour and place, and conducted in the same manner as provided for at the annual meeting for the election of managers as herein-before provided. before provided.

4. That at the next regular meeting of the council ensuing after notice of the assent by His Excellency the Governor to this bye-law has been received, a day shall be fixed for holding a meeting to appoint managers for the management of the Malmsbury municipal common, such managers to serve until the day named for the annual election as provided by this bye-law, and such meeting to be held at the same hour and place, and conducted in the same manner as provided for at the annual meeting for the election of managers as hereinbefore provided.

That at the annual meeting, or any subsequent meeting, for the election of a manager or managers for the said common, any member of the municipal council may nominate in writing the names of not more than three persons to be managers thereof, with the consent of the person or persons so nominated; and in case there shall be more persons nominated than vacancies, a ballot shall be taken of the chairman and members present at such meeting of council; and at the conclusion of the said ballot, if there shall be an equality of votes, the chairman shall have a casting vote; and the person or persons elected shall be declared to be the managers, or a manager, as the case may be, of the Maryborough town common, under the provisions of the Act aforesaid.
- a. That should any granager be removed by order of the municipal council of M hyboroush, a meeting for the election of a successor to the manager so removed shall be held within twenty-one days from the date of such removal; the day for holding such meeting to be appointed at the regular meeting of the council which shall be held next after the date of the removal of a manager as aforesaid; such meeting to be held at the same hour and place, and conducted in the same manner as hereinbefore provided.

The foregoing Bye-law, No. 22, made by the municipal council of Maryborough, has been assented to by the Governor in Council.
